

Cavern Clay

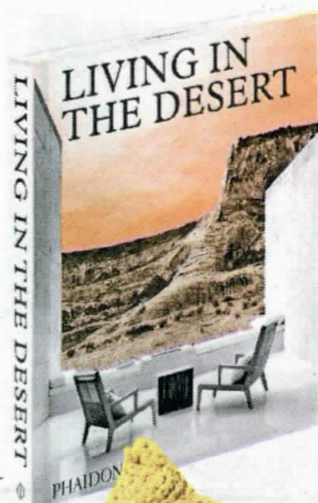
