Spring Cleaning Checklist: Kitchen ☐ Dust ceiling and walls starting at the top ☐ Vacuum the floor including under the fridge ☐ Spray all purpose cleaner and wipe walls and cupboard doors to remove grease ☐ Clean inside each cupboard and organize contents ☐ Clean out the fridge and freezer and discard anything out of date ☐ Wipe down inside the fridge. DIY RECIPE: Mix a few drops of dish soap and cold water in a bowl you can bring to the fridge ☐ Clean stove and oven by first removing knobs and washing in soapy water ☐ While the knobs dry, clean the top of the stove, under the knobs, and the outside of the oven door with a sponge and all purpose cleaner DIY RECIPE: If you have stubborn stains, make a paste of equal parts baking soda, salt, and water and use as a scrub. !!Be careful not to turn the gas on accidentally when cleaning the knobs! ☐ In our opinion, cleaning the inside of an oven is more trouble (and toxic chemicals) than it's worth. Brush out any bits of food from the bottom of the oven. If you really want to clean the inside surfaces, DIY RECIPE: make a paste of baking soda and water, rub onto the interior surface of the oven, leave for 15 minutes, scrub to remove any baked-on grime. Spray distilled white vinegar onto the baking soda - great fun for kids because it'll fizz then wipe clean ☐ Clean extractor fan filters - many can be washed in hot, soapy water, others can go into the dishwasher. !!Check manufacturer's directions ☐ Clean around and inside trash can, recycling can, compost buckets ☐ Scrub around sink drains. Remove any built-up matter that can turn into clogged drains by

☐ Clean around the caps and pumps of your refillable bottles

☐ Empty and clean dishwasher filter, remove any debris from the bottom, wash around seal and control panel

DIY RECIPE: sprinkling half a cup of baking soda into the drain, pour in some distilled white

- ☐ Spray and wipe the microwave inside and out, wash the turntable plate in a sink filled with warm soapy water or dishwasher
- ☐ Clean kick boards with scrubbing brush and diluted all purpose cleaner

vinegar, finish up by pouring a full kettle of boiling water down the drain

- ☐ Mop the floor with diluted all purpose cleaner
- ☐ Refill your soap bottles, replace old sponges, and brush heads if needed




Spring Cleaning Checklist: Bathroom

	Remove fabric shower curtains and wash
	Remove towels, bathmat, etc and wash
	Clean shower head
	Dust around lights and extractor fan
	Remove stuff from cupboards and drawers and discard anything that's old or you never use
	Vacuum floors and inside cupboards and drawers if needed
	Wipe down surfaces with a little all purpose cleaner and leave open to dry
	Spray bathroom cleaner and scrub glass shower screens to remove soap scum, rinse
	Spray grout with bathroom cleaner and leave for 5 minutes before scrubbing and rinsing
	Spray bathroom cleaner and scrub around bath and shower faucets, rinse
	Scrub around sink, bath, and shower drains. Remove any built-up matter that can turn into
	clogged drains by DIY RECIPE: sprinkling half a cup of baking soda into the drain, pour in
	some distilled white vinegar, finish up by pouring a full kettle of boiling water down the
	drain
	Spray glass cleaner and wipe mirrors and shower screens
	Clean in and around where toothbrushes are stored

Spring Cleaning Checklist: Living, dining, hallways



	Empty out the room as much as possible to make way for a deep clean
	Remove any washable slip covers and wash. If there are any stains, dab a little laundry
	detergent onto the stain and leave for a few minutes before washing
	Remove rugs and if you have access to outside, lay them out in the sun for a few hours
	Remove throw pillows and sofa cushions and stack in another room
	Move objects and tchotchkes to the kitchen where you can wipe them down
	If you have a fireplace, now's the time to sweep it out
	Organize and tidy shelves and bookshelves
	Change the filter in your vacuum cleaner and any air purifiers
	Start at the top using a duster or broom to dust ceilings, lights, fans, working your way
	down the walls, bookshelves, artwork, etc (you can also vacuum if your machine will reach
	that high)
	Dust hard surfaces top to bottom, including bookshelves, tops of paintings and frames,
	mantels, window sills, chairs and sofas, floors, and under and behind furniture and plants
	Vacuum soft sofa and armchairs paying special attention to the joints and crevasses
	Bring the sofa cushions and throw pillows back and vacuum before replacing
	Bring any rugs back in and vacuum well. If you have any concerns about odors or stains,
	treat them now. DIY RECIPE: mix half a cup of baking soda and a few drops of essential oil
	in a jar and shake. Sprinkle onto rugs and leave for 30 minutes before vacuuming well
	Spray all purpose and wipe hard surfaces, including walls, light fixtures, shelves
	Spray glass cleaner and wipe windows, mirrors, tv screen with glass cleaner

	Empty out the room as much as possible to make room for a deep clean
	Remove bedding, including mattress cover, duvet, etc and wash
	Now is the time to put winter bedding away and bring out the lighter-weight stuff. If you're
	worried about being cold in these early spring nights, layer lighter quilts and blankets
	Clean and put away winter clothes and shoes, and bring out the things you want to wear in
	spring and early summer
	Tidy bedside table and put away as much as possible
	Replace air filters
	Dust (or vacuum) ceilings, walls, light fixtures, fans, artwork, etc
	Vacuum hard surfaces, mattress, and finally vacuum the floor and under the bed. Pay
	attention to the area under your bed near the wall, where dust can accumulate. Move your
