

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#### **IMPORTANT**

Read instructions throughly prior to installation. Installation should be performed by a qualified professional.

#### INSTALLATION

- 1. Raise the rear of the vehicle to remove tension from the suspension. For safety purposes, secure the rear of the vehicle and remove plastic covers around the rear shock mounts, then remove the rear upper shock hardware.
- 2. If your vehicle has a bolt-on roll cage, remove the hardware from the rear mount points so that you can install the new brackets. If the cage is welded onto the frame, use the included spacers, between the new shock mount brackets and cage and proceed to the next step.
- 3. Place the Assault Industries F-22 shock mount brackets so they align with the 2 mounting holes on the cage. The shock mount portion of the bracket should sandwich the thin metal OE shock mount.
- 4. Install the hardware finger tight (4x) 40mm M12 bolts will hold the bracket to the cage pass the bold through the top of the bracket, at the bottom where the bolt passes through, add 1 washer and M12 nylock.
- 5. Insert the (2x) 70mm M12 into the shock mount point and thread on the M12 nylock nuts.
- 6. Check all connection points to ensure proper fitment.
- 7. Tighten all hardware until properly snug, then reinstall plastic covers.
- 8. Lower the rear of the vehicle back to the ground and double check everything to make sure all hardware is tight and secure.



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
