CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

2014/2015 year has been one of progress with a number of significant projects underway. With the embedding of the 2015 – 2020 Strategic Plan we can be comfortable that there is a strong roadmap to guide us. The outcomes to date reflect that the building blocks are in place for a good future.

One of the key long term outcomes from our plan is around facilities. It's well recognised that the access, quality of facilities and infrastructure in New Plymouth is lacking and has continued to degrade over the years. The New Plymouth District Councils Long-Term Plan 2015-2025 has excluded the TSB Stadium project, meaning that there will be no significant upgrade of facilities for Netball in the next 10 years. It is clear that Netball Taranaki with its strong membership base will need to lead any upgrade or development of facilities. This is an area of priority which we will be aggressively pursuing over the next few seasons.

We can have confidence that the game is progressing well with the introduction of the "Whole of Netball Plan" at the Netball New Zealand 2015 Council. This is the blueprint for the game nationally for the next three years. This shows significant plans for the development in all areas of the game with the focus in the past year being the ANZ futureFERNS, National Competition Structure, On-line Services and Performance Pathways just to name a few.

As you can see from our financial reports this year, membership fees cover only a portion of our operational costs. We are grateful for the ongoing support of many sponsors and funders. Many thanks must go to McDonald Real Estate, The Devon Hotel, Shoe Clinic, TSBCT, NZCT, TET and many more. Please support them whenever you can.

To the staff and my fellow board members, your hard work and professionalism is well noted. To keep this ship on an even keel is not always an easy task and your commitment is greatly appreciated.

Finally, thank you to our wider netball community. Not only the players but also the many volunteers, parents, helpers and supporters. It is your hard work and dedication that makes our sport the success that it is in the fantastic Province of Taranaki.

Premier netball this season saw the introduction of a new Premier 3 level. Designed to be a stepping stone for players, coaches and managers this league complemented the existing competitions. Congratulations to Rampage Tysons Premier (Premier 1), Western Suburbs Bengal Tigers (Premier 2) and Tukapa Premier (Premier 3) for winning your respective competitions.

Access to facilities is increasingly becoming harder and I must pass on my gratitude to all Premier Teams for their flexibility and to our Games Administrator, Pia for your persistence in making sure that any disruption was kept to a minimum.



DEVELOPMENT

Coaches

Overall it has been a successful year in the area of Coach Development.

With the roll out of the ANZ futureFERNS programme for Y1-Y3 just short of 100 coaches received either the Y1-Y2 Star Helper training or the Y3 Coach training in this area.

Netball Taranaki also reached out to a number of schools through the NNZ My Team and Me coaching resource aimed at Y6-Y8 which saw many teachers take classes through 6 training sessions. This workshop was also offered to school coaches in 4 of our satellites prior to the start of the winter season with sessions being held at Stratford Primary, Waitara High School, Highlands Intermediate and Coastal Taranaki School.



In the Secondary school area Netball Taranaki provided sessions with High

school coaches from SHGC, NPGHS, Stratford HS and Inglewood HS. A total of 40 young coaches attended in school training sessions covering one of the following NNZ Modules; Starting out in Coaching, My Team and Me or Star Helper Training.

COMMUNITY COACH AWARD

Coaching is an integral part of Netball development and we are proud to report that 11 coaches completed NNZ Community Coach Award making the total in Taranaki 17. Many of these coaches who achieved this award coached Taranaki Representative Teams this year.

Netball Taranaki also held 7 NNZ modules this year covering Player Centered coaching, Team



Building, Planning, Skill Analysis, Communicating and managing others, Selecting and Through Court to 146 coaches with Ivy Topping delivering many of these workshops.

We also had Yvonne Willering visit with 20 coaches attending her session and Irene Van Dyk visited twice to take 40 young shooters through 2 shooting sessions in April and July.

Players SUMMER ACADEMIES

A total of 168 netball players ranging from Y6 to Y12 were involved in our Summer Academy programme held from November 2014 through to February 2015 where six sessions for each academy were held in Hawera, Stratford, Opunake, Waitara and New Plymouth.

The academies were grouped as Y6 (68), Y7 (44), Junior Emerging Talent North (22), Junior Emerging Talent South (16), Senior Emerging Talent (11), and Pinnacle (7). All the sessions covered skills as prescribed in the Netball New Zealand Player Guidelines.

Netball Taranaki are privileged to have had 5 players from Pinnacle selected as part of the Central Zone Talent Development programme and these players attended a trial for a spot in the NZ Secondary School team in Otaki January 2015.

The Summer Academy programme was completed with a fun tournament day held in Stratford where the Pinnacle and SET players coached and umpired Y6 and Y7 teams while Joan Hodson put the JET



players through their paces. Drink bottles and caps were provided for the Y6 and Y7 players, while the JET, SET and Pinnacle players received drink bottles and singlets.

Major sponsorship was negotiated with



Yarrows in 1993, which included the Taranaki team and the Premier League, plus all clubs and schools in Taranaki were encouraged to support Yarrows by purchasing bread and saving the bread bags. Each club or school had the ability to earn a minimum of \$600 over the season from Yarrows by simply sending in the used bread bags to the company. The support from Yarrows was a huge boost to netball in this province.

When the Western Flyers Board which comprised Taranaki, Wanganui and Manawatu entered a team in the then Coca Cola Cup, now ANZ, Yarrows the Bakers sponsored this team for the first two years, and had a senior member of staff on the Flyers Board.

During all this time Mr and Mrs Yarrow provided wonderful support to netball in Taranaki, by always being at key events, matches, prize giving's etc and showing great interest in the players at all ages.

They also travelled outside of Taranaki to support the Western Flyers team during the period of the sponsorship. They were also known to pop into the TSB stadium early on a Friday evening when Premier netball was on, having been in the city on business all day, and on their way home to Manaia.

Melva had a great love of Taranaki and the people of Taranaki, and she was always extremely interested at prize giving's to ask where each of the representative players came from, as she generally could work out that she knew someone from one of the generations in the players family. We know how much she loved her garden and flowers, and she was always delighted to receive a bouquet of flowers from her "netball girls."



Mr and Mrs Yarrow were gracious people, who had a genuine interest in everything going on around them, were very generous in their sponsorship of our main sporting codes and many other organisations in this community. It is difficult to write about Melva without including her husband Noel as they were always together and she provided great support to him in all the activities they became involved in.

In summing up, I would say that Melva and Noel Yarrow enjoyed being treated as "ordinary" people who did "extraordinary" things in this community and will never be forgotten.

notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements presented are those of Netball Taranaki (Incorporated). Netball Taranaki is an Incorporated Society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

The financial statements comply with the Financial Reporting Act 1993 and are prepared on the basis of historical cost.

There has been a change in the accounting policy for the treatment of income received in advance. The accounts have apportioned fees into the relevant year when the income stretches over two periods. This is a change in 2014 and the retrospective adjustment is recorded in the accounts as a prior period adjustment.

There were no other changes in accounting policies during the year.

Differential reporting

In terms of the Framework for Differential Reporting an entity is exempt from certain requirements of Financial Reporting Standards if it satisfies the criteria laid down in the framework; such an entity is called a qualifying entity.

Netball Taranaki (Incorporated) is a qualifying entity for differential reporting by virtue of the fact that it has no public accountability and is not large (as defined in the framework).

All differential reporting exemptions have been adopted.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation is calculated using rates allowed by the Inland Revenue Department. These rates are considered appropriate.

Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a first-in first-out basis.

19 Explanatory notes and reasons for variances compared to 2014

INCOME

Total income increased by \$79,170 compared to 2014

Income from grants increased by \$57,686 compared to 2014. Income from sponsorship increased by \$5,612 compared with 2014 with McDonald Real Estate continuing their support.

There has also been an increase of contra sponsorship which is is reflected in the increase in sponsorship.

EXPENDITURE

Total expenses increased by \$70,632 compared to 2014.

Cleaning costs increased by \$8,288 compared to 2014 due to the sponsorship provision of \$2,875 from Waste Management and \$1094 from Alsco. Additional services were required at Waiwhakaiho due to increased opportunities.

An additional \$5,716 was spent on gear and equipment compared to 2014 which was for the ANZ futureFERNS and whistles for registered umpires purchased with grant funding.

An increase of \$3,269 was spent on Netball Taranaki events and \$5,106 on prize givings due to increased number of teams and tournaments.

Wages increased by \$25,839 compared to 2014 due to the Netball Development Officer transitioning to FTE, the retention of an Officials Development Officer and the introduction of a Junior Development Officer as a new position.

Game development expenses increased by \$15,226 compared to 2014.

Rep expenses decreased by \$7,495 as all tournaments were in the north island therefore no requirement for airfares. The ZM Combined tournament in Wanganui was cancelled.

Travelling and motor vehicle expenses increased from \$7,937 in 2014 to \$12,482 in 2015 due to an increase in development staff delivering programmes around the mountain.

SUNDRY TRADING ACCOUNT

\$2,936 surplus was made from the sale of merchandise and other miscellaneous items purchased for resale (whistles, rulebooks, t-shirts etc).

ASSETS

New goalposts to the value of \$12,247 were purchased for the Stratford, Waitara, New Plymouth , Hawera and Inglewood satellites. Lockers were also purchased for the New Plymouth satellite.

Work in progress relates to \$9,123 in consulting fees paid to Boon Goldsmith Bhaskar Brebner Team Architects.

LIABILITIES

Included in accounts payable is income received in advance of \$187,198 which includes grants from TSBCT and NZCT which had not been spent prior to balance date and will be carried forward to 2016. The accounts have apportioned fees into the relevant year when the income stretches over two periods.

GENERAL

The overall net result for the year is a surplus of \$53,060 (surplus of \$41,293 in 2014).

CASH & RESERVES

The bank balance at balance date is \$167,598 (\$30,343 in 2014)

In addition funds of \$220,000 are held on term deposit (\$120,000 in 2014).

Netball Taranaki has a reserves policy that reflects the holding of funds that equates to 6 months of operational costs. This supports the provision of the game if revenue is compromised.
