Following inflation, the device PROVIDES FLOTATION FOR THE SEMI-SUBMERGED ATV or SNOWMOBILE AND THREE PEOPLE ONLY for a short period of time. The flotation device is not for use as a life vest or life raft. DO NOT USE THE FLOTATION DEVICE FOR ANY PURPOSE OTHER THAN TEMPORARY FLOTATION IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.
