



## Cordyline australis

Growing Cordylines from seed takes quite a long time to germinate and grow into a decent-sized plant but the process is extremely rewarding.

They are really easy to grow from seeds but just take a little time to establish. You can sow them in seed trays or using individual pots in multipurpose compost.

They can be kept in the greenhouse but you can also grow them on a sunny windowsill and often no special treatment is required. They can grow like grass sometimes, sometimes even growing where the seeds have fallen in your garden.

Once they have germinated and have a decent root system they should be potted into small pots (if they have been sown in a seed tray) or let them grow in the pots originally planted them in.

Once fully established, usually a year or two, they can be planted in their final positions.
