

Scheduling an Appointment:

Please call the desired VOC office to speak with a team member to schedule an appointment. For new clients, you can make the appointment directly or get a referral from your primary care veterinarian. A new patient form is available to fill out in advance before the scheduled appointment on the website (vocsocial.com), under “New Patients” → “New Client Forms.”

What should I expect during my pet’s appointment?:

During your pet’s initial consultation with the ophthalmologist at VOC, our qualified staff will examine your pet and discuss with you the diagnosis and treatment for your pet’s eye condition. Any questions or concerns will be answered with the care and attention you and your pet deserve.

What should I bring to the visit?:

If you would like the ophthalmologist to have your pet’s medical records, please notify your primary care veterinary office and they can fax or email the records to us. Records are not required for the appointment. Bring any current medications to the appointment or know the names and directions of those medications to better prepare for your visit. Also, please bring your photo I.D. for check in.
