

## **Use of CWCT logo by subscribing Members**

We are happy for subscribing members of CWCT to use our logo. It may be used on company stationery, brochures and web sites, email signatures and social media articles. The colour scheme and aspect ratio of the logo must be retained, and it may not be positioned in such a way that it implies validation of product or services. The logo can be accompanied by the words 'Member of'. Reference to 'Approved by' or 'Accredited by' (or similar) must not be used.

The logo is available from us in both EPS and GIF formats – it must not be cut and pasted from our web site. When used in company brochures, literature etc, we ask that we have a sight of how it is to be used before going to press so that you may have official approval.

However, companies who are no longer in membership must remove our logo from all their published material.

## **Reference to CWCT for systems tested in accordance with the CWCT Standard for systemised building envelopes or CWCT Technical Notes**

Curtain walling and cladding systems can be tested in accordance with the CWCT Standard for systemised building envelopes, and the Standard test methods for building envelopes, 2005. Testing may also be carried out in accordance with methods set out in Technical Notes such as TN67 and TN76.

When testing in accordance with the CWCT Standard or Technical Notes, a specific test sample is used. Calculations and further testing may be required to demonstrate suitability for a specific project.

CWCT does not approve, accredit, or endorse cladding systems, and such wording should not be used in product literature.

CWCT does not carry out any testing, and therefore any reference to 'tested by CWCT' (or similar) should not be used.

Where CWCT have witnessed a test and issued a test certificate, the system may be referred to as 'CWCT certified'. This does not constitute any endorsement of the system, nor does it infer that the system is suitable for a specific application.

Where CWCT have witnessed a test and issued a test certificate, the certificate should be made available in its entirety, together with the accompanying report from the test house.

Where systems have been tested without any CWCT involvement, they should not be referred to as 'CWCT certified' or similar.

Where systems have been tested in accordance with the CWCT Standard, they may be referred to as being compliant with the CWCT Standard, and similarly for tests set out in CWCT Technical Notes. This does not infer that the system is suitable for a specific application.

Non-members of CWCT should not use the CWCT logo in relation to system testing.
