



From the first moment the planning team meets until the last note of music is played and the final crystal cup is tucked away, capture the imagination of every girl from three to ninety three...or ninety four!

# Prepare $\Lambda$ Banquet Before Them!

A banquet is a party featuring food as the main attraction. Add a program, a speaker or local entertainment. The occasion is comfortable and social. One popular Spring tradition is the *Mother and Daughter Banquet*. There are other occasions when banquets are enjoyable. Evening events, women's programs, holiday gatherings, annual retreats, summer picnics and even father and child banquets.

# Create An Informal Gathering

A Party is a fun and games event where people mix for sparkling conversation, good food and laughter. Parties tend to be informal and hosts do not go to extra trouble to decorate. Sometimes parties do not have to be planned at all.

While party games were once wildly popular, there are groups who do not enjoy a lot of organized activity. Create a highly enjoyable experience. The activities should fit the needs of the guests.

A larger party requires detailed planning to handle the program, publicity, decorating, refreshments and clean up. It is a great party if you create your own fun and then remember the event fondly.

### Pay Attention to Details


Often the smallest detail makes the biggest impression. Wild flowers on a table, small table gifts, background music, greeters and other thoughtful gestures make guests feel welcome, special and pampered.

### Practice Christian Hospitality

Help guests grow in their understanding of the Lord. Everyone should be giving affection and receiving love from other Christians in the family of God. Maintain friendly conversations.

### Set Realistic Goals

What do you want to happen during the hours guests are with you? Be specific! Plans in this workbook are complete. Adapt details to fit your needs. Add creative ideas and change activities as desired.





### Organize

Make changes at the beginning of the planning process. Write down exactly what will happen and when jobs must be completed. Do not leave organization to the last minute.

### Team Work

The leadership team may be as few as two or as large as ten or more. Divide assignments between team members. Trust them to complete their tasks. While specific jobs may be divided, one person should be in charge to keep the whole affair moving smoothly.

# Purchase Supplies As Needed

Stay within the banquet budget. Keep expense records. Use the church tax exemption number.

# Practice A Positive Approach

Maintain a light and happy atmosphere. If your attitude is right, your planning team will catch the spirit. After all, this is a party!

### Pray!

Pray for the event, the team and the guests. Pray as a team. Take each detail before the Lord and then – Relax!

### Prepare!

Provide adequate time to set up tables, decorations, props and food. Reserve the church for the entire day. Room arrangements can take place a day before the party.

# Say Thank You

The behind-the-scenes team is the core of this event. Take time to write thank you notes, call and give small thank you gifts. Recognize the team publically.

# Clean Up

When the event is over, clean up begins. The party is not complete until the church is in order. Encourage the team to remove their personal items immediately. Stay to help with kitchen clean up.

# Delightful Guest Speaker

"I will boast of all His kindness to me." ~Psalm 34:2

# Invite A Speaker

Invite a guest to share inspirational thoughts. When scheduling a speaker, eliminate program segments this event provides that are best performed by the audience guests themselves. The special speaker should conclude the evening festivities.

### The Perfect Person

A good speaker makes a faith connection with the group. Choose the speaker from a list of possibilities suggested by friends, relatives, pastor, other churches, community groups or national organizations. The speaker can be someone from your group.


### Consider The Cost

Ask the speaker if there is a set fee. If not, give a generous monetary gift including traveling costs. Think about the time they invest in preparation, travel and presentation.

### Specific Instructions

Send a letter, make a telephone call and stay in contact through the internet. Include highway directions, arrival time, group size, time limit, lodging information and specific personal details.

Communicate the program theme. Include details of what the talk should feature. Make personal contact periodically until the speaker travels to the event.



# Care and Feeding

It is disquieting for a guest speaker to enter a room of strangers, speak about personal and spiritual issues and leave still feeling as if everyone is a stranger.

Provide a pre-arranged hostess "friend" who handles introductions, sits with and converses with the guest at dinner and gives that person a sense of belonging.

Include expenses from the time the speaker leaves home until the event is done. If more meals are required, host or pay accordingly.

# After The Banquet

Pay promptly. Stay with the guest until their departure. Thank that person from your heart. Follow up with a handwritten thank you note!

# Publicity!

Let's face it, you need enthusiastic guests. Do your best to convince them it will be a unique experience in fine dining and entertainment. They must not miss it! Go the extra mile to publicize.

### It's All About Details

Invitations, posters, registration forms, programs, handouts and centerpieces should relate to the theme. Use the same colors, scripture, picture or logo on every piece of publicity.

# Invite Every Gal!

**Send invitations.** If a community wide event is desired, place posters in local restaurants, business offices. Insert invitations in the weekly worship folder and in the monthly church newsletter.

Don't forget...One of the best places to put posters is in the Ladies Room at church and in community businesses. If a local business hesitates to put yet another community event poster in their window, suggest their ladies room as a great "out of the way" place!

### Create Buzz!

Involve lots of people in the planning stages. They don't have to be on the planning team. Delegate tasks or small speaking parts. Ask as many people as possible to participate in the formal program.

Everyone who participates will attend and will be more likely to talk about the event and invite others. Many hands make light work.

Cut stress with more help.

### Even More Fun!

Award prizes and give gifts for various games. Enjoy the company of friends.

### Be Creative

If the banquet is around Mother's Day, advertise the event to men of the church that the banquet cost is a great Mother's Day gift they can give their wives and mothers and daughters. Find creative ways to make your banquet a "gift" to women and girls who want to attend.

Artistic, visually creative people take the responsibility to turn the room into a work of art. If there is no team, decorate simply at each table. You cannot go wrong! Make it fun!

### What Should Be Decorated?

Decorate tables with live or silk daisy center pieces and color coordinated garden items. Consider decorating the welcome table, entry door, stage and corners.



# Tasteful Elegance

Less is more. Choose unique accessories to make the tables and room sparkle. Do not clutter the area with an overabundance of 'stuff'.



I Decorate With Daisies. What's your Super Power?

From table decorations to cheerful displays, the entire room should feature daisies. Individual events will look different depending upon available items.

The best fun happens when guests arrive and the daisy theme comes to life with table elegance, games, speakers, prizes and music! Let guests view all table decorations before they are seated.

# 'Tis A Gift To Be Simple

Keep it simple. The result is a delight to the eye. Become familiar with the available space. Use color, sparkle and light to best advantage.

### Daisy Table Ideas

Daisies are a humble, lovely flower in a variety of colors. Decide which daisy color is most appealing and stick with that.

Colors: Choose coordinating colors for a basic foundation. Consider bright yellow table covering and white daisies with yellow centers. Or, mix a few pastel daisy colors with white, ivory or pastel coverings. Other colors that make the theme come to life: lime green, salmon, neon pink, lavender, orange.

Tip: White table coverings, yellow place mats, yellow polka dotted napkins!

**Printed programs:** Print program covers using a complimentary color. Create your own printed information based on local event details. Each place setting features a program placed near the plate.

Add sparkle with candles, balloons, crystal glasses and color coordinated napkins.

**Beautiful Touches:** Catch the eye and bring a smile with small touches of detail: Antique garden tools, garden gloves, candles in crystal glasses, butterflies or other available items. Shop for daisy stickers on Google!

**More Fun:** Add one silk daisy to the top of each napkin setting. For a touch of whimsey wrap a beaded stretch bracelet around the napkin with a narrow yellow ribbon bow on the bracelet. Serve lemonade with white straws and yellow daisies stuck in the straws.

Ladybugs! Small, cute, red.

Add them to the table and artwork whenever possible.

**Forget Clutter:** Choose items sparingly. Don't try to do it all on each table.



# The Middle: Everything's Coming Up Daisies!



Centerpiece containers can be anything from metal buckets to ceramic bowls to white boxes wrapped in wide ribbon to garden baskets. Daisies look beautiful in large mason jars wrapped in twine.

### Whoa! "Oo-Ah" Factor!

For Sure: In clear glass containers, feature whole lemons or clean, smooth river rocks under water.

Tuck daisies into the underwater base.

Maybe? Add one or two goldfish to clear glass bowls with daisies floating on surface.

Give them a good home after the banquet!

**Contemporary Stunner:** Arrange three tall, square or rectangle clear glass vases. Spray paint tree twigs white and place them in the vases. Add one large Gerbera Daisy with water to each vase. Option: Attach one or two silk butterflies to one of the twigs.

**Balloon Blast:** Color coordinated balloons fly high from each table. The entire room comes to life. Fill the floor with yellow and white balloons. Don't worry, floor balloons move aside easily as people walk. The more balloons on the floor, the better effect.

**Dessert Tower:** Small, round layer cakes, frosted white and decorated with silk daisies become delightful centerpiece desserts. The cakes should serve the people seated at each table. Add yellow marshmallow 'Peeps' (facing outward) around the edges of the cake! Include one cake server with a yellow bow.

**Stage:** Place floor plants behind the speaker's podium. Two large palms or trees or live floor plants work well. No large plants? Place two tall, narrow plant stands behind the podium and for leafy ferns.

Tuck daisies into the plants. Scatter silk butterflies or lady bugs with clips on the plants or add yellow ribbon bows. Bunnies and daisies are the perfect mix! On the stage, on tables or given as gifts, feature bunnies with yellow bows (plush and ceramic and stone).

**Lighting:** Light the large plants from the floor with white twinkle lights or small spotlights.

### Daisy Bouquets

Make large, silk daisy bouquets that include daisies, white roses, pearls, ribbon and light greens. Tie with ribbons and place in baskets on stands near the staging areas.

### Photo Booth



Give guests an opportunity to make a memory of a fun event. Set up a scene where photographs are taken. May choose to participate or just watch the fun unfold before and after the program.

Decorate a simple background. Place chairs or a garden bench in the scene.

Gather anything crazy and fun to wear. Collect flowers, garden hats, long necklaces, gloves, sunglasses and scarves.

**Photographer:** Ask one person to take digital pictures. Guests have their pictures taken alone or in family and friend groupings of their choice. They can choose whatever items they want to wear. Make photos available as desired. Guests may use their own cameras and cell phones.


Daisy seed packets can be purchased locally. Online, cost friendly options are available in bulk.

**Door Prizes:** Ask businesses and restaurants to donate small gifts or gift cards. Buy dollar items: picture frames, note holders, lamps, cosmetic bags, pill organizers, key chains, potted plants, candles and costume jewelry. Offer fun gifts for the littlest gals...stuffed animals, coloring books or fingernail polish!

Put everyone's banquet ticket in a bowl.
Draw tickets at random.
Winners choose a gift
OR the gifts can be numbered
and given away in order of the drawing.

Award table centerpieces (as desired) to one person with a sticker under their chair or plate. This could be determined by another method...oldest person, most children, dressed in yellow, etc.

Stepping In Fun-shine....

Bless the Food before us, the Family & Friends beside us and the Love between us.



Consider crowd psychology. No one enjoys going to a party where everyone remains a stranger, little conversation occurs and a subdued mood becomes awkward. Everyone enjoys an event where people are talking and laughing, light and temperature is controlled, music sets the mood, strangers are just new friends and tables are inviting.

# "Let's Get This Party Started!"

Greet guests cordially, attach Daisy name tags and direct them to the party area. Encourage guests to browse around the room as the crowd gathers. Help them find their assigned table. Point out rest rooms and conveniences.

Keep guests out of the kitchen!!!

# "Getting To Know You!" Getting To Know All About You!"

Get acquainted with simple table activities. Place conversation starters under plates. Scatter pens and place paper puzzles or short games in obvious places so guests can work together to win a table prize.

# "Come on People Now, Get Together! Try To Love One Another... Right Now!"

Help the guests "sense the whole". Enthusiastic group singing encourages togetherness. Play a few table games as ice breakers. This is the time for generous hospitality and smiles.



# Big Friendships Often Have Small Beginnings!

Place guests in small groups. Offer opportunities to make intimate contact with table friends. Devise activities that can be done in pairs or fours.

# Enjoy The Journey!

Mix interactive and quiet activities. Some activities should require a mental challenge with pencil and paper, group skits and sometimes activities for the whole group. You choose what your group does best!

# Λ Good Beginning Makes a Good Ending!

Complete group activities before dinner and continue the fun after the meal. Add spiritual and inspirational thoughts near the end.

# "Goodbye, Farewell, Amen!"

Conclude the event with a whole group activity. Consider singing, listening to a story, letting people share what they enjoyed. Present an inspirational spiritual closing with a serious skit or talk, songs, hymns, praise choruses, sharing and a benediction featuring a friendship prayer circle.

# "This Place Isn't Going To Clean Itself!"

Leave the church cleaner than you found it. Often those enjoying the fun are willing to help clean up. That can be fun and don't forget, "Many hands make light work".

Cip: Keep the music playing during clean up.

Cake a moment to sing and dance with other workers!

# Welcome!



Serve chilled punch as guests gather, coats are removed and table seating is confirmed.

Welcome guests by serving delicious beverages in crystal punch bowls with crystal cups. Consider serving mini appetizers on daisy paper plates.

Add bright yellow beverage napkins.



Play soft background music as guests arrive.

Enter the banquet area
to enjoy table decorations and staged displays.

### Yellow Daisy Punch

1 can frozen lemonade concentrate2 ½ cans water 2 liter Sprite1 container of orange sherbet

- 1. In a pitcher, combine lemonade concentrate and cans of water.
  - 2. Freeze for about 4 hours until slushy.
  - 3. In the pitcher, add lemons and thick layer of sherbet.
    - 4. Pour Sprite over top of sherbet and stir just a bit so it gets nice and frothy on top.
      - 5. Serve immediately

### Appetizers

Because guests may be standing while juggling a beverage and appetizer, prepare finger foods. Use one of our suggestions or create your own appetizer. Choose appetizers that fit your group.

### Fresh Fruit 'Cupcake'

Choose a variety of fresh fruits cut into small portions placed in a miniature paper cup. The best fruit can be picked up with fingers for easy eating. Include a mixture of apple slice, cherry, diced cantaloupe, mini pineapple slice, banana, strawberries, blueberries.

**Yummy Fruit Dip:** 8 oz. Whipped Topping, 3 oz. Cream cheese, 7 oz. Marshmallow creme. Spoon into bottom of liner and fill with fruit.

### Nuts And Bolts Party Mix

2 C. Corn Chex 2 C. Rice Chex 2 C. Cheerios 2 C. Thin pretzels 2 C. Blanched peanuts 3 T. Salad oil 10 T. Butter 4 T. Worcestershire Sauce ½ t. seasoned salt ½ t. garlic powder

**Oven:** 225 degrees In baking dish, mix cereals, pretzels, peanuts; set aside. On medium head blend oil, butter, sauce, salt, garlic until butter is melted and spices are blended in. Pour seasoning mixture over cereal mixture and stir until completely coated with seasoning.

**Bake** 1 ½ hours, stirring every 20 minutes to make sure it does not burn. Remove from oven and cool completely before storing in an airtight container. Fill clear plastic cups with individual portions before guests arrive.

### Crunchy Veggie Treat

Cut mini celery, cucumber slices, broccoli, cauliflower, asparagus, dilly beans and carrot sticks that fit into doubled cupcake liners. Spoon Ranch Dip into the liners before placing veggies on top. Choose veggies that can be cut into small pieces for easy dipping.

### Ham and Turkey Roll Ups

Roll deli ham and turkey and place upright in ranch dip with parsley or celery tops for garnish.

### Shrimp

Spoon cocktail sauce into liner and place one shrimp on top. Option: For children, consider one chicken nugget on top of ketchup.

### Fish Stick

Tartar sauce and one fish stick cut in half with carrot stick and mini dill pickle slice.

### Mexican Fun

Fill cup with refried beans, shredded lettuce, diced tomatoes and top with sour cream. No spoon, just dip with the taco chips.

### Pretzel Fun

Mini pretzels with mustard sauce.

### Boneless Wings

Spoon a little bit of BBQ Sauce into mini paper cup and top with one or two boneless chicken wings.

### Chili Cups

Spoon Chili into small plastic cups and top with two Ritz Crackers. Sour cream on top.

# Fluffy Pink Lemonade Pie (With Pretzel Crust)

Crust: 2 Cups broken pretzels (about 4 oz)
1/4 cup sugar
½ cup butter or margarine, melted

Topping: 1 package (8 oz) cream cheese
2 boxes (4 serving size each) white chocolate instant pudding and pie
filling mix
1 can (12 oz) frozen pink lemonade concentrate, thawed
2 or 3 drops red food color
1 container (8 oz) frozen whipped topping thawed

Garnish: Lemon slices, cut into fourths

350 degree oven. Crush pretzels and sugar in food processor, drizzle melted butter and mix well. Press crust in ungreased baking dish. Bake 5-8 minutes until golden brown. Cool completely.

Cream cheese in large bowl, microwave until well softened. Stir until smooth. Beat dry pudding mix into cream cheese with mixer until well mixed. Add lemonade concentrate and food color. Beat low speed until mixed. Beat 2 minutes until fluffy. Gently stir in 2 cups of whipped topping until smooth. Spread over crust. Spread remaining whipped topping over lemonade mixture. Refrigerate until set. Cut into squares.

Garnish with lemon.

### **Strawberry Delight**

Make an angel food cake and add fresh strawberries and real whipping cream. Garnish with Cut Strawberry!

### Flower Shaped Cookies and Ice Cream

Make your favorite sugar cookie cut in the shape of large flowers. Frost with yellow and white frosting. Depending on cookie sizes, serve one or two on a yellow or green dessert plate with vanilla ice cream.



### **Strawberry Ice Cream**

Serve strawberry ice cream in a small glass bowl. Top with real strawberries and a silk daisy flower head tucked into the side.

### **Strawberry Cheesecake**

Make your favorite cheesecake recipe and use strawberries as the fruit of choice topping.

Bake your favorite cupcakes in colorful liners, frost with white icing and top with daisy silk flower.

Make cherry jello and add fruit with a whipped topping.



When he landed in New York, the customs officers made him pay a duty on his bicycle. He was outraged by this and complained about it to people for months.

One day a person replied to his complaint. "You're lucky it wasn't a bicycle built for two!" The phrase "Bicycle built for two" stuck in Dacre's mind. He wrote the song based on it. We still sing Harry's protest song though many only know the chorus.





# Daisy Crowns

Wear daisy garlands in hair.
The garlands may be artificial.
Props: Small table, live, long stemmed daisies
for a daisy crown demonstration.
(For easy directions: www.creativegreenliving.com)

Complete several daisy crowns before the program and wear them during the demonstration.

#1: My grandmother wore hair nets to keep her silver hair neatly in place. As the nets wore out, Gram gave them to her granddaughters. On special evenings we wove garlands of daisies and wildflower for our hair. Our brothers would bring in a canning jar full of fireflies and tip them into Gram's hair nets, loosely fit over our fancy hairdos and garlands. We loved our twinkling tiaras for an evening of garden play.

#2: Every spring I forget how to make a daisy chain. I fumble around trying to twist the stems together and it always falls apart. I even took duct tape and a stapler to a field one day. This year I am determined to make myself a crown of flowers whenever I am in a field of daisies.

#3: Let's turn God's creation, the simple daisy, into a crown of daisies. These crowns are easy to make. If you can braid, you can make a daisy crown!

The first thing to do is pick an assortment of flowers with soft flexible stems. My favorite flowers are the daisies that grow in the grass in fields. Pick the stems as long as you can.

#1: Choose 3 daisies and braid their stems for about 1 inch.

#2: Add 1 daisy and continue to braid the new stem as you add more daisies.

- #3: And that's all there is to it! Keep adding daisies and braiding stems closely together until your crown or bracelet or necklace is as long as you want it.
- #2: An all daisy crown is beautiful but if colorful wild flowers are growing nearby, feel free to add them.
- #1: Finish by tucking the last stem into the first stem and wear it like a true princess. Add a little bow or streaming ribbon if desired.
- #2: The daisy crown reminds me that Jesus said we inherit crowns as His children.
- #1: We are daughters of the King of Kings! I always wanted to be a princess. I was born to be a princess!
- #2: Our daisy crowns remind us that we are Heaven bound with real crowns waiting for us.
- #3: Isn't the Lord amazing to make such a simple lesson from a wild flower?
- #1: We should practice our "princess wave" as long as we are wearing our daisy tiaras.
- #2: Well, okay, but I'm not going to put bugs in my hair. Fireflies should be free to roam and enjoy the daisies in the field!

Wave and walk through the audience.

# God Shows Off In Flowers

"The flower does not think of competing with the flower next to it. "It just blooms."

One beautiful vase with a variety of flowers. Divide speaking parts between available participants.

#1: Let's pause from our 'daisy mania' to consider other flowers of the field. I believe God knew exactly WHEN to create flowers. Listen to this hint: (Divide scripture between speakers.)

"And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." And it was so.

God called the dry ground 'land' and the gathered waters he called 'seas.' And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds." And it was so. And God saw that it was good.

And there was evening, and there was morning-the third day." (Genesis 1:9-13)

**#1:** Each new day of creation depended on the prior days of creation. Flowers, plants and trees can't grow without **light** (Day 1), **water** (Day 2) and **air** (Day 2). Even on the third day, God had to create dry ground for the plants to grow before he created the plants. These first days made the environment for the rest of God's creation!

Not to mention, "all the flowers of all the tomorrows are in the seeds of today!" God was dreaming up 'daisies' before He created the very land where they would grow.

> Tip toe through the window By the window, that is where I'll be Come tiptoe through the tulips with me.


Oh, tiptoe from the garden By the garden of the willow tree And tiptoe through the tulips with me.

#3: POSE: "A rose is a rose. Roses are red and violets are blue. Stop and smell the roses. Love planted a rose and the world turned sweet. When life throws thorns, hunt for roses. Every rose has it's thorn." I could go on and on with word pictures that poets, song writers and romantics have shared through the years. Someone once said, "I don't know whether nice people tend to grow roses or growing roses makes people nice."

Roses are the most beautifully 'dressed' flower in God's garden. There are over 100 varieties. Talk about God 'showing off'!

Grow them, cut them, perfume them. Even brewed in tea or used as make up creams, a fragrant rose is a woman's delightful choice. What card carrying female wouldn't love seeing a scattering of rose petals leading to a drawn bath and candles greeting her after a long day. No other flower will do!

#4: LILES: "Why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin".

(Matthew 6:28)

Someone loved lilies so much that they said, "When you have only two pennies left in the world, buy a loaf of bread with one and a lily with the other."

#5: BUTTERCUP: "Chin up, Buttercup. Buck up, Buttercup. Cheer up, Buttercup. Buckle up, Buttercup. Pucker up, Buttercup." We smile at word play with the tiny flower growing wild in fields far and wide.

Even songs are sung when we nickname a sweet love: (Read lyrics, play youtube hit 1960's video by 'The Foundations' or sing the tune.)

> Why would you build me up, buttercup Just to let me down and mess me around And then worst of all you never call, When you say you will...but I love you still

I need you more than anyone, darlin' You know that I have from the start So build me up buttercup Don't break my heart.

"Build Me Up Buttercup" ~Tony Macaulay, Mike D'Abo, Songwriters

Children have long known that if you hold a little buttercup flower under your chin on a sunny day, the underside of your chin will be lit up with a yellow light. If it lights up, you like butter, of course!

Scientists as long ago as 1883 figured out how buttercups shape light to make this child's trick possible. It turns out that light on the buttercup flower petal hits two different glossy surfaces. That's not all! Our skin absorbs the light. So, most of us 'like butter'!

# Upsy Daisy!

Suppose you have a meadow full of different flowers and each one wants to be pollinated by a bee. A bee has a lot of choices, so each one of the flowers tries to stand out in their own way. A buttercup can send a flash of light at a bee. This tiny spotlight of reflected yellow light flashes at the bee as it travels along its path or as the wind moves the flower. (One or two people may tell these jokes one after the other.)

#### BEES LOVE DAISIES AND THEIR COUSINS!



their Father is my own.




There's talk of angels in my garden,
