What you will need:

RED HEART® Scrubby™: 1 ball each 620 Lime **A**, 241 Duckie **B**, and 258 Orange **C**

RED HEART® Super Saver®: 1 yd of 312 Black **D**

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: Gauge is not critical for this project.



RED HEART® Scrubby™, Art. E833 available in solids 3.5 oz (100 g), 92 yd (85 m) and prints 3 oz (85 g), 78 yd (71 m) balls



RED HEART® Super Saver®, Art. E300 available in solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yd (333 m); prints, multis and heathers 5 oz (141 g), 236 yd (215 m), flecks 5 oz (141 g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins

Rubber Duckie Scrubby

Bath time is rubber duckie time! So crochet these colorful ducks in any color you wish for some sudsy fun. They are easily kept clean by machine washing, and you'll love that this yarn dries more quickly than thick cotton cloths.

Scrubby measures 7" (18 cm) long, excluding hanging loop.

Special Stitches

sc2tog = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

sc3tog = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

SCRUBBY

(make 1 each with **A** and **B**)

Beginning at top of head, ch 6.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—5 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn—7 sc.

Row 3: Repeat Row 2—9 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5: Repeat Row 2—11 sc.

Rows 6–10: Repeat Row 4.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc3tog, sc in next 5 sc, sc3tog, turn—7 sc.

Row 12: Ch 12, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sc in first 6 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn—19 sc.

Row 13: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each remaining sc, turn—20 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn—21 sc.

Row 15: Repeat Row 13—22 sc.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each remaining sc, turn—21 sc.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog, turn—20 sc.

Rows 18 and 19: Repeat Rows 16 and 17—18 sc.

Rows 20 and 21: Repeat Row 16—16 sc.

Row 22: Repeat Row 4.

Rows 23 and 24: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog, turn—12 sc.

Round 25: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog; *working in ends of rows and adding sc as needed to keep piece flat, sc in each row* to Row 12; working in opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in each remaining ch, repeat from * to * to Row 1; working in opposite side of foundation ch, 2 sc in first ch, sc in next ch, (sc, ch 9, slip st) in next sc (hanging loop made), sc in next ch, 2 sc in last ch; repeat from * to * around to first sc; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Beak (make 2)

With **C**, ch 2.

Row 1: Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn—2 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in last sc, turn—3 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—4 sc.

Row 5: Repeat Row 2. Leaving a long tail for sewing, fasten off.

FINISHING

With ending tail, sew beak to head. With **D**, embroider satin stitches for each eye. Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B, C = Color A, Color B, Color C, etc.; ch = chain(s); sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); () = work directions in parentheses into same st; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
