
LOCATION & DIRECTIONS

FROM NORTH OR WEST:




FROM BOSTON OR NORTH OF QUINCY:

Take I-93 South to exit 12. The off-ramp will take you back under 93 onto the Neponset River Bridge. Stay to the right and follow signs for Route 3A (Hancock Street) North Quincy. Stay on Route 3A through North Quincy. Stay on Route 3A through North Quincy for 1.9 miles. Solomon's Collection is on the right side of Hancock Street (#809).

FROM WEST:

Take Mass Pike I-90 to I-93 South and follow directions above.



FROM CAPE COD, BRAINTREE AND SOUTH:

Take I-93 North to Exit 8 (Furnace Brook Parkway). Bear right off the ramp onto Furnace Brook Parkway, and take a left onto Hancock Street at the sixth traffic light (including one flashing yellow). Solomon's Collection is on the left hand side of just past the Texaco station (#809).

THE WONDERS OF WOOL

Oriental rugs are generally made of wool and are easily and economically maintained. Rugs of wool are extremely durable and consistently out-perform other materials. Unlike other fibers, wool is much more resilient, cleans better and stays clean longer.

CLEANING

Your trusted professional Oriental rug cleaners will bring out the richness of color and softness of wool. Depending on the amount of traffic, a professional washing is recommended every three to five years.

ROTATION

To ensure even wear, your rug should be rotated at least once a year. Depending on traffic, the rotation may vary from six months to two years.

VACUUMING

Oriental rugs, like most carpeting, should be vacuumed on a regular basis to remove dirt and restore life to the fibers. Be careful when vacuuming the fringe.

PADDING

A quality pad used under your rug helps protect it from dirt, wear and slippage. We will be happy to provide you with the correct padding.

RESTORATION

In case if damage, just about any problem has a solution with a professional restoration. Old and antique rugs sometimes need to be rewoven where worn and restored to life. Newer rugs are rarely in need of repair. An experienced professional must always be consulted in these matters.

BLOTTING AND STAIN REMOVAL

When spills occur, dilute with plenty of water. Next, blot from the edge of the spill towards the center. Avoid rubbing the area. For solid spills, take a spoon and carefully scoop-up the material. HOW TO CLEAN STAINS

- · Work quickly.
- Blot up excess spills with paper towels. Do not rub.
- Apply antidote(s) as shown on the list with a clean, dry cloth, working from edge to center.
- · Do not soak.
- Pat with paper towels. Dry with fan or hair blower.
- Restore pile with clothes brush.

REMOVING WAX

Put a blotter or brown paper bag over the spot. Put a hot iron over the blotter. Wait a few minutes until the wax is absorbed into the blotter. Repeat if necessary. Move the iron constantly; do not let it stay in one place.

REMOVING INK

Saturate the spot with hairspray. Allow it to dry. Brush lightly with a solution of water and vinegar.

REMOVING GLUE

Saturate the spot with a cloth soaked in vinegar or alcohol.

REMOVING CHEWING GUM

Press ices cubes against the spot. Wait until it becomes brittle and breaks off. Use a safe spot remover to vanish last traces of the spot.
