But beyond medals, this wine has plenty of story to it. The grapes are from vineyards in Southern Rutherford that my family has drawn from for years and years, which makes this wine eligible for our prestigious Heritage Selection series.

Meticulous winemaking included hand processing and punchdowns, small lot fermentation, minimal filtration, and the most expensive French oak barrels for aging. I hope you'll agree that it was worth the effort.


