QUESTIONS THAT NEED ANSWERS....

WHY ARE WE PLANNING DIFFERENT SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAMMING?

Teachers and students enjoy a change from normal routine especially during traditionally low attendance times. Teachers need time to revitalize. This program frees each teacher several Sundays to go away with their families or attend adult Sunday School. Place students in different settings and challenge them in new ways to learn about the Lord.



HOW WILL SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL OLYMPICS BE ORGANIZED?

HOW CAN I BE SUCCESSFUL?

PREPARE. Know what s going to happen in each Activity Center. Understand your individual responsibilities. Be diligent with your preparation, the results will show!

READ THE LESSON PLAN. Use the lesson plan as the basis for preparing the Activity Center. Be creative within the framework of the theme. Have fun with the lesson!

ORGANIZE THE STUDENTS. Keep student groups together at all times. If weather and activity seem appropriate, take the group outdoors.

GATHER SUPPLIES. Sunday School pays for materials. Request a check before purchasing items or tun in a bill. Save all receipts. Know the church tax exempt number.

PRAY BEFORE EACH SESSION. We can be clever, work hard and love children but we do them ad ourselves a great disservice if we leave the Lord out of our plans. Pray specifically for each student, teacher, lesson plan and spiritual goal.

WHAT IS MY PERSONAL TEACHING SCHEDULE?

The OLYMPIC COACH divides duties according to date and Activity Center. You are assigned one Activity Center each Sunday, teaching a rotation of two or three groups. If you become ill, inform the COACH as soon as possible.

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ACTIVITY CENTERS IN SUNDAY SCHOOL

DIVIDE CLASSES INTO SMALL GROUPS. Preschool meets separately. Older groups meet in individual Activity Centers to complete their activity.


IT'S DIFFERENT! Games, stories, drawing pictures and joyful singing lead children into deeper understanding of scriptural truth.

WHERE? Four corners of a large room may be used to set up each activity center. Individual classrooms lend themselves to individual activities. Move to larger church areas like the fellowship hall, gymnasium or family life center, if time and space allow.

DECORATE! Each area should be theme related and colorful. This does not have to be expensive. Borrow items from friends. Dig into the corners of your attic, basement or garage. Shop garage sales and catalogs. Make decorations using simple art supplies.

TIMING. Each Activity Center is 12-15 minutes. This depends upon the length of local Sunday School time. Activities must be quick, exciting and hard hitting. When it is time to move, students must move quickly.

THE KIDS. Noise and chatter are inevitable during the rotation moves. Encourage interaction. Urge students to become involved in the next Activity Center immediately.

THE SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL OLYMPICS is a memory maker and a positive experience when the Director prepares well. Plan a creative quarter of Sunday School and watch your leaders respond with a spirit of fun and cooperation.

READ THE ENTIRE PROGRAM PRIVATELY. Once you are familiar with the program, present it to the teaching staff. Changes in activities are best recommended by the OLYMPIC COACH to avoid confusion.

MEET THE STAFF. Urge 100% attendance at one special meeting. Prepare the staff for activity center teaching. Tell teachers where they will be working and exactly when they are scheduled to teach.



PUBLICITY!

The more excited your church and community become with this unique Sunday School approach the more your children benefit from the program. Use all reasonable publicity gimmicks to attract teachers and students.

CHURCH NEWSLETTER. Print short, catchy announcements in the church news letter beginning one month before the program begins. Give just enough information to intrigue the reader.

CHURCH BULLETIN. The worship folder/bulletin reaches weekly worship attenders. Explain the Sunday School theme and advertise for helpers.

POSTERS. Place handmade posters in strategic areas of the church and in local shops to spark community interest. Add tear off sheets so people can take the time, date and place with them.

POST CARDS. Send post cards to students on file. This personal touch is an extra dose of caring that works wonders. Address the card to the individual child. Are there three kids in a family? Send three cards! Consider telling them they can redeem the post card for a special gift when they attend.

TELEPHONE. Call potential students 2-3 days prior to the program. It is a great last minute reminder. *"We are doing something fun and special. We don't want you to miss it! Need a ride?"*




DECORATION. Follow the decorating suggestions in the curriculum to make the area bright and cheerful. Place a large OLYMPIC VILLAGE sign in the area.

PLAN SNACKS. To avoid confusion, plan snack menus before the series begins. It is easy to carry through on a weekly basis if the decisions are made in advance.

PLAN CRAFTS. Decide which craft projects are desired from the list in the curriculum. Tell volunteers where to find their project supplies. Encourage them to make a sample. 



Choose a large indoor or outdoor area where games may be played. Check the weather and be sure the outdoor area is away from traffic.



DECORATIONS

Follow the suggestions in the section titled DECORATIONS. Use ideas which can be adapted easily in a large room. You may not feel the need to decorate since students will be playing games which need more space. However, consider stringing colorful banners around the area.

Make large cardboard stars and spray paint them silver. Scatter the silver stars on the walls. Print SILVER SPORTS STADIUM on several large stars.

FLAGS. Fly as many banners and flags as possible. They may be plain and homemade or they may be national flags. You decide.

OLYMPIC MEDALS. Spray paint gold, silver and bronze paper cake plates–front and back. Attach a long ribbon to the back so that the medals look like necklaces. Winners take home their medals.

OLYMPIC DODGE BALL. Bunch up the students in a circle. One person gets on each side of the circle and rolls a ball through the center of the circle to tag the players. The players in the circle try to dodge the ball. When a player is tagged, he has to sit down outside the circle.

OLYMPIC DISCUS TOSS. Students line up to see how far they can toss a frisbee. When they toss it, they must run to their spot and stand while others toss. The student standing farthest from the starting line wins gold, second wins silver and third wins bronze.

OLYMPIC BLIND FIND. Blindfold each player. Toss cotton balls on the floor all over the area. Students must find as many as possible in a 3 minute time limit. Provide enough cotton balls so that everyone will be able to find a few. Place cotton balls in a plastic sandwich bag as they find them. Count the balls at the end of the game. If time permits, play twice. Award medals to the top three winners.

OLYMPIC SNACK OF COURAGE. Serve mystery foods to blindfolded students. Will they be brave enough to sample the unknown snack? Serve a taste of pickle, ketchup, fruit, chocolate, milk, salt or any food in your refrigerator. Place each sample in a paper cup. Spoon fee each student with a separate plastic spoon.

OLYMPIC BUBBLE GUM BLOW. Give players several pieces of bubble gum. Seat the group on the floor in a circle. Allow a few minutes to chew gum and practice making the biggest bubbles they can. The game is to let each one blow the biggest bubble they can. Let the group decide the top three winners. If younger students cannot blow bubbles, let them chew gum and teach them how to do it. If anyone blows a bubble of any size, award a medal to that student.

OLYMPIC SWIMMING RACES. THESE RACES ARE BEST HELD OUTDOORS! **Spoon Race:** Supplies: 2 bowls of water, 2 chairs, 2 empty clear jars, 2 large spoons. Fill a bowl with water and place it on a chair at the starting line. Place 2 chairs at the finish line with empty clear jars on them. Divide the group into two teams and give each team one tablespoon. Each team runs a relay to the empty jar of their team with a tablespoon of water. They may walk or run but they must be careful not to spill the water. The team with the most water in their jar wins at the end of the time limit (you choose the time). The game may be repeated several times.

Holy Swimming Race: Supplies: 2 large containers filled with water, 2 empty containers, 2 paper/plastic cups with holes punched along the bottom rim. Teams race their leaking cup filled with water to the empty container. The winning team has the most water in their container at the end of the time limit (you choose the time). They must hurry to get water into the empty container! Expect kids to get wet! Bare feet would be fun-but not necessary.

OLYMPIC MARATHON. Supplies: Several small household items for each team to stack. This race includes stacking and carrying while racing to the finish line. Each team takes turns sending members along the race course carrying a variety of household items. Use whatever you have handy. (*Plastic cups and saucers, utensils, trays, books, towels, bowls, pans.*) The first team to have each member run the course must sit down to be declare marathon winners.

OLYMPIC DIVING. Supplies: Containers with narrow tops, three clothes pins per jar. Set up several containers. Students stand above their container and drop 3 clothes pins into it. To make the event more difficult, blindfold the student and have a team member direct the drop.

SNACKS

Choose from our list of popular snacks or develop your own refreshments to be served each week as student work to memorize their verse. Do not plan an entire meal. This center is designed as a quick food break.

Do not be held hostage to students who dislike the treat. *Resist the temptation to provide alternative snacks.* If someone does not like what is served say, "Maybe you will enjoy next week's treat. Can I get you a glass of ice water?"

Never announce "Next week's treat". Some students base their attendance on whether or not they like that food. Surprise is best! The only alternative snacks should be for students who have health/allergy problems and their parents should explain dietary restrictions.

CHEESE AND CRACKERS. Serve a variety of cheese, crackers with any fruit.

MARSHMALLOWS. Place a basket of large or mini marshmallows in a basket. Students may choose to place one or more alongside their fruit snack.

FRESH VEGGIE PLATE. Offer a variety of fresh cut vegetables with dip. Kids usually like celery, carrot sticks and cherry tomatoes. Add olives and mini pickles as desired.

PEANUT BUTTER AND JELLY. Make sandwiches and cut into four squares or diamonds.

POPSICLES. Serve icy, refreshing popsicles on an especially hot day. Sit outside to eat them.

RICE KRISPIES TREATS. Make kid friendly favorites following the directions on the cereal box and top with a combination of favorite fruits.

BREAKFAST TREATS

BREAKFAST JUMBLE. In a 9 x 13 sprayed pan, place torn bread. Cover the bread with a mixture of 6-8 eggs, milk, cooked sausage or cubed ham or crumbled bacon. Add shredded cheddar cheese and optional ingredients: diced onion, salt and pepper, diced green pepper. Pour mixture over bread and refrigerate overnight. Bake in 350 degree oven approximately one hour. Cut into small squares and serve warm with fruit juice.

POP TARTS. Toast in toaster and serve warm. Provide a variety of flavors cut in several pieces and served with cold milk.

LEGGO WAFFL eats are a kid favorite. Serve with syrup, butter and milk. Or....war or pancakes? Choose a memory game from this list. Encourage students to learn the weekly scripture. Vary activities from week to week. Repeat games the students especially enjoy. Offer a small reward for successful memorization and individual effort. Keep track of the verses each student learns and present special awards at the end of the quarter. Weekly prizes may be awarded as desired.

FILL IN THE BLANK. Print individual words on separate 3 x 5 cards. Place the cards in proper order on the table. Remove one card as the students say the verse aloud. Keep removing cards until they can say the verse without assistance. Ask individuals to repeat the verse aloud from memory.

FOLLOW THE BOUNCING BALL. Bounce a large ball around the circle and say the verse aloud. Each bounce represents one word in the verse. Once the verse is memorized, toss the ball to individual students who say the verse aloud.

FROM JOHN 3: Perhaps Nicodemus was afraid to be seen with Jesus....and yet he respected Jesus. So he met Him late and night and said, "We all know you are a teacher straight from God. No one could do all the Godly things you do if God weren't in on it." Interesting comment coming from a guy who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. Those guys thought Jesus was dangerous and crazy.

Jesus said, "Right you are, Nicodemus. Take it from me: Unless a person is born again, it is not possible for that person to go to heaven."

"Born again?" Nicodemus was confused. No one can become a baby again once they are full grown. Anyone knows that. What was this interesting man talking about?

Jesus patiently explained that God created an escape from sin for anyone who would accept the plan. It was a lot like being born again-becoming a new person-beginning again-making a fresh start! Could He make Nicodemus understand?

"It's like this", said Jesus. "Everyone is born the first time the normal way with the help of two parents. God said that each person must also be born of His Spirit in order to go to heaven. He made a way through Jesus.






INTRODUCTION

OPTION: Bring a crown or tiara and let students try it on.

Many athletes are afraid they are not good enough to compete in the Olympic games. Only the best and the bravest try, even though they might fail to win a medal.

Our champion today is a brave Queen who risked everything, including her life, to save the people she loved. Esther was the most beautiful girl in the country and was chosen to be the wife of the king. She was a Jewish girl but the king didn't know that. She wore a crown like this but she was beautiful inside and outside. She did not need a crown to complete her beauty. (Allow the students to try the crown. Ask them how it feels? Does it make them feel brave, important, beautiful, fearful, silly.)

Of course, Haman thought the king was talking about him! "Oh king, I would put the king's crown on his head and dress him in royal robes. I would put him on the king's favorite horse and have an important official lead the horse through the city shouting, 'This is what happens to the man the king desires to honor!' Yeah, that's what I'd do." The king smiled and said, "Good idea, Haman. You go out and do that for Mordecai." And a very angry Haman did just that. **Can you imagine that?**

Now, if you wanted to talk to the king you had to get special permission or wait for the king to say he wanted to talk to you. Even the beautiful Queen Esther was not allowed to see him. When Uncle Mordecai told Esther about Haman's terrible plan, she dressed in her most beautiful outfit and went to see the king. If the king was in a bad mood, he could say, "*I didn't call for you, Esther. Now you must die.*" Even if Esther was very frightened, she didn't show it. She put on her bravest face and stood before the king. **Can you imagine that?**

"Dear Esther," he said. "What can I do for you today?" Whew! She must have caught him on a good day. Esther invited the king to a small dinner party along with his friend, Haman. Old Haman was proud to be included in the king's small circle of friends. He was so sure of himself that he had a gallows built so he could hang Mordecai. Can you imagine that?

Brave Esther was not about to let that happen and she was not about to let her people be killed. At a second dinner party, she told the king about Haman's evil plot. She confessed that she was Jewish and would be killed with her people. She even told him about the gallows in Haman's courtyard that was meant to hang Mordecai, hero to the king. Meanwhile in Egypt, Joseph became well known for his HONESTY. He was given important jobs for the important official who owned him. The official trusted Joseph and often didn't even check on him because he knew Joseph would never steal or be lazy in his job. Honesty produced trust. That's our boy!

One day the wife of Joseph's master wanted to cheat on her husband. Joseph said, "How can I be dishonest? Your husband trusts me with his entire household. I must be honest." He ran away from her and she grabbed his coat. He kept running. She kept the coat. She was so angry that she lied to her husband and accused Joseph of evil things he never did. She showed him Joseph's coat as proof. The master had Joseph sent to prison. Even when Joseph had done the right thing, he was punished.

For two years Joseph suffered in prison. He continued to be honest and the jailer trusted him with the other prisoners. Even in prison Joseph's honesty helped him. He met many people in prison and one man eventually remembered to bring him to the pharaoh's attention.

The king had a bad dream. He was so disturbed that Joseph, the guy who could tell what dreams meant-with God's help--was called in to help. Sure enough, Joseph figured out the dream and the king released him from prison, made him second in command and put him in a position to save Egypt from a great famine by storing large amounts of food. Finally honesty paid off and Joseph was rewarded. Not that they deserved it, of course, but Joseph's brothers were also saved from the famine by their long lost brother. Saul of Tarsus was about to discover he did not know God as well as he thought he did. With arrest warrants in hand, Saul headed for Damascus to haul in Christians and take them to Jerusalem. When he got to the outskirts of Damascus, a blinding flash of light came out of nowhere and struck Saul. He fell to the ground in shock and pain.

He heard a voice, "Saul, Saul, why are you out to get me?" He tried to see who was speaking but he couldn't see a thing. He said, "Who are you, Master?"

"I am Jesus, the One you're hunting down. I want you to get up and enter the city. In the city you'll be told what to do next."

Saul's buddies stood there dumbstruck. They could hear the sound but couldn't see anyone. When Saul picked himself up off the ground, he discovered he was blind. The men had to take him by the hand and lead him into Damascus. He was blind for three days and did not eat or drink anything.

Meanwhile, Jesus spoke to a Christian man named Ananias. He told him to go over to Straight Street and ask for the man from Tarsus named Saul. Saul was praying and had just had a dream that a man named Ananias would come and lay hands on him so he could see again.

Ananias was not eager to go. He said, "Master, you can't be serious. Everybody's talking about this guy and the terrible things he's been doing against your people in Jerusalem! Now, he's shown up here with papers from the Chief Priest that allow him to do the same to us!"

CONCLUSION

Paul spent eighteen months living with the believers of Corinth, teaching them about Jesus. It was a huge city (300,000-450,000) with people from all over the world visiting for business and pleasure. The ancient Ismithian games, like the Olympic games, were held every two years near Corinth. Paul knew the people loved these games and he probably went to watch the athletes himself.

When he left Corinth, he wrote to the believers, "*Those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize. Run in such a way that you may win.*" I Corinthians 9:24 It is good to be reminded that it is not enough to start the race. Athletes understand that the winner is the person who crosses the finish line first.

Sometimes people make a great start in the Christian life. Along the way, they forget about Jesus. They don't want Jesus to tell them how to run their lives. The people who finish the Christian race are those who follow Jesus faithfully and keep their eyes on heaven.

Be a race finisher! Love Jesus with all your heart and decide now to live for Him. Be an Olympian who is a finisher!





INTRODUCTION

OPTION: Give each student a copy of "The Lord's Prayer" on a bookmark or small card purchased from the local Christian Book Store.



Has anyone ever forbidden you to pray? (STUDENTS RESPOND–at school, at home, with friends....) We are so blessed to live in a nation where people pray and pray often. Some people do not believe God's promises and work to get rid of prayer or anything else that reminds people how much God cares for us.

Children think that because the law says there will be no prayer in school, they are not allowed to pray-ever-while at school. That is not true! You can pray whenever you want to at school.
