

How to make 3-D Ornaments for Easter and Spring




1. Choose three eggs.
(Any symmetrical shape will work!)



2. Decorate three eggs with markers, stamps or glitter glue.



Fold eggs in half lengthwise.



4. Glue the back sides of two folded pieces together. Match up sides & fold edges carefully.



*ribbon or raffia will work well too

5. Cut a 10" piece of yarn, fold in half & knot the top. Glue to the inside center of the ornament.



6. Glue the decorated egg on top. Adjust the folds and Voila` 3-D eggs!




1. Start with 3 symmetrical creative cut-out shapes. Pre-fold in half and unfold. Squirt blobs of paint or glitter glue on one side.



2. Press painted sides together gently and unfold. Repeat the process for all three sides, and let them dry.



3. Glue three pieces together as shown above. Add yarn, ribbon or raffia for a hanger.
