WEEK 4 - Stone Pit Lane



Hints and Tips

- This is such a clever square, so effective yet relatively easy to do.
- Trust the pattern. When you cast on the square looks enormous but the cabling will really pull it in as you progress.
- I knitted the first square from the written instructions and then followed the chart.
- Cabling terms are often unique to the design. You may know 3/3 LC as C6F and 3/3 RC as C6B. You may want to write these on the pattern.
- Use the wrong side rows, after the cable stitches, to try and tighten up the stitches next to the cables. They can be a bit gappy.
- My central square came out at 14cm x 15cm, but once the corners were added came out at just under 20cm.
- For the corners, don't forget to go down a needle size from the one you're using.
- Bring the working yarn up the side of the corners, I brought mine in front each time.
- Take your time when picking up the stitches and spread them evenly along the sides.
