



- A 7 [8:11:11:12:12]cm (23/4 [3:41/4:41/4:43/4:43/4]")
- B 8 [8:9:10:11:12]cm (3 [3:3½:4:4¼:4¾]")
- C 4 [4:5:5:6:6]cm (1½ [1½:2:2:2½:2½]")
- D 19 [22:25:27:28:32]cm (7½ [8¾:9¾:10¾:11:12½]") (measured from back of neck)
- E 16.5 [20:23:25:27:28]cm (6½ [8:9:9¾:10¾:11]")
- F 12 [14:15:15:15:16]cm (43/4 [51/2:6:6:6:6/4]")
- G 15 [17:19:20:21:22]cm (6 [6½:7½:8:8¼:8¾]")
- H 9 [12:16:17:18:20]cm (3½ [4¾:6¼:6½:7:8]")



STITCHES & ABBREVIATIONS

beg - beginning

BACK

Using 2³/4mm needles and thumb method cast on 52 [64:74:80: 86:90] sts.

Ist Row. Knit.

This row will now be referred to as **g-st** (garter stitch).

Work 9 rows more in g-st.

Change to 31/4mm needles and proceed as follows:-

Ist Row. Knit.

2nd Row. Purl.

Ist and 2nd rows will now be referred to as **st-st** (stocking stitch). **

Working in st-st (throughout) cont until back measures II [13:13:15:
17:19]cm, (4¹/₄ [5¹/₄:5¹/₄:6:6¹/₂:7¹/₂]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE ARMHOLES

Work 3 [4:4:5:5:5] rows dec I st at each end of every row.

46 [56:66:70:76:80] sts.

Cont without shaping until armholes measure 7 [8:11:11:12:12]cm, $(2^{3}/4)$ [3: $4^{1}/4$: $4^{3}/4$: $4^{3}/4$]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE SHOULDERS

Cast off 5 [7:9:9:10:10] sts at beg of next 2 rows. 36 [42:48:52:56:60] sts.
Cast off 5 [8:10:10:10:11] sts at beg of next 2 rows. 26 [26:28:32:36:38] sts.
Cast off rem 26 [26:28:32:36:38] sts.

LEFT FRONT

Using 2³/4mm needles and thumb method cast on 24 [30:35:38: 41:43] sts.

Work 10 rows in g-st.

Change to 3½mm needles and working in st-st (throughout) cont until left front measures 11 [13:13: 15:17:19]cm, (4½ [5½:5½:6: 6½:7½]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE ARMHOLE

Next Row. K2tog (armhole edge), knit to end. 23 [29:34:37:40:42] sts.

Next Row. Purl to last 2 sts, p2tog.

22 [28:33:36:39:41] sts.

Work I [2:2:3:3:3] rows dec I st at armhole edge in every row.

21 [26:31:33:36:38] sts.

Cont without shaping until armhole measures 4 [5:7:7:7:7]cm, (1½ [2:2³/4:2³/4:2³/4in), ending with a rs row.

SHAPE NECK

Next Row. Cast off 5 [5:5:6:7:8] sts (neck edge), purl to end. 16 [21:26:27:29:30] sts.

Next Row. Knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. **15** [20:25:26:28:29] sts.

Work 5 [5:3:5:5:5] rows dec 1 st at neck edge in every row.

10 [15:22:21:23:24 sts.

Work 0 [0:5:3:5:5] rows dec 1 st at neck edge in 0 [0:1st:1st:1st:1st] and every foll 0 [0:2nd:2nd:2nd:2nd] row. 10 [15:19:19:20:21] sts.

Cont without shaping until armhole measures 7 [8:11:11:12:12]cm, $(2^{3}/4 [3:4^{1}/4:4^{1}/4:4^{3}/4:4^{3}/4]in)$, ending with a ws row.

SHAPE SHOULDER

Next Row. Cast off 5 [7:9:9:10:10] sts, knit to end. 5 [8:10:10:10:11] sts.

Next Row. Purl.

Cast off rem 5 [8:10:10:10:11] sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Using 2¾mm needles and thumb method cast on 24 [30:35:38: 41:43] sts.
Work 10 rows in g-st.
Change to 3¼mm needles and working in st-st (throughout) cont

until right front measures | | [13:13:

15:17:19]cm, (4¹/₄ [5¹/₄:5¹/₄:6: 6¹/₂:7¹/₂]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE ARMHOLE

Next Row. Knit to last 2 sts, k2tog (armhole edge). 23 [29:34:37:40:42] sts. Next Row. P2tog, purl to end. 22 [28:33:36:39:41] sts. Work I [2:2:3:3:3] rows dec I st at armhole edge in every row. 21 [26:31:33:36:38] sts. Cont without shaping until armhole measures 4 [5:7:7:7:7]cm, (1½ [2:2³/4:2³/4:2³/4:2³/4]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE NECK

Next Row. Cast off 5 [5:5:6:7:8] sts (neck edge), knit to end.

16 [21:26:27:29:30] sts.

Next Row. Purl.

Next Row. K2tog, knit to end.

15 [20:25:26:28:29] sts.

Work 5 [5:3:5:5:5] rows dec I st at neck edge in every row.

10 [15:22:21:23:24] sts.

Work 0 [0:5:3:5:5] rows dec I st at neck edge in 0 [0:1st:1st:1st:1st] and every foll 0 [0:2nd:2nd:2nd:2nd] row. 10 [15:19:19:20:21] sts.

Cont without shaping until armhole measures 7 [8:11:11:12:12]cm, $(2\frac{3}{4}$ [3: $4\frac{1}{4}$: $4\frac{3}{4}$: $4\frac{3}{4}$]in), ending with a rs row.

SHAPE SHOULDER

Next Row. Cast off 5 [7:9:9:10:10] sts, purl to end. 5 [8:10:10:10:11] sts.

Next Row. Knit.

Cast off rem 5 [8:10:10:10:11] sts.

SLEEVES (Both alike)

Using 2¾mm needles and thumb method cast on 38 [44:48:48: 48:52] sts.

Work 10 rows in g-st.

Change to 3¼mm needles.

Working in st-st (throughout) inc 1 st at each end of 5th and every foll 2nd [6th:8th:6th:4th:6th] row to 42 [54:60:62:60:66] sts.

For 1st, 4th, 5th and 6th sizes only Inc 1 st at each end of every foll 4th [8th:6th:8th] row to 48 [64: 68:70] sts.

For all 6 sizes

Cont without shaping until sleeve measures 9 [12:16:17:18:20]cm, $(3\frac{1}{2}[4\frac{3}{4}:6\frac{1}{4}:6\frac{1}{2}:7:8]in)$, ending with a ws row.

SHAPE SLEEVE TOP

Work 3 [4:4:5:5:5] rows dec I st at each end of every row. 42 [46:52:54:58:60] sts.

Work I [0:0:1:1:1] rows without shaping.

Cast off 4 [2:3:2:3:3] sts at beg of next 8 [2:8:2:12:10] rows.

10 [42:28:50:22:30] sts.

Cast off 0 [3:4:3:4:4] sts at beg of next 0 [10:4:12:2:4] rows.

10 [12:12:14:14:14] sts.

Cast off rem 10 [12:12:14:14:14] sts.

NECKBAND

Join shoulder seams. With rs facing, using 23/4mm needles pick up and knit 20 [20:23:24:29:30] sts evenly along right side of neck, 24 [24:26:30: 34:36] sts evenly from 26 [26:28:32: 36:38] cast off sts at back of neck, 20 [20:23:24:29:30] sts evenly along left side of neck. 64 [64:72:78:92:96] sts. Work 4 rows in g-st. Cast off knitways.

LEFT FRONT BORDER

With rs facing, using 2³/₄mm needles pick up and knit 4 sts evenly along neckband, 36 [45:50:57:64:70] sts evenly along front edge and 6 sts evenly along g-st.
46 [55:60:67:74:80] sts.

FOR A GIRL

Work 6 rows in g-st. Cast off knitways.

FOR A BOY

Cast off knitways.

Work 3 rows in g-st.
4th Row (Buttonhole row). K3 [3:2: 2:2:3], yfwd, k2tog, (k11 [14:16:13: 15:16], yfwd, k2tog) 3 [3:3:4:4:4] times, k2 [2:2:3:2:3].
Work 2 rows more in g-st.

RIGHT FRONT BORDER

With rs facing, using 2¾mm needles pick up and knit 6 sts evenly along g-st, 36 [45:50:57:64:70] sts evenly along front edge and 4 sts evenly along neckband. 46 [55:60:67:74:80] sts.

FOR A BOY

Work 6 rows in g-st. Cast off knitways.

For a Girl

Work 3 rows in g-st.
4th Row (Buttonhole row). K2 [2:2: 3:2:3], yfwd, k2tog, (k11 [14:16:13: 15:16], yfwd, k2tog) 3 [3:3:4:4:4] times, k3 [3:2:2:2:3].

Work 2 rows more in g-st. Cast off knitways.

TO MAKE UP

Fold sleeves in half lengthways then placing folds to shoulder seams, sew sleeves in position. Join side and sleeve seams. Sew on buttons. Pin out garment to the measurement given. Cover with damp cloths and leave until dry. See ball band for washing and further care instructions.
