#### **Deposit:**

Custom surfboard orders require a 50% deposit to get started.

We will email you an invoice to pay the deposit, and get your board entered into our system. The balance is due when the board is finished.

#### **Timeline:**

Our goal is to complete custom orders in approximately 8 weeks. Keep in mind that timeline will vary based on the complexity of the board and glass job. The glass shop inevitably gets busier in the Summer and leading up to the Holiday season.

We check on boards every Thursday, so shoot us a note and we will try our best to provide an update.

# **Local Pickup:**

If your board is local pickup, we will call you when it's ready to go, and you can pick your new surfboard up at our shop:

#### **Shipping Custom Surfboards:**

If your board requires shipping, we will contact you when the board is finished to arrange a shipping quote. Keep in mind that custom surfboards require building a custom shipping box and a commercial freight quote. Custom surfboard shipping takes about a week or two to arrange and deliver after the board is complete. Shipping costs vary by region and season.
