

### Worksheet: What is a 'green job'?


#### Part 1) You will be given a list of companies.

## Sustainable Careers

Part 2) Green jobs specifically focus on improving the environmental outcomes for a company, organisation or society. Research commissioned by Skills Development Scotland (SDS) has identified three types of green jobs:

- 1. Green new and emerging: Unique work requiring new roles, such as involved in clean energy and renewables. Examples include, solar system technician and small module reactor designer. (There are not as many of these jobs as people may think!)
- 2. Green enhanced: Existing jobs that use new skills and knowledge. Examples include environmental lawyer and architect. (These types of jobs are experiencing the greatest demand by employers.)
- 3. Green increased demand: The job hasn't changed, but the work context has. Examples include, engineering and trade skills, such as electricians. (These roles are traditionally dominated by men.)

Using the list of green jobs created in the starter discussion, can you decide if the jobs are in group 1, 2 or 3?





#### Part 3) Exploring types of green jobs




