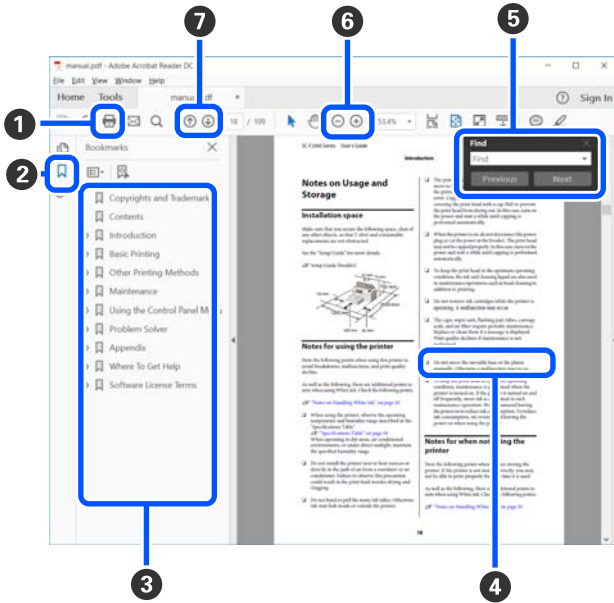

- 1 Click to print the PDF manual.
- 2 Each time it is clicked the bookmarks are hidden or shown.
- 3 Click the title to open the relevant page.
Click [+] to open the titles lower in the hierarchy.
- 4 If the reference is in blue text, click the blue text to open the relevant page.

To return to the original page, do the following.

For Windows

While pressing the Alt key press the ← key.

For Mac

While pressing the command key press the ← key.

- 5 You can input and search for keywords, such as the names of items you want to confirm.

For Windows

Right click on a page in the PDF manual and select **Find** in the menu that is displayed to open the search toolbar.

For Mac

Select **Find** in the **Edit** menu to open the search toolbar.

- 6 To enlarge the text in the display that is too small to see well, click +. Click - to reduce the size. To specify a part of an illustration or screenshot to enlarge, do the following.

For Windows

Right click on the page in the PDF manual and select **Marquee Zoom** in the menu that is displayed. The pointer changes to a magnifying glass, use it to specify the range of the place you want to enlarge.

For Mac

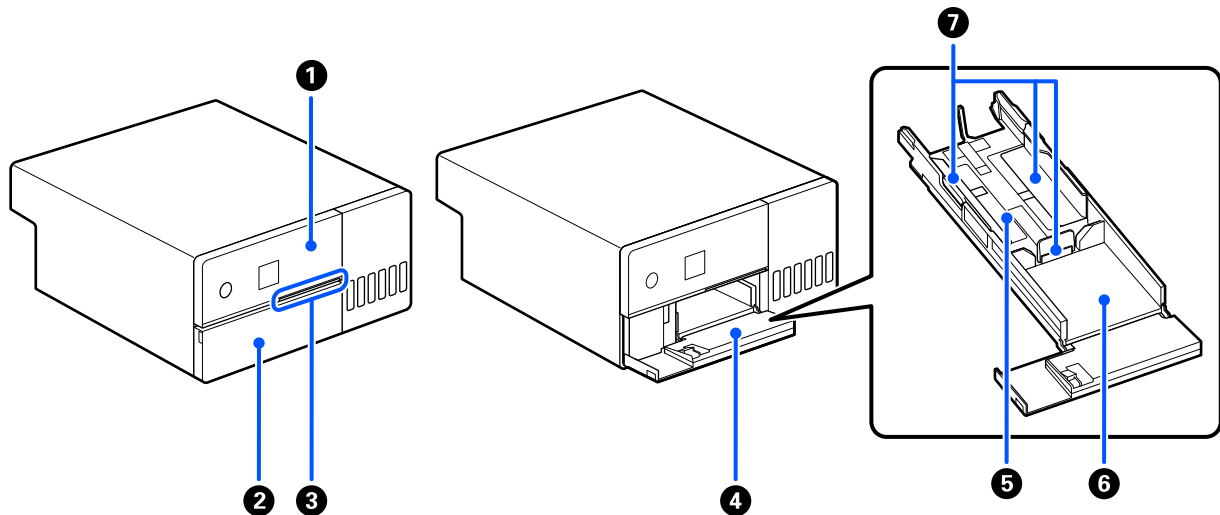

1 Control panel

2 Front cover

Open when loading paper or printing. It opens automatically when printing starts.

3 Status light

On : Error has occurred.

Check the error message on the screen.

Off : Status is normal.

4 Paper cassette

Pull out to load paper.

5 Feed area

Load paper here.

6 Output area

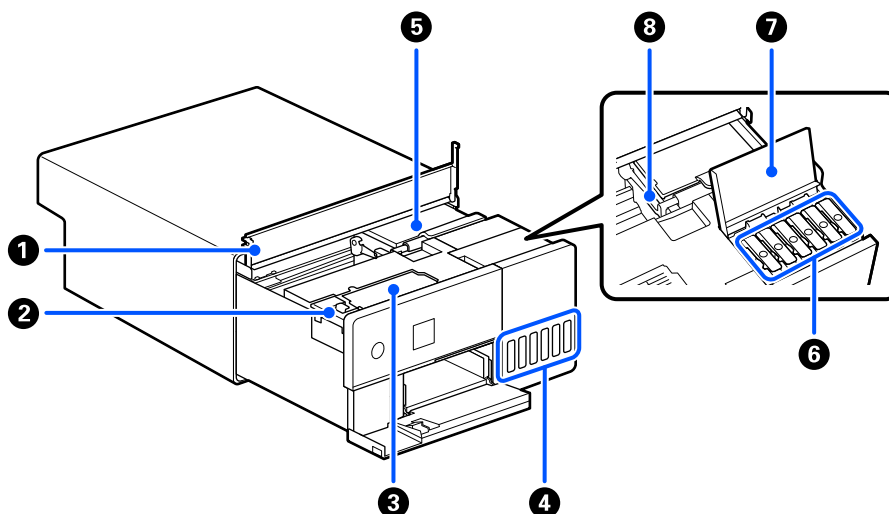
Holds the printed paper.

⑦ Edge guides

Align them with the edges of the paper when loading paper.

Inside
**1 Inner cover**

Open when doing maintenance or removing paper jams.

2 Maintenance box cover

Open to replace the maintenance box.

3 Maintenance box

Container that holds the waste ink fluid.

4 Ink tank

Supplies ink to the print head and shows the ink levels.

5 Print head

The print head prints by moving left and right while emitting ink. Do not move the print head manually with too much force. Otherwise, it may break down.

6 Ink tank caps

Open to refill the ink tank with ink.

7 Ink tank cover

Open to refill the ink tank with ink.

8 Transportation lock

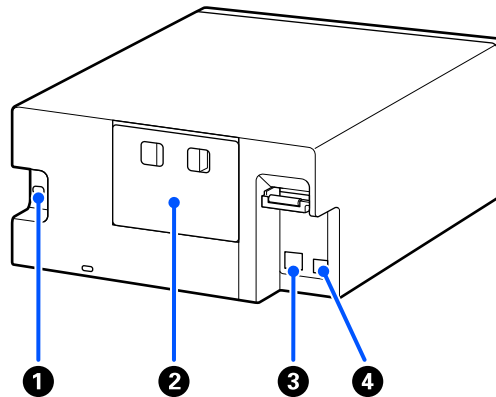

When moving or transporting the printer, set it in the transportation position. Normally, set it in the print position.

1 AC inlet

Connects the power cord to the printer.

2 Rear cover

Remove when doing maintenance or removing paper jams.

By removing the rear cover, you can pull out the interior to the point that the print head is visible.

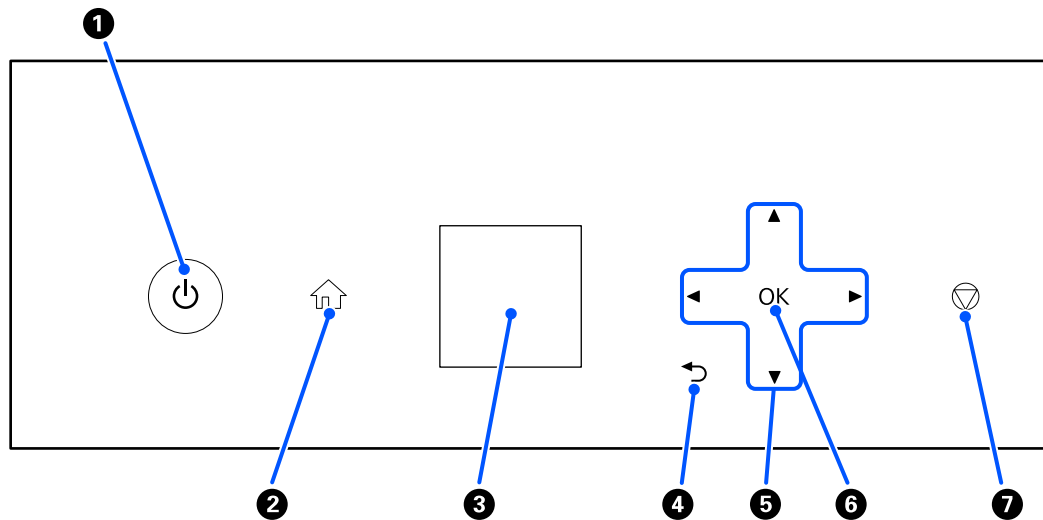
3 LAN port

Connect the LAN cable here.

4 USB port

Connect the USB cable here.

Control Panel


1 **button (power button)**, **light (power light)**

This is normally on (the light is lit) during use. If an emergency occurs, or when the printer is not going to be used for an extended period, press this button to turn the printer off (the light turns off).

The light flashes while the printer is operating.

2 **button (home button)**

Press this, such as when a settings menu is displayed, to return to the Home screen.

3 **Screen**

Displays the printer's status, menus, and error messages.

4 **button (back button)**

Press to go back one level in the displayed settings menu.

5 **buttons (arrow buttons)**

Press when selecting items or entering text in settings menus.

6 **OK button**

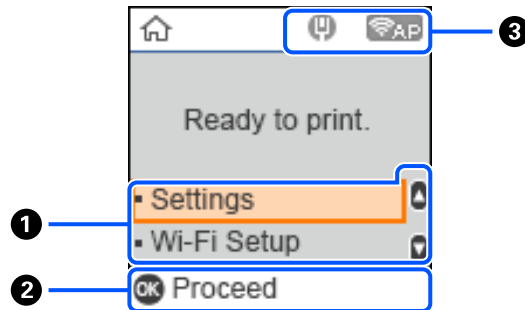
Press to execute functions, and to apply selections and inputs.

7 **button (stop button)**

Press to stop operations.

Select printer settings and execute maintenance functions.

3 Network Status

The network connection statuses are shown by icons.

: Wired LAN is not connected, network is not set.

: Wired LAN is connected

: Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) is disabled or processing the connection

: Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) has a problem with or the printer is searching for a connection

: Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) is connected

The number of lines shows the status of the signal. More lines indicate a better signal status.

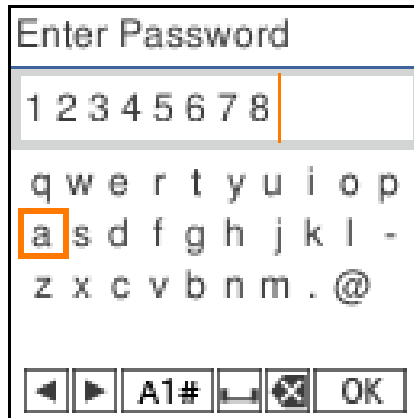

Text Input Screen

To enter characters and symbols for network settings from the control panel, use the ▲/▼/◀/▶ buttons and the software keyboard on the screen. Press the ▲/▼/◀/▶ button to select a character or function button on the keyboard, and then press the OK button. When you have finished entering characters, select OK, and then press the OK button.



- ◀▶ : Moves the cursor to the left or right.
- A 1 # : Switches the character type. You can enter alphanumerics or symbols.
- ␣ : Enters a space.
- ⌫ : Deletes a character to the left (backspace).
- OK : Enters the selected characters.

Notes on Usage

Notes When Handling the Main Unit

- Do not suddenly change the temperature in the room where the printer is installed.
If the temperature changes suddenly, drops of water (condensation) could occur inside the printer which may have an adverse effect on operations.
- Use the printer in an environment with a temperature of 10 to 35 °C (50 to 95 °F), and a humidity of 20 to 80%. When the printer is placed on a system rack, make sure the environment of the rack is within these ranges.
Even when the conditions above are met, you may not be able to print properly if the environmental conditions are not suitable for the paper. Be sure to use the printer in an environment where the paper's requirements are met. For more details, see the documentation supplied with the paper.
Also, when operating in dry areas, air conditioned environment, or under direct sunlight, maintain the appropriate humidity.
- Do not place any containers containing water, such as vases or cups, on the printer. If water enters the printer, it may break down.
- Do not use accessories designed for this printer with any other products.
- Depending on the performance of the computer being used, the printer stops printing temporarily; however, this is not a malfunction.
- If the printer is not to be used for an extended period of time, store it with the maintenance box installed.
- When the printer is operating, do not unplug the power plug from the electric outlet or cut the power at the breaker. The print head may not be capped properly (the print head is not positioned at the far right). Capping is a function for automatically covering the print head with a cap (cover) to prevent the print head from drying out. In this case, turn on the power and wait a while until capping is performed automatically.
- Ink may leave stains inside the printer. Be careful not to stain your hands or clothes when pulling out the inside of the printer during maintenance. We recommend using a commercially available soft cloth to wipe off any ink inside the printer before starting work.

Notes on Paper

Note the following points when handling and storing the paper. If the paper is not in good condition, print quality may decline.





- Use Epson special media under normal room conditions (temperature: 15 to 25 °C (59 to 77 °F), humidity: 40 to 60%).

Before Use

- Do not fold the paper or scratch the surface of the paper.
- Avoid touching the printable surface of the paper with your bare hands. Moisture and oil from hands can have an adverse effect on the print quality.
- Handle paper by the edges of the paper. Also, we recommend wearing cotton gloves when handling paper.
- Do not throw away the paper packaging as you can use it for storing the paper.
- If the printer is not used every day, after you finish using it, remove all the paper that was loaded in the paper cassette.
If the paper is left loaded in the paper cassette, then some parts of the paper may change color.
- Changes in temperature and humidity may cause paper to become wavy or curled. Check the following points.
 - Load the paper just before printing.
 - Do not use wavy or curled paper.
- Do not wet the paper.

Notes before Loading Paper

Before loading paper in the paper cassette, carefully riffle the stack of paper so the sheets do not stick together, and then align all four edges.

Notes on storage

- Avoid locations that are subject to direct sunlight, excessive heat, or humidity.
- Keep the paper in its original package after opening it, and keep the paper flat.

Notes on Printing

Make sure that the leading edge of the paper is perpendicular to the long side and cut completely straight.

Storing and displaying printouts

- Do not rub or scratch printouts. If they are rubbed or scratched, the ink may peel off.
- Make sure the printouts are completely dry before folding or stacking; otherwise, the color may change where they touch (leaves a mark). These marks will disappear if they are separated immediately and dried; however, they will remain if not separated.
- Do not use a dryer to dry the printouts.
- Avoid locations that are subject to high temperature, humidity, and direct sunlight, and store in a dark place.
- Avoid displaying printouts outdoors or in direct sunlight. This may accelerate the fading.
- When displaying printouts indoors, we recommend placing them in glass frames and so on. This allows you to display your printouts for a long time without them fading.

Notes on Handling Ink Bottles

To maintain high quality print results, note the following points for handling ink bottles.

Notes on How to Refill Ink

- Use ink bottles dedicated for this printer.
- When using the printer, be careful when handling the ink. Ink may splatter when refilling the ink tanks. You may not be able to clean off ink that splashes onto clothes or belongings.
- Do not shake or crush the ink bottles.
- To maintain the quality of the printer's print head, the printer is designed to stop printing before the ink supply is completely expended, which is why some ink is left in the ink tanks.
- To keep the printer in optimum operating condition, we recommend that you do not leave the printer with only a small amount of ink remaining in the ink tanks.
- To get the optimum print results, refill the ink to the upper line in the ink tank at least once each year.

Before Use

Notes on storage of ink bottles

- ❑ Avoid storage in locations subject to direct sunlight.
- ❑ Do not store in hot or damp environments.
- ❑ We recommend using the ink bottle before the expiration date printed on the packaging.
- ❑ When storing or transporting ink bottles, do not tilt them or subject them to shocks or sudden changes in temperature. Ink may leak even if the cap of the ink bottle is firmly tightened. Make sure you keep the ink bottle straight up when tightening the ink bottle cap. Also, when transporting the bottles, put them in a bag to prevent ink from leaking.
- ❑ Ink bottles that have been stored at low temperatures for an extended period should be allowed to return to room temperature over a period of at least three hours.
- ❑ Do not open the ink bottle bag until you are ready to refill the ink tank. A vacuum pack is used to maintain quality. If the ink is left for too long after opening the pack, you may not be able to print properly.
- ❑ Use opened bottles as soon as possible.

Ink consumption

- ❑ As well as when printing, the printer also uses ink from all cartridges during head cleaning and other maintenance operations to keep the print head in good condition. Some is also consumed when the power is turned on.
- ❑ A mixture of color inks may be used to print black, depending on the paper type and print quality settings, even for black and white and grayscale printing.
- ❑ Initial ink charging after purchasing the printer consumes enough ink to fill up to the tips of the print head nozzles (the holes from which the ink is fired) allowing you to print right away. Therefore, the number of printed sheets may be lower than the ink bottles used from the second and subsequent refills.

Instructions for Starting

Launch a browser on a computer connected to the same network as the printer.

- 1 Check the IP address of the printer.
From the Home screen, press **Settings** - **Network Settings** - **Advanced Setup** - **TCP/IP** - **Manual**, in this order.
- 2 Launch a Web browser on a computer connected to the printer via a network.

- 3 Enter the IP address of the printer in the address bar of the Web browser and press the **Enter** or **Return** key.

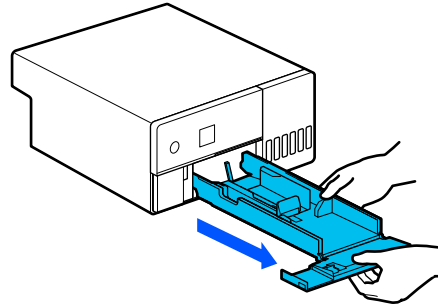
- 1** Open the front cover.



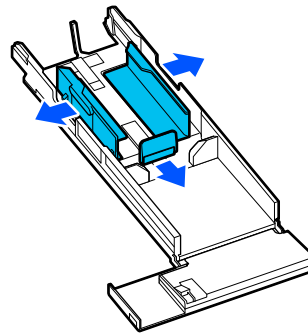
- 2** Pull the paper cassette out.

! **Important:**

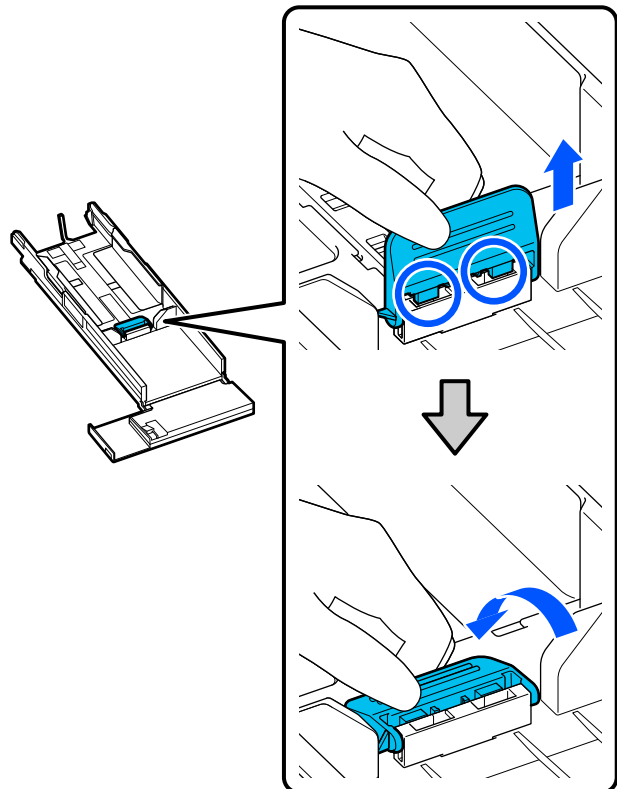
Use both hands to pull the paper cassette out. If you use only one hand, the paper cassette may fall and be damaged because the paper cassette is heavy when it is pulled out.



- 3** Spread apart the left, right, and front edge guides all the way.



- 4** Lower the front edge guide.
Lift up the edge guide until you can see the 2 hooks and then lower it, as shown in the illustration.

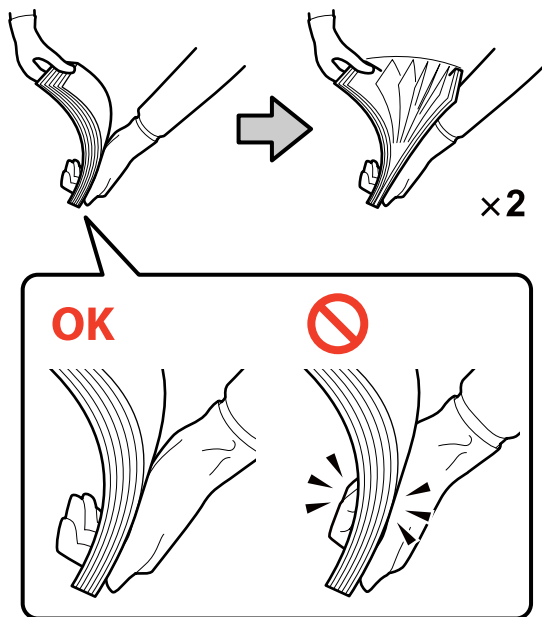
5 Riffle the paper to be loaded.

Static electricity may cause sheets of paper in a stack to stick to each other. Loading paper like that into the cassette could cause paper feeding problems, so follow the procedure below to riffle the paper. Riffling paper forces air between the sheets, which causes them to separate.

Riffle the short edges of the paper two times each.

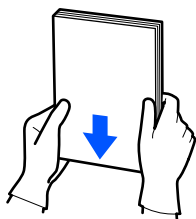
- (1) Riffle the short edges of the paper as shown in the illustration.

Hold the paper lightly, without gripping it too tightly. If you grip too tightly, air cannot get into the edges of the paper to separate the sheets that are stuck together.



- (2) Riffle the other short edges two times in the same way.

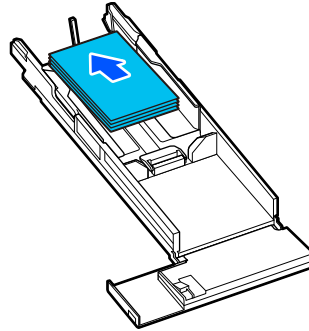
- (3) Align all four edges of the paper.



6 Load the paper with the printable side facing down.

Load paper so that it touches the inside of the paper cassette.

You can load up to 100 sheets of paper.

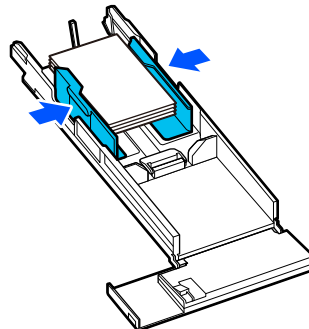


Note:

For Epson Special Media that supports two-sided printing, load it so the side facing the opening when the paper package is opened faces downward.

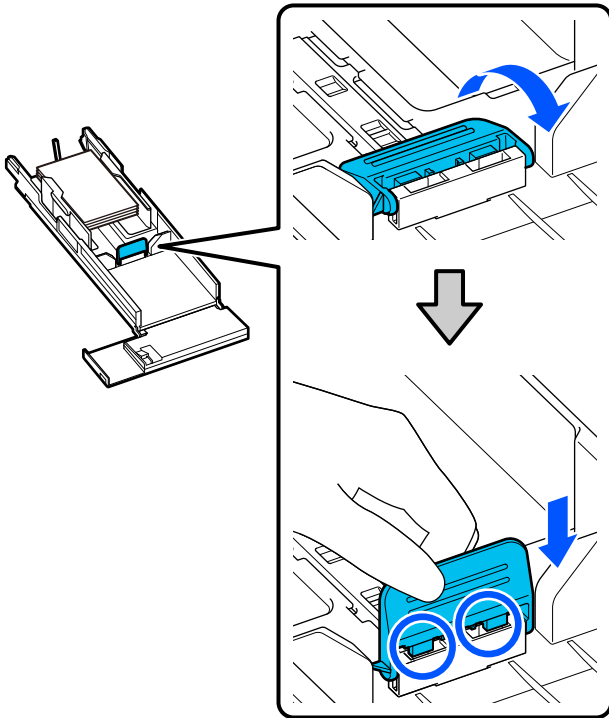
7 Align the left and right edge guides to the paper.

If there are gaps between the edge guides and the paper, the paper may skew during printing, so align them accurately.

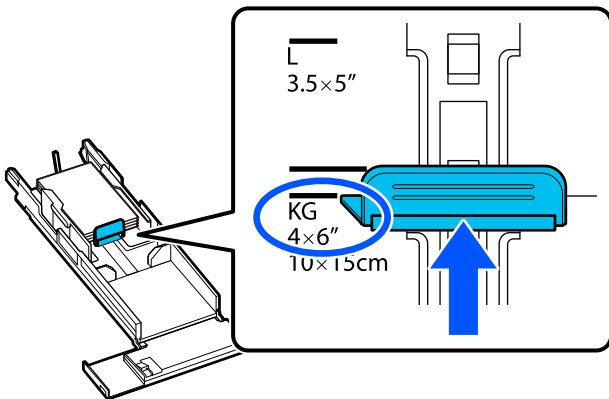

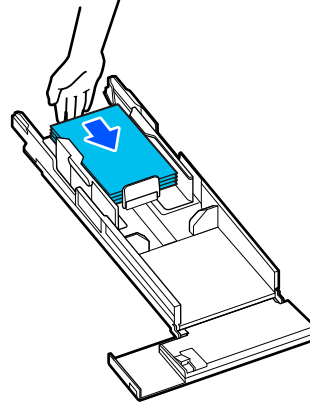
- 8** Raise the front edge guide.
Insert the 2 hooks, as shown in the illustration, until you hear them click.



- 9** Align the front edge guide to the position of the size of paper to be loaded.
The following illustration shows an example of aligning to 10 x 15 cm (4 x 6 in).

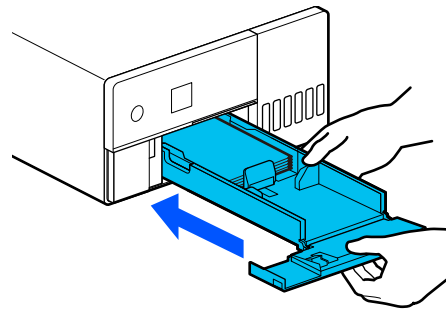


- 10** Move the paper against the front edge guide.



- 11** Insert the paper cassette

! Important:
Use both hands to insert the paper cassette. If you use only one hand, the paper cassette may fall and be damaged because the paper loaded in it is heavy.



- 12** Set the paper size and paper type on the control panel screen.

Color management from the application (no color management)


This method is for printing from applications that support color management. All color management processes are carried out by the application's color management system. This method is used when you want to obtain the same color management results using a common application among different operating system environments.

Types of Borderless Printing Methods

You can perform borderless printing using the following two methods: Auto Expand or Retain Size.

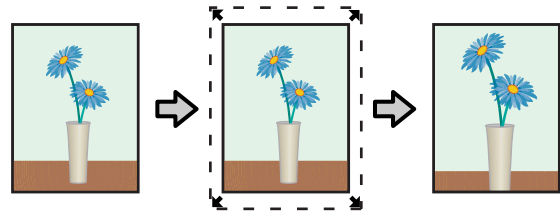
For simple borderless printing, we recommend Auto Expand. To prevent the printer driver from enlarging your image, we recommend Retain Size.

Auto Expand

The printer driver enlarges the print data to a size slightly larger than the paper size and prints the enlarged image. The sections which are beyond the paper edges are not printed; therefore, resulting in borderless printing.

Use settings such as Page Layout in the applications to set the size of the image data as follows.

- Match the paper size and page setting for the print data.
- If the application has margin settings, set the margins to 0 mm.
- Make the image data as large as the paper size.



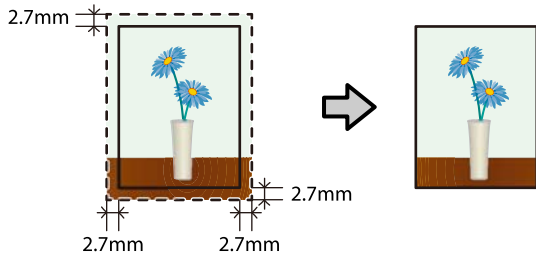
Retain Size

Create the print data larger than the paper size in the applications to produce borderless output. The printer driver does not enlarge the image data. Use settings such as Page Layout in the applications to set the size of the image data as follows.

- Set the page layout to extend 2.7 mm beyond the actual paper size on all four edges.
- If the application has margin settings, set the margins to 0 mm.

When you send an email with attachments, such as documents or images that you want to print, to the email address assigned to the printer, you can print the email and attached files. You can print on your printer from remote locations.
- Remote Print Driver**
This is a shared driver supported by Remote Print Driver. When printing using a printer in a remote location, you can print by changing the printer on the usual applications window.

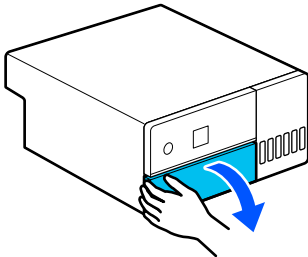

- Do not shake the bottles too hard. Ink could leak out.*
- Do not leave the bottle inserted into the ink tank. Doing so could damage the bottle or cause ink to leak.*

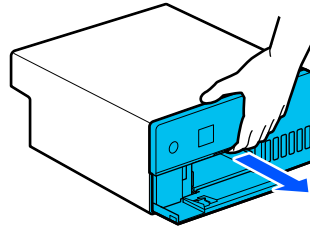

Print Head Nozzle Check

The print head nozzles may be clogged if there are streaks or scrapes in the printouts or if printed colors are different from usual.

This section explains how to do a Print Head Nozzle Check.

Types of Nozzle Checks


There are three methods to check the state of the print head nozzles, as shown below.

Automatically checking the state of the nozzles

The printer has an auto nozzle check function that checks the state of the nozzles at a specified interval and automatically cleans the nozzles if they clog and uses normal nozzles to compensate for clogged nozzles while printing. Because of this, you do not normally need to check the print head nozzles manually.

The auto nozzle check settings (such as changing the interval or disabling the function) are set from Maintenance Tool.

Important:

When checking the state of the nozzles, 1 sheet of paper is used because the printer prints a check pattern on the paper that is loaded.

Also, the paper on which the check pattern is printed could be mixed in with other printouts.

Manually checking the state of the nozzles

You can check the state of the nozzles by executing a nozzle check from Maintenance Tool, such as before printing an important job, or if the printer has not been used for an extended period or the Auto Nozzle Check function is disabled. By executing a Nozzle Check, the printer automatically detects clogged nozzles. Depending on the results of the check, you can do Print Head Cleaning.



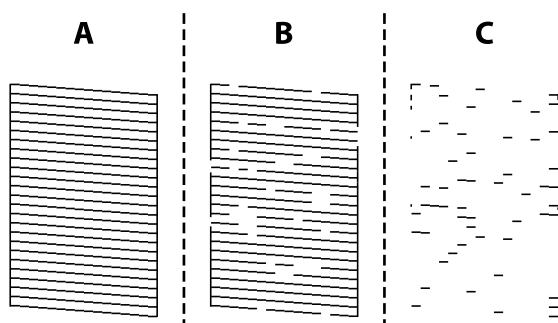

Power Ink Flushing

If clogs do not clear after executing Powerful Cleaning and then not using the printer to print for more than 12 hours, executing Power Ink Flushing may improve print quality.

Executing Power Ink Flushing replaces all of the ink in the ink tubes.

Important:

- Before starting work, visually check that the ink tank is more than 50% percent full. Because all of the ink in the ink tubes is replaced, if you perform this operation with only a small amount of ink remaining, the ink may contain bubbles and you will not be able to print correctly.
- You may need to replace the maintenance box. Ink in the tubes is discharged into the maintenance box. When the maintenance box is full, you cannot print until it has been replaced. We recommend preparing a new maintenance box in advance.

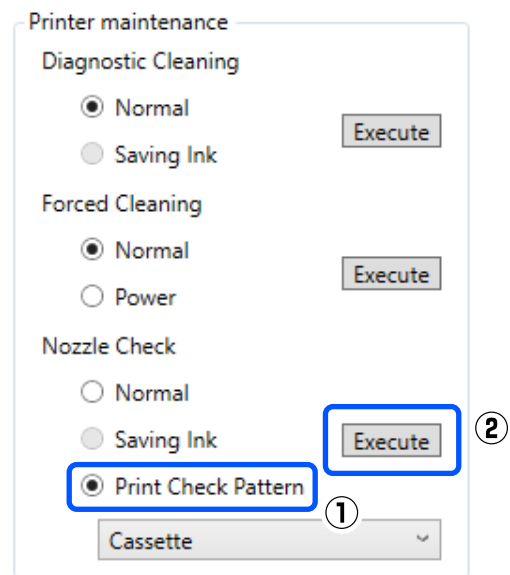

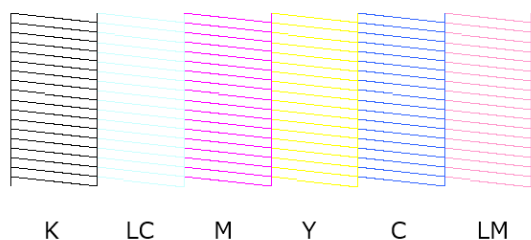

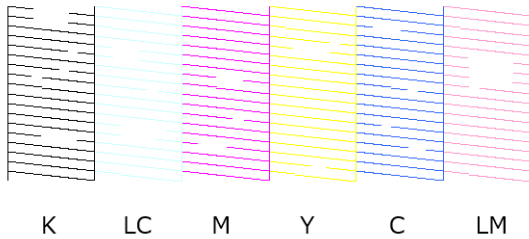

Print Head Cleaning Method

Types of Cleaning and Order of Implementation

There are two types of cleaning, **Forced Cleaning**, which is cleaning the print head manually, and **Diagnostic Cleaning**, which detects clogged nozzles and cleans the print head automatically.

First, implement **Diagnostic Cleaning**.

After doing that, when “Clogged nozzles detected. Perform [Forced Cleaning].” is displayed in **Printer history** on the main screen, implement **Diagnostic Cleaning**.

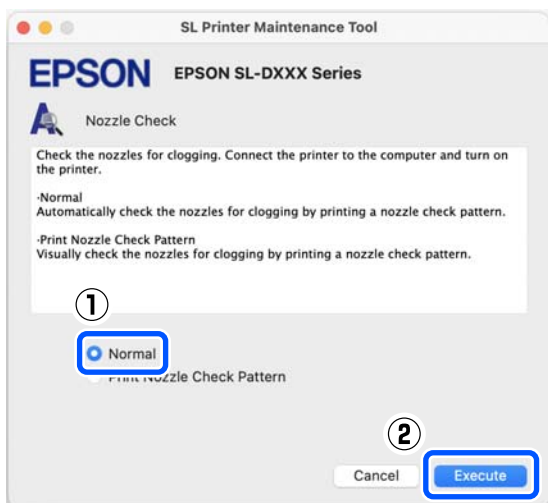

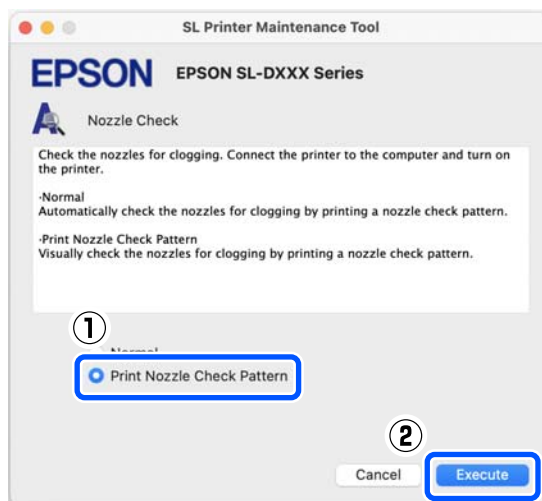

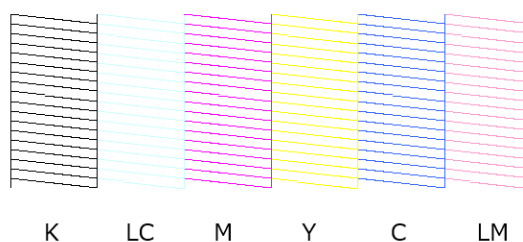

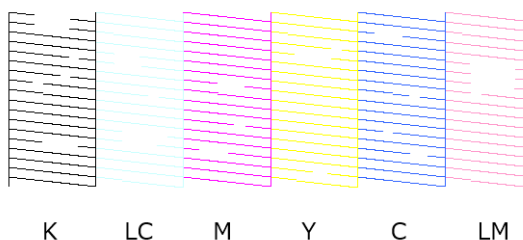

If part of the pattern is missing, then the print head nozzles are clogged. The print head needs to be cleaned.

Print Head Cleaning Method

Types of Cleaning and Order of Implementation

There are two types of cleaning, **Forced Cleaning**, which is cleaning the print head manually, and **Diagnostic Cleaning**, which detects clogged nozzles and cleans the print head automatically.

First, implement **Diagnostic Cleaning**.

After that, when "Diagnostic cleaning is finished. Clogged nozzles detected. Perform diagnostic cleaning again." is displayed on screen, implement **Diagnostic Cleaning** again.

If the clogged nozzles are not cleared after repeating **Diagnostic Cleaning** three times, then do **Forced Cleaning** set to **Power**.

Diagnostic Cleaning

Prints a check pattern on the paper and automatically checks the state of the nozzles. Paper must be loaded in the printer.

- 1 Load more than 2 sheets of paper in the paper cassette.

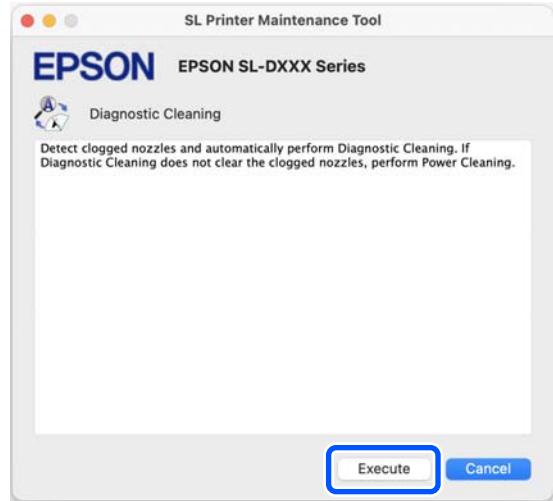

- During Nozzle Check immediately after clicking **Execute** in step 3
- When checking nozzles after cleaning when cleaning was executed

- 3 Click **Execute**.



The nozzle check starts and cleaning is executed if necessary.

The time needed for cleaning varies according to the status of the nozzles.

If the clogged nozzles are not cleared after repeating **Diagnostic Cleaning** three times, then execute **Forced Cleaning** set to **Power**.

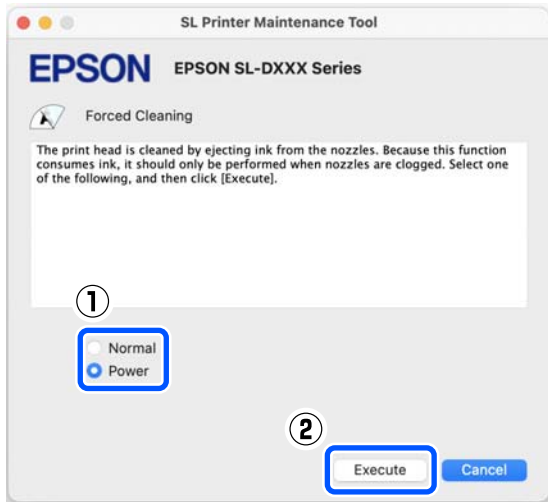

Use this setting if the nozzles are still clogged even after repeating **Normal** cleaning several times. **Power** consumes more ink than **Normal** cleaning. If a message is displayed informing you that there is not enough ink remaining, refill the ink tank and then execute.

If the clogged nozzles are not cleared by executing **Normal** cleaning, execute **Normal** cleaning again. If the clogged nozzles are not cleared even by repeating this several times, execute **Power** cleaning.

If the clogged nozzles are not cleared even after executing cleaning at **Power**, then do not use the printer for printing for at least 12 hours. Waiting for this amount of time may allow the clogged ink to dissolve.


If that does not improve the situation, execute Power Ink Flushing from the printer's control panel.

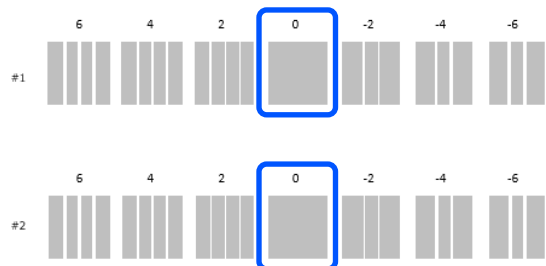

If the print results appear grainy or out of focus, perform Print Head Alignment. The Print Head Alignment function corrects print head misalignments when printing.

Wi-Fi Direct (Simple AP) Connection

Use this connection method when you want to connect the printer directly to a computer or smart device without using wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) and a wireless LAN router (access point). In this mode, the printer acts as a wireless router and you can connect the devices to the printer without having to use a standard wireless router. However, devices directly connected to the printer cannot communicate with each other through the printer.



The printer can be connected by wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) and Wi-Fi Direct (Simple AP) simultaneously. However, if you start setting Wi-Fi Direct (Simple AP) while connected by wireless LAN (Wi-Fi), the wireless LAN (Wi-Fi) connection is temporarily disconnected.

Selecting Wi-Fi Settings from the Printer

If you know the information for the access point such as SSID and password, you can make settings manually.

If you are using a wireless LAN router (access point) that supports WPS, then you automatically assign settings by pressing a button.

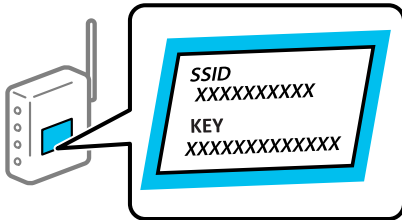

- 2** Select **Wi-Fi (Recommended)**.
- 3** Press the **OK** button to proceed.
- 4** Select **Wi-Fi Setup Wizard**.

- 5** Select the SSID for the wireless LAN router (access point) from the printer's control panel, and then press the **OK** button.

Note:

- If the SSID you want to connect to is not displayed on the printer's control panel, select **Search Again** to update the list. If it is still not displayed, select **Other SSIDs**, and then enter the SSID directly.
- If you do not know the SSID, check if it is written on the label of the wireless router. If you are using the wireless router with its default settings, use the SSID written on the label.

- 6** Enter the password.
Select whether or not you print a network connection report after finishing the settings.

- If you do not know the password check if the information is written on the label of the wireless router. If you are using the wireless router with its default settings, use the password on the label. If you cannot find any information, see the documentation provided with the wireless router.

Solutions:

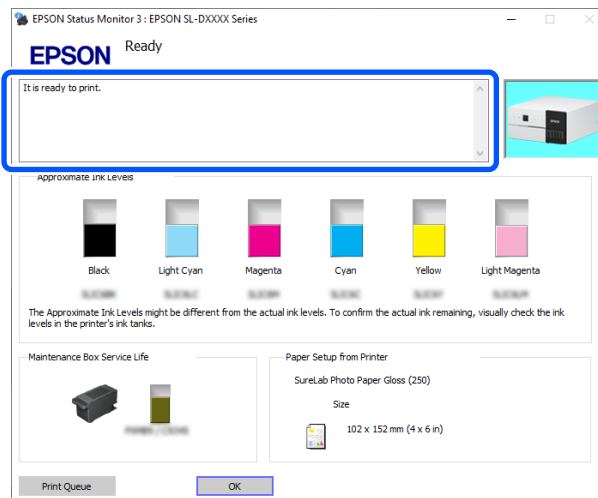

Troubleshooting

When Paper Jams

When paper jams, messages are displayed on the screen of the control panel. Check the messages for the location of the paper jam, and then remove the jammed paper.

Caution:

- ❑ Do not touch any areas inside the printer except for those indicated in the manual. An electric shock or burn could occur.
- ❑ When opening and closing the covers, do not place your hands near the points where the main unit and the cover join. If your fingers or hands are trapped, an injury could occur.
- ❑ Do not pull out the paper or paper cassette forcibly when clearing out jammed paper. Also, do not work in an awkward posture. The paper or paper cassette could suddenly come out and the sudden force could cause an injury.
- ❑ Do not rub the edges of the paper with your hands. The edges of the paper are thin and sharp and could cause an injury.

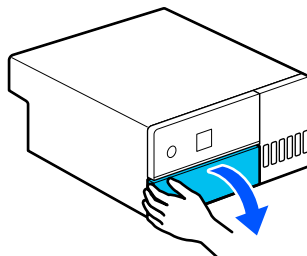
Important:

- ❑ When the message "Then turn the power off and on again." appears on the screen, turn the power off and then on again to confirm whether the error reoccurs. If the same message is displayed repeatedly, follow the instructions on screen, press the OK button, then follow the procedure below to clear the paper jam, and then turn the power off and on again.
- ❑ Do not remove paper forcibly when clearing paper jams. Otherwise, the printer could be damaged.
- ❑ If paper is jammed inside the printer where you cannot reach it with your hands, do not try to forcibly extract it yourself, contact your dealer or Epson Support.



Since monitors and printers produce colors differently, printed colors will not always match on-screen colors perfectly.

The Prints Are Not What You Expected

Print quality is poor, uneven or streaky, or too light or dark.

If the nozzles are clogged, specific nozzles do not fire ink and the print quality declines. Execute a Nozzle Check.

This printer is developed for use with genuine ink bottles.

Using non-genuine products may cause a decline in print quality.

The color is not exactly the same as another printer.

■ Colors vary depending on the printer type due to each printer's characteristics.

Because inks, printer drivers, and printer profiles are developed for each printer model, the colors printed by different printer models are not exactly the same.

The print is not positioned properly on the media.

■ Have you specified the print area?

Check the print area in the settings of the application and the printer.

■ Are the Paper Size settings correct?

If the **Paper Size** in the printer driver and the size of the paper loaded in the printer do not match, the print position may misalign or some of the data may not be printed. In this case, check the print settings.

The printed surface is scuffed or soiled.

■ Is the paper too thick or too thin?

Check that the paper specifications are compatible with this printer.

Margins appear in borderless printing.

■ Are the settings for the print data in the application correct?

Make sure that the paper settings in the application are correct as well as in the printer driver.

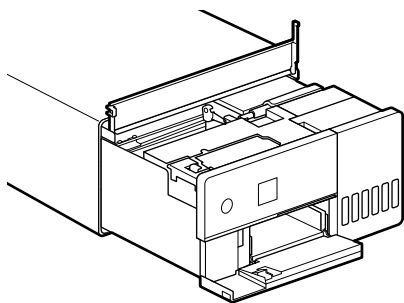

The administrator password has been lost.

■ **Contact your dealer or Epson Support.**

The initial value for the administrator's password is the product's serial number. If you forget the password after it was changed from the product serial number, contact your dealer or Epson Support.

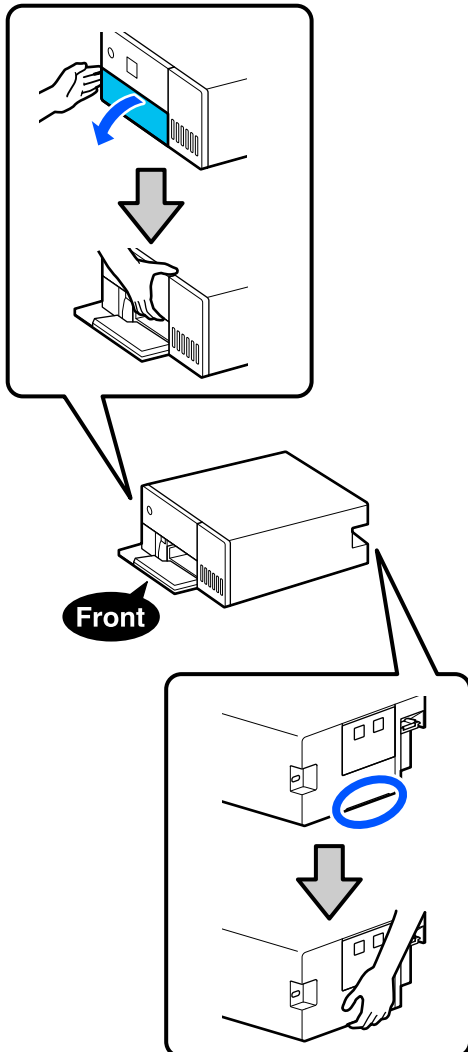

Moving and Transporting the Printer

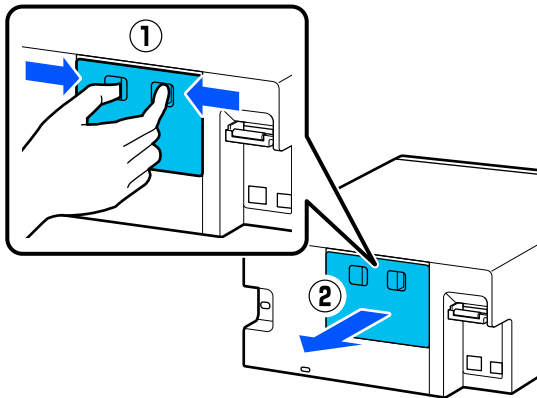

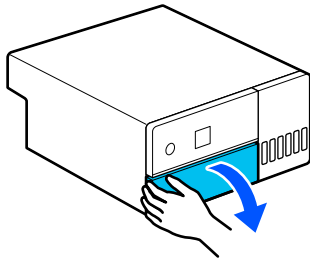

 After the power light turns off, unplug the power plug from the electric outlet. The print head may not be capped properly (the print head is not positioned at the far right). If the print head is left uncapped for a long time, the print quality may decline.

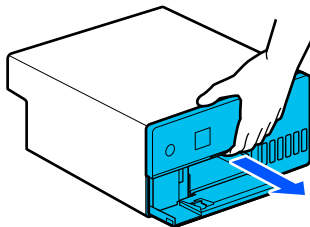
- 3 Remove the rear cover.



- 4 Open the front cover.

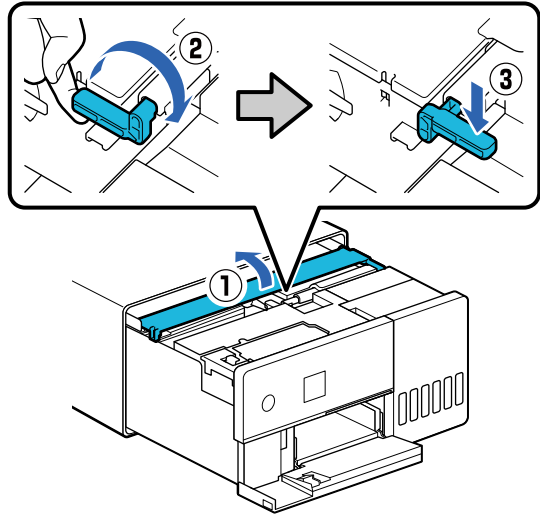


- 5 Place your hand as shown in the illustration, and pull out the interior of the printer until it stops.

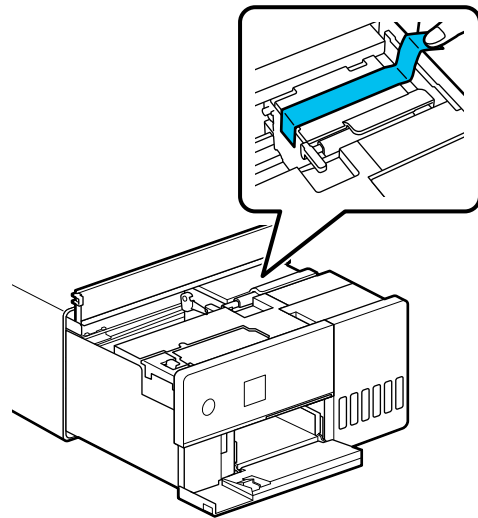


- 6 Open the inner cover and set the transportation lock in the transportation position, as shown in the illustration.

Putting the transportation lock in the transportation position prevents the ink from leaking.

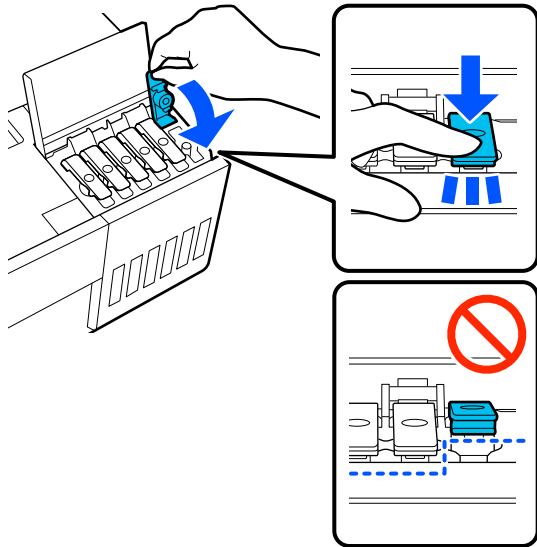


- 7 Use commercially available tape to secure the print head so it does not move.

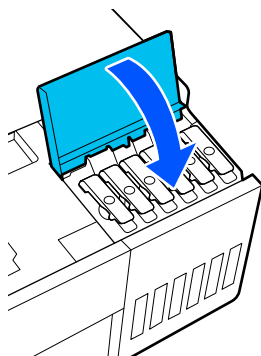

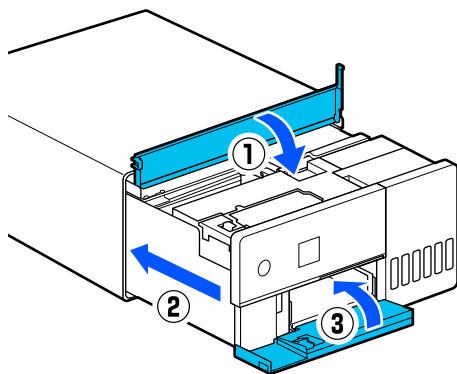
- 8** Confirm that all the ink tank caps are securely closed.



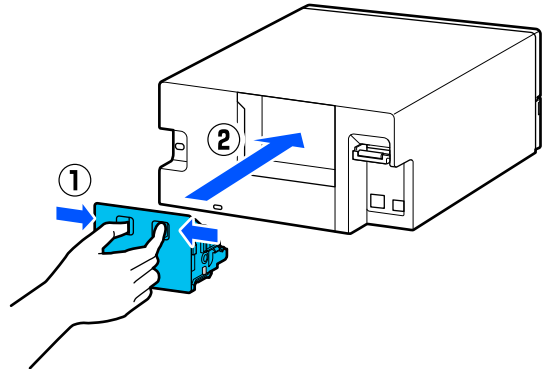
- 9** Securely close the ink tank cover.



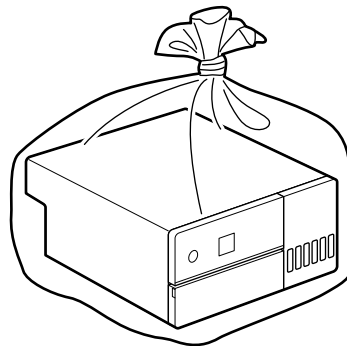
- 10** Close the inner cover, return the interior of the printer to its original position, and then close the front cover.

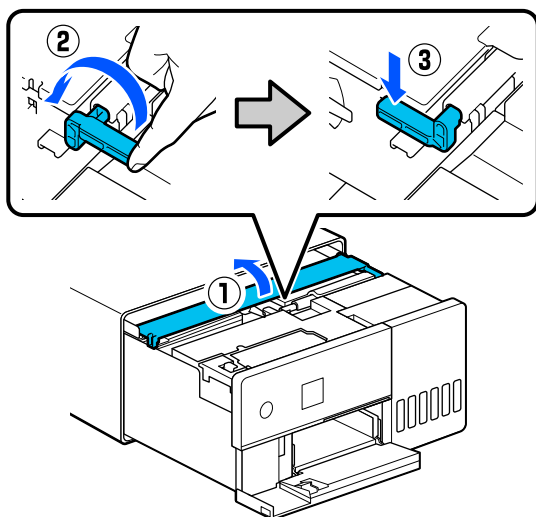

After transporting the printer, return the transportation lock to the printing position. You cannot print if it is in the transportation position.



- 5 Close the inner cover, return the interior of the printer to its original position, and then close the front cover.
- 6 Install the rear cover.
- 7 Connect the power cable, and turn the printer on.
- 8 Execute a Print Head Nozzle Check to confirm that the nozzles are not clogged.

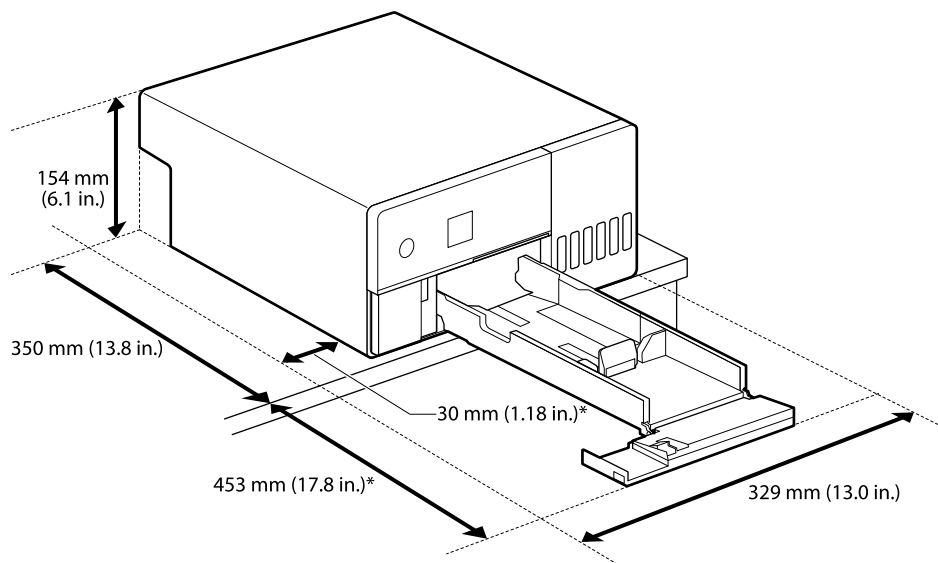
