

Ferraria

Ferraria is both tough and easy. It's a great plant for warm weather gardens.

OUTDOOR BEDS:

- Find a location where the soil drains well. If there are still water puddles 5-6 hours after a hard rain, scout out another site. Or amend the soil with the addition of organic material to raise the level 2-3 inches to improve the drainage. Peat moss, compost, ground bark or decomposed manure all work well and are widely available.
- 2. Site your Ferraria where they will get full day sun.
- 3. Dig holes and plant the Ferraria seeds around 5mm and 10cm apart.
- 4. After planting, water well, thoroughly soaking the area. Sprouts will form in the autumn and flowers will develop in the spring.
- 5. After blooming has ended for the season leave the foliage in place; don't cut it off. The leaves will gather sunlight and provide nourishment for next year's show. Water as needed.
- 6. At the end of the summer the leaves will yellow and die back as the plant slips into dormancy. Foliage many be removed at this point. Your Ferraria will rest for a few months before beginning the next growing cycle.

POTS, TUBS & URNS:

1. Fill your containers with good quality, well-drained soil. Almost any commercially available potting medium will work fine. Make sure there are adequate drainage holes; Ferraria must never sit in waterlogged soil or they will rot.

- 2. Site containers where they will receive full day sun.
- 3. Plant the Ferraria seeds around 5mm and 10cm apart.
- 4. Water well after planting, until water comes out the drainage hole. Sprouts will form in the autumn and flowers will develop in the spring.
- 5. After blooming has ended for the season leave the foliage in place; don't cut it off. The leaves will gather sunlight and provide nourishment for next year's show. Water as needed. Feel free to move the containers to a less prominent, but still sunny, location while plants are not in flower.
- 6. At the end of the summer the leaves will yellow and die back as the plant slips into dormancy. Foliage many be removed at this point. Your Ferraria will rest for a few months before beginning the next growing cycle.

QUANTITY TIPS:

For 12-15" pots - plant approximately 10-12

For 10" pots - plant 8-10

For 8" pots - plant 6-8
