

## Crochet Christmas Mini Bells designed by Tanya Eberhardt from <a href="https://www.littlethingsblogged.com">www.littlethingsblogged.com</a>

Difficulty: Easy

Size: 7cm (2.7in) long and 7cm (2.7 in) wide

## **Abbreviations:**

ch: chain

slst: slip stitch sc: single crochet

hdc: half double crochet

dc: double crochet
st(s): stitch(es)

## Materials:

- 100% Cotton yarn (Yarn used in sample <u>Patons 100% Cotton Dk</u> in Red and White and <u>Rico Essentials 100% Cotton Dk</u> in Emerald <u>Twilley's Goldfingering</u> in silver is the yarn used in sample
- Size 2.50mm (1/B) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker (optional)

## The Pattern

With colour of your choice and 2.50 mm (1/B)hook Ch6,

OR

Make a magic loop, and close to form a ring

R1: ch3 (counts as first dc), 1 dc, ch2, 2 dc in ring, \*2dc, ch2, 2dc\*, Repeat from \*around 5 times, sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook. (6 clusters in total)
R2: ch3 (counts as first dc), 1 dc, ch2, 2 dc in first ch2 space, \*2dc, ch2, 2dc\*, Repeat from \*around 5 times, sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from beginning ch3. (6 clusters in total)

R3-5: Repeat R2

R6: ch 3, \*1 sl st, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 1hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st in first ch2 space, sc3 in next dc space\*,repeat from \*5 times, sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from beginning ch3.

R7: Using Fingering yarn, sc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Attach yarn at the top of the bell, and make a knot inside as a hanging loop.

Using your favourite colour combos make lots of them and decorate your tree, or even turn them into a festive garland.
