

## **SUPER-SHORTY FAQs**

### **Can my local gun shop handle the transfer of a SUPER-SHORTY?**

Maybe. Since the SUPER-SHORTY is an NFA weapon only dealers with additional licensing known as an SOT may deal in NFA items. The easiest way to find out if they have this license is to ask if they are an NFA dealer. Although signs that a dealer is an NFA dealer include their advertising themselves as a Class II or Class III dealer or if you see that they have suppressors for sale.

### **How does purchasing a SUPER-SHORTY differ from purchasing a “regular” pistol or rifle?**

Since the SUPER-SHORTY is classified as an NFA Weapon, specifically an AOW (Any Other Weapon) only NFA dealers can deal in them.

Additionally, special paperwork must be submitted to and processed by the NFA branch of the ATF. As such there is a somewhat lengthy wait from the time you order a SUPER-SHORTY until the time you take it home.

### **Do I have to have a trust or get a Chief Law Enforcement Officer to sign off in order to own a SUPER-SHORTY.**

No. While trusts are still the preferred method for the purchase of an NFA weapon in our opinion, they are not required.

Chief Law Enforcement Officer sign off is no longer a requirement for the purchase of an NFA item without a trust as of July 2016.

### **Can I own/is the SUPER-SHORTY legal in my state?**

Most likely yes. The SUPER-SHORTY is legal to purchase and possess in the vast majority of the country including California.

The easiest way to tell is to contact an NFA dealer in your area as they would have the most up to date and relevant information regarding the purchase of NFA weapons (specifically an AOW in this case) for your specific jurisdiction. Although, it is always best to research the laws for your specific area for yourself.

### **How do I purchase a SUPER-SHORTY?**

There are 2 ways to purchase a SUPER-SHORTY.

1<sup>st</sup>: You can order it directly from us and either have it shipped to an NFA dealer of your choice or pick it up in person from our shop (only if you are a Florida resident).

2<sup>nd</sup>: You can purchase it directly from a dealer who either has one on stock or orders it from us for you.

### **How much is the tax stamp for the SUPER-SHORTY?**

\$5.00. Since the SUPER-SHORTY is classified as an AOW the tax stamp is only \$5.00 unlike all the other NFA tax stamps which are \$200.00.

### **How long is the wait for a SUPER-SHORTY from the time I order it?**

The short answer is 4-10 months; although waits differ depending on circumstances as listed below.

If you order directly from us and pick up your SUPER-SHORTY from our shop the wait can take 4-8 months; although 6 months is about average.

If you purchase from a local dealer who has one in stock the wait will again be 4-8 months; 6 on average.

If you order from us and have it shipped to your local dealer or have your dealer order directly from us, the wait will be 6-10 weeks longer; 8 on average.

### **Can I have a shotgun I already own converted into a SUPER-SHORTY?**

Yes. As long as your shotgun is a Remington 870 or Mossberg 500 and already registered as an AOW or SBS we can convert your existing shotgun into a SUPER-SHORTY

### **Is the SUPER-SHORTY considered a Pistol, SBS or AOW?**

The SUPER-SHORTY is almost always an AOW, except in rare circumstances when an existing shotgun is converted into a SUPER-SHORTY

### **Is the SUPER-SHORTY available in any other gauges like 20ga or 410ga?**

While we've offered the SUPER-SHORTY in 20ga in the past, we no longer offer the SUPER-SHORTY in any gauge other than 12ga.

We hope to do a limited run of 20ga SUPER-SHORTIES again in the future. Keep an eye on our website and Facebook page, as their release will be announced in these places first.

### **Can I use my SUPER-SHORTY while I'm waiting for the ATF paperwork to clear?**

Generally no, as the SUPER-SHORTY may not leave the custody of the dealer while the paperwork is pending. However, if you choose a NFA dealer who is also a gun range they may let you use the SUPER-SHORTY in their range while waiting for the paperwork to come back.

However, this is entirely at the discretion of that dealer and should be cleared with/arranged ahead of time.

### **What do I need to own a SUPER-SHORTY.**

To transfer a SUPER-SHORTY without a trust you will need 2 passport photos, 2 fingerprint cards and a government issued Photo ID such as a Drivers License, Passport or Concealed Carry Permit.

To transfer a SUPER-SHORTY with a trust you will need 2 passport photos and 2 fingerprint cards for each of the trustees of the trust. You will also need a Responsible Person Form for each of the Trustees and a copy of the trust.

### **Can I purchase SUPER-SHORTY parts like the barrel and cocking slide?**

No. Unfortunately we don't sell SUPER-SHORTY parts, except as replacement parts for a SUPER-SHORTY owner. However, since we handle any necessary repairs it is unlikely anyone would need to purchase replacement parts.

### **Can I purchase aftermarket upgrade parts like a pistol grip or shell holder for the SUPER-SHORTY?**

Yes. Since the SUPER-SHORTY is based off of either the Remington 870 or Mossberg 500 depending on which model you purchase, aftermarket parts like pistol grips and shell holders that fit the Remington 870 or Mossberg 500 should fit your SUPER-SHORTY.

**Is a Holster available for the SUPER-SHORTY?**

Yes, we offer a holster that will work for all models of SUPER-SHORTY except for the breaching model.

**Can I get a breacher model on the Mossberg platform SUPER-SHORTY?**

Unfortunately, no. The Breaching model is only available for the SUPER-SHORTIES built on the Remington 870 platform.

**Can I use the Silencerco Salvo 12 suppressor with the SUPER-SHORTY?**

Unfortunately, the Salvo 12 suppressor is only recommended for use with barrels 10" or longer and the longest barrel option for the SUPER-SHORTY is 9".

**What do all these acronyms stand for?**

ATF: Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (More correctly known as the BATFE)

NFA: National Firearms Act (Law governing each of the following, Suppressor, SBR, SBS, AOW, Machine Gun)

SBR: Short Barreled Rifle

SBS: Short Barreled Shotgun

AOW: Any Other Weapon

FFL: Federal Firearms License

SOT: Special Occupational Tax License
