BASIC OPERATION

Power On/Off

To turn the player on/off, press and hold the Power button until the device powers on or off.

Volume Control

In any mode, touch ut at the top of the screen and touch the + or - symbols to increase or decrease the volume.

Alternatively, use the volume control buttons on the left side of the device.

Charging

When battery power is low, the player will prompt you, power off, and enter Standby mode automatically. Do not try to turn on the unit. You must charge again before using. Charger current specification recommended: 400-500mA. To charge the player, simply connect it to a powered USB port, or external AC adapter.

Note: If you choose to use a third party adapter, please ensure that it is 5V and between 350 and 1000mA, or 1amp.

- **1.** Connect the small end of the supplied mini-USB cable to the micro-USB port.
- **2.** Connect the large end of the cable to a computer. A connection icon will appear on the display when you connect the device to a computer.

File Storage

Your device supports a wide variety of media types, so that you can enjoy your favorite movies, digital images, and music on the move. Your device acts as a removable disk when connected to your computer, which makes transferring files quick and easy.

Extra Storage with a Memory Card

Inserting

Ensure that the player is powered off, and disconnected from the computer. Hold the memory card face up (side with words aligned in the opposite direction of the display screen), and slide the card into the socket on the player, slightly past flush. When you hear the card click into place, you can access it.

Removing

Ensure that the player is powered off, and push the memory card just past flush. When you hear the click, release and the card will slide out.


Caution: Please ensure that the power is off when you connect or disconnect your memory card, or damage may occur to the player or your card.

CONNECTING TO PC

Loading Files: Copy & Paste

Use this method to load audio, video, image, and eBook files.

- 1. Connect the MP3 player to a working USB port.
- **2.** Go to the My Computer (or This PC if using Windows 10) section of your computer. In there you will find a section called Devices with Removable Storage.
- **3.** Locate the drive created by the unit, generally just called Removable Disk with a letter in parentheses. Drive letters vary depending on your system configuration.



4. Open the drive by either double left clicking on the drive itself, or by right clicking to open the option menu then left clicking on the desired drive.



5. Locate the music stored on your computer. Generally this is stored in the My Music folder of your computer.

Note: If you are unable to locate the music on your computer, click on start, search, files and folders, then search for "*.MP3*".



6. Once you have located the song files, you can right click on the song itself and select Copy. Open the removable disk drive, right click on in the empty space and select Paste. This will transfer the song on to your player.



7. Repeat step 6 for as many songs as you want to copy on to the unit

Note: MAC computers

When connected to your MAC computer, the device will act as a removable drive. Simply drag your files to the device.

MAIN MENU

This player provides a touch screen operating system for direct operation.

Main Interface



Navigation

- **1.** The battery and remaining power is shown on the upper right corner of the main menu interface _______.
- **2.** On the main menu interface, choose and touch an icon on the screen, and the player will enter the selected mode.



Back: Touch to navigate through previous menu/s. Press the button on the front of your device to directly return to the main menu.



Settings: Touch to view additional settings within a given mode.

MUSIC

Music mode allows you to listen to your audio files loaded on the player. Connect your wired or wireless listening devices (see page 35 for Bluetooth instructions). Compatible with MP3 and WAV formats.

Main Interface



Music Playback

Touch 1 of 3 buttons at the bottom of the interface to enable the appropriate function.





Play / Pause: Touch to play music / Touch again to pause.



Previous / Fast Rewind:

Touch to skip to previous song / Long touch for fast rewind in current song.



Next / Fast Forward:

Touch to skip to the next song / Long touch for fast forward in current song.



Song playing progress bar:

Drag to adjust playing progress.

Delete Music

If you want to delete a song, touch (=), choose Delete, select Yes, and it will be removed from the device.


VIDEO

Video mode allows you to watch your video files loaded on the player. Compatible with AVI format.

Note: If you are having a hard time viewing your video files, ensure that they are converted to the AVI file format.

Main Interface



Video Playback

Touch 1 of 3 buttons on the interface to enable the appropriate function.



Play / Pause: Touch to play video / Touch again to pause.



Previous / Fast Rewind:

Touch to skip to previous video / Long touch for fast rewind in current video.



Next / Fast Forward:

Touch to skip to the next video / Long touch for fast forward in current video.

Delete Video


If you want to delete the video, touch ;, choose Delete, select Yes, and it will be removed from the device.

PHOTO

Photo mode allows you to view your image files. Compatible with JPEG, BMP, GIF, PNG, and TIF.

Note: We recommend resizing your files to 320x240 or 240x320 dimensions before loading them onto the player for optimum quality.

Main Interface





Browse Images

- **1.** Select Scan Mode to change to Thumbnail or List mode.
- 2. Select Now Playing or Directory List to browse images.
- **3.** Touch a picture, and navigation icons will appear automatically on the screen.



Image Playback

- **1.** Select Slide Effect to change the transition effect between images during a slideshow.
- **2.** Select Slideshow Interval to adjust the amount of time (in seconds) between images during a slideshow.



Previous / Next: View previous or next image.

Delete Picture

If you want to delete the image, touch (=), choose Delete, select Yes, and it will be removed from your device.

FM RADIO

FM Radio mode allows you to listen to FM Radio channels.

Main Interface



Browse Radio Channels

Touch or to search for local channels.

Save Radio Channels

Touch [=], select Save Channel, and select a channel.


Access Saved Radio Channels

Touch = and select Channel List to select from history.

eBOOK


eBook mode allows you to view eBook and text files. Compatible with TXT files. You can create these files using your Windows Notepad or WordPad programs.

Main Interface



View Text File

Select a TXT file to enter the eBook browser interface.



Turn Pages

Use your finger to swipe the up screen to choose previous page and swipe the down screen to choose next page.

Delete Text File

If you want to delete the file, touch ; choose Delete, select Yes, and it will be removed from your device.

CAMERA

The player comes with a digital camera built in which allows you to take pictures and record video.

Main Interface: Photo



Take Pictures

Touch the crosshair + to take a picture, or press the Power button.



Swap: Swap between Camera and Video recorder mode.



Self-Timer: Shows current setting. Options are 0–15 seconds.



Brightness: Shows current setting. Options are 0–3.



White Balance: Shows current setting. Options are Auto, Fine, Cloudy, Filament Lamp, Fluorescent Lamp.



Shutter Sound: Shows current setting. Choose between 3 options.



Resolution: Shows current setting. Options are 2048x1536, 1600x1200, 1280x1024, 1024x768, 640x480.



Space: Shows the remaining number of images you can take in your current settings, until the memory is full.

Main Interface: Video



Record Video

- **1.** Press the Power button to start recording video. Touch again to pause.
- 2. Touch or the main button to save video.



Swap: Swap between Camera and Video recorder mode.



Brightness: Shows current setting. Options are 0–3.

 Options are Auto, Fine, Cloudy, Filament Lamp, and Fluorescent Lamp.

Record Quality: Shows current setting. Options are Auto, High, Medium, and Low.

Exposure: Shows current setting. Choose between Auto, Indoor, and Outdoor.

Space: Shows the remaining recording time in your current settings, until the memory is full.

BROWSER

Browser allows you to select and view eBook, Music, Photos, Playlist, Record, and Video files.

Main Interface



TOOLS

Tools allows access to additional features of your device such as Pedometer, Recorder, Calendar, Calculator, and Stopwatch.

Pedometer

When activated, the built-in Pedometer allows you to keep track of your steps, distance (m), and calories (kcal).

Main Interface



Usage Instructions

- **1.** Touch or the Power button to activate the Pedometer, and again to pause.
- 2. Touch or to alternate between Step, Distance, and Calorie views.

Recorder

Allows you to record and save voice messages.

Main Interface



Usage Instructions

- **1.** Touch or the Power button to start recording, and again to pause. Recording in progress is indicated by .
- 2. Touch or to save the recording.

Access saved recordings in the Browser mode (see page 29).

Calendar

Allows you to view a calendar monthly view.

Main Interface



Usage Instructions

- **1.** Touch on the year, month, or day in the upper box to highlight/select it.
- 2. Touch or to adjust the selected year, month, or day.

Note: Holidays are highlighted in blue.

Calculator

Main Interface




Usage Instructions

Simply touch the buttons as if using a standard calculator.

Stopwatch

Allows you to record multiple stopwatch intervals.

Main Interface



Usage Instructions

- 1. Touch limit to start stopwatch, and touch again to pause.
- 2. Touch later and another stopwatch interval (4 maximum).
- 3. Touch or to reset the stopwatch.

SETTINGS

Settings allows you to adjust various properties of your device such as Bluetooth, Display, Power Saving, Date & Time, etc.

Bluetooth

Connect your Bluetooth wireless listening device

- 1. Select Bluetooth Status and touch On. Additional menu items such as Device Search, Device List, and Bluetooth Device Name will appear on the Bluetooth menu.
- 2. Ensure your headset is in pairing mode and select Device Search from the Bluetooth menu. Touch on your listening device when it appears on screen. The two devices should now be paired and you can listen to audio through your headset.

Notes:

- Only one device may be connected at a time. To pair a different device, first unpair the current one through its Bluetooth settings.
- If for any reason Bluetooth connection is lost, manually reconnect your Bluetooth device.

Unpair your headset

Select Device List from the Bluetooth menu and select the name of your headset. Touch Bluetooth Unpairing to unpair your headset.

Using your device as a Bluetooth transmitter

- **1.** To transmit your MP3 Player's audio to another device such as a car stereo or speaker, follow the above instructions on how to successfully pair the two devices.
- 2. To change how your MP3 Player's name appears on the paired device's LCD screen, navigate to Bluetooth Device Name from the Bluetooth menu and rename your device using the onscreen keyboard and Touch Return.

Notes:

- Bluetooth is a wireless radio technology, which means it is sensitive to objects between the MP3 Player and the connected headset or device.
- The MP3 Player is designed to be used within 33 feet (10 meters) of a connected device, with no major objects in between (walls, etc.).

Display

Backlight Brightness

Select to adjust the screen brightness. 5 is the brightest setting, and will use the most power. Touch < or > to adjust this item.

Backlight

Select to adjust the length of time that the screen will stay lit when left idle. Touch < or > to adjust this item.

Power Saving

Idle Time

Select to adjust the length of time that the device will stay powered on when left idle. Touch < or > to adjust this item.

Sleep Time

Select to adjust the length of time that the device will stay idle before entering sleep mode. Sleep mode allows the device to stay powered on while consuming less power. Touch < or > to adjust this item.

Set Date & Time

Select to adjust the date and time. The time is displayed on most screens of the player.

Set Date

- 1. Touch is to alternate between year, month, or day.
- 2. Touch < or > to adjust the selected year, month, or day field.

Set Time

- 1. Touch is to alternate between selecting hour or minute.
- 2. Touch < or > to adjust the selected hour or minute field.

Language

Select to choose different languages available for the player.

Sync Media Playlist

Select to manually sync your audio playlists.

Advanced

Information

Shows relevant product information such as Firmware Version, Total Memory Space, and Memory Card Capacity.

Select Key Tone

Select to change the desired sound when pressing the power or volume controlbuttons.

Effect Setting

Select to change the visual effect when navigating between screens.

Format Internal Memory

Select to delete all stored content on the device. Make sure to backup any files you want saved before selecting this option.

Format Card

Select to delete all stored content on the memory card. Make sure to backup any files you want saved before selecting this option.

Reset Default Settings

Select to restore the player to factory defaults.

FCC INFORMATION

This warranty shall not apply if the product is modified, tampered with, misused, physically damaged, or subjected to abnormal working conditions (including, but not limited to, electrical, fire, and water damage). THIS WARRANTY DOES NOT GUARANTEE YOU UNINTERRUPTED SERVICE. REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT AS PROVIDED UNDER THIS LIMITED WARRANTY IS THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY OF THE PURCHASER.

To obtain service under this warranty, you must contact our Technical department at 1-866-358-6640 to obtain an RMA number. JLab Audio will only replace or repair product that is sent to us with an authorized RMA number.

Return Merchandise Authorization (RMA)

- **1.** Customers will be charged additional for testing and repackaging when returned "bad" items are found to have no problems or defects.
- **2.** Items found to be out-of-warranty or not belonging to JLab Audio will not be replaced. Instead, they will be returned back to the customer freight-collect.
- **3.** RMAs will be shipped back to customer via UPS ground delivery. Express shipping will be at additional costs to the customer.
- **4.** All RMAs must be accompanied with a copy of original receipt or invoice with name, return address and phone number of customer.

Exchanges

- **1.** Items will not be cross-shipped for any reason.
- 2. The original receipt or invoice must accompany all exchanges.
- **3.** All exchanges must be shipped freight pre-paid by the customer and include a pre-paid shipping label for shipment back to the customer. Furthermore, the customer is expected to insure all items being shipped back. JLab Audio is not responsible for any losses or damages for such equipment.
