

Amplified cordless telephone with answering machine



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IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- 12. Do not use third party charging bays. The battery may be damaged.
- Battery should not be exposed to excessive heat such as bright sunshine or fire and immersed in water.
- 14. For pluggable equipment, the socket-outlet (power adaptor) shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.

2. SET UP THE TELEPHONE

2.1 Package Contents

The package contains the following items:

- 1 Base station
- 1 Cordless handset
- 1 AC power adapter
- 3 NiMH rechargeable battery
- 1 Telephone line cord
- 1 User's manual

2.2 Location


For maximum coverage and reduce the interference, here are some guidelines you should consider when you place the base unit,

- place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential for interference. Try moving the appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.

Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors

2.3 Connect the Corded Base Station



NOTE

Use only the power adapter supplied with the base station.

2.4 Install and Charge the Handset Battery

1. Slide the battery cover downwards.

Install the 3 batteries into the socket as indicated, matching correct polarity (+,-).




- 2. Align the cover flat against the battery compartment, and then slide it upwards until it clicks into place.
 - Charge the handset by placing it face forward in the base. You hear a beep when the handset is charging in the charger
 - 4. Charge the batteries for at least 12 hours when charging for the first time.

NOTES

• Use only the batteries supplied NiMH rechargeable. If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage

In idle mode: Press to access the call list.

In menu mode: Press to scroll up the menu items.

In phonebook list/redial list/call list: Press to scroll up the list.

In editing mode: Press to move the cursor one character to the left. During

a call: Press to increase the listening volume.

6. TALK ON → Speakerphone ■))

In idle/pre-dial mode: Press to make a call in earpiece mode.

In phonebook/redial list/call list: Press to make a call to the selected entry in the

list in earpiece mode.

During ringing: Press to answer a call in earpiece mode.

During a call: Press to make the call in speakerphone mode.

7. DOWN/ PHONEBOOK LIST (*)

In idle mode: Press to access the Phonebook list.

In menu mode: Press to scroll down the menu items.

In phonebook list/redial list/call list: Press to scroll down the list.

In editing mode: Press to move the cursor one character to the right. During

a call: Press to decrease the listening volume.

8. MICROPHONE

9. BOOSTER **→** SOS KEY

During a call: Press to activate/deactivate the BOOSTER function. $\label{eq:booster}$

In idle mode: <u>Press and hold for a second to enter the emergency calling</u> sequence set in your handset.

During the alarm ringing: <u>Press and hold for</u> a second to stop the emergency calling sequence set in your handset.

10. TONE KEY

Press the key to modify the Tonality (treble, standard or bass)

11. INT/MUTE/CLEAR (T)

In main menu mode: Press to go back to idle screen.

In sub-menu mode: Press to go back to previous menu.

editing/pre-dial mode: Press to delete a character/digit.

In editing/pre-dial mode: Press and hold to delete all the characters/digits. During

a call: Press to mute/resume the microphone.

In idle mode: Press to intercom another handset.

12. TALK OFF (**)

During a call: Press to end a call and go back to idle screen. In

In menu/editing mode: Press to go back to idle screen.

13. ALPHANUMERIC KEYPAD, HARSH R# or 0


In predial or editing mode: Press to insert a digit / character / 0/#)

R#) key in idle mode: Press and hold to make a flash.

During a call: Press to answer a new call if you subscribed to Call Waiting service from your service provider.

0 key in idle/pre-dial mode/number editing mode: Press and hold to insert a pause.

3.2 Overview of the Base



1. F/HANDSET LOCATOR

While the phone is idle, press to page all handsets.

2. IN USE

On when handsets are in use, or when the answering system is answering an incoming call.

On when a handset is being registered.

Flashes when there is an incoming call or in page mode.

Flashes when there is another phone on the line on line.

3. PICTURE BUTTONS

10 big picture memory buttons or to dial a phone number from the base.

4. FLASH/PROG □ / R

On line: Press the key to make a recall

In idle mode: Press this key to program the picture memory buttons.

5. MICROPHONE

6. SPEAKER MODE INDICATOR

On when the speaker is on.

7. SPEAKERPHONE KEY ()

NOTE: wait 2 seconds before to dialling the phone number.

8. VOL (🔻)


During speaker mode, press to decrease the speaker volume. **While in idle mode**, press to decrease the base ringer volume.

9. VOL (_____)

While in idle mode, press to increase the base ringer volume. **During speaker mode**, press to increase the speaker volume

3.5 Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming your handset

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by ▲/▼ to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the last character.
- 4. <u>Press and hold</u> **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the entire text string.

4. USE YOUR PHONE

4.1 Make an External Call

4.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Using a handset:

Enter the phone number and press \to dial the number. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** \to clear the entry.

4.1.2 Direct Dialing

Using a handset:

Press \tag{ to take the line, and then dial the phone number.

Using the base:

Press (*) to take the line, and then enter the phone number with the pictures M1 to M9

4.1.3 Call from the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- Press ♥ ▼ to access the phonebook list and press ▲ ▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 2. Press \tag to dial the selected entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.4 Call from the Call List

Using a handset:

1. Press to access the call list.

OR

- 1. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to enter the main menu.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY to enter CALL LOG
- Press▲ ▼ to select the desired call list entry.
- Press to dial the selected call list entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.5 Call from one picture big button memories

Using the base:

To use a picture big button memory in idle mode, press and hold the picture until the LED turns on, on the base.

If you want to pass the number from the base to the handset, lift the handset off the base to take the call.

4.1.6 Call from the Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. Press to access the redial list.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select the desired redial number.
- Press \ to dial the selected redial number. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.7 Call Timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of each call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM: SS).

4.2 Answer a Call

Using a handset:

If the handset is not on the charging cradle or the base station:

When the phone rings, press \infty to answer a call. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

If the handset is on the charging cradle or the base station: When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

4.3 BOOSTER Function

The BOOSTER function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the ear's limited sensitivity.

Using a handset:

To turn on the BOOSTER function:

- Press SOS at any time during a call. "BOOST ON" displays on the handset screen
 and the red LED on the top turns on.
- When the BOOSTER function is activated, press Sos to increase or decrease the earpiece volume.
- The handset top indicator turns on

To turn off the BOOSTER function and return the earpiece volume back to normal:

• Press SOS again and the handset top indicator will turn off.

NOTE:

The audio boost feature will be turned off automatically when the call is ended

4.4 End a Call

Using a handset:

During a call, press / to end the call. OR

Put the cordless handset on the charging cradle to end the call.

Using the base:

Press ■)) to end the call in speakerphone mode

4.5 Adjust Earpiece and Speakerphone Volume

There are 6 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 6) to choose from for each of earpiece and speakerphone volume.

Using a handset: During a call:

Press ▲▼ to select volume 1-6. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

Using the Base:

During a call: Press ▲ /▼ to increase or decrease the speakerphone volume.

4.6 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

Using a handset: During a call:

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** $\overline{\underline{\mathbf{w}}}$ to mute the microphone and "MUTE ON" will be displayed on the handset screen. Your caller cannot hear you. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** $\overline{\underline{\mathbf{w}}}$ again to resume the microphone.

4.7 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called on the cordless. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

4.7.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press to access the redial list.
- Press ▲/▼ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Press \tag{ to dial the selected redial number.}

NOTE:

If there is no number in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

4.7.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** And check the phone number.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to enter the name
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** save

4.7.3 Delete a Redial Number

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY

 and

 To select DELETE.

Press LEFT SOFTKEY to confirm

4.7.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 To select DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** confirm.

Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to reconfirm

4.8 Find the Handset

This feature helps you find the misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset by operation on the base station as below.

• In idle mode, press **ℰ/HANDSETLOCATOR**.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone, and "PAGING" will flash on the screen. You can stop the paging by pressing \(\sqrt{/} / \)

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

4.9 Make an Internal Call

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, it will stop ringing and the calling one will return to standby mode.

4.9.1 Intercom

Using a handset:

- In idle mode, press RIGHT SOFTKEY and the numbers of the registered handsets or base will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Select the desired handset number or base you want to intercom with.
- The called handset or base rings. Press
 on the called handset to establish the internal call or
 on the base.

Using the Handset

If you receive a call on the base in speaker mode, the call is automatically transferred on the handset if the handset is removed from the base.

4.9.2 Call All Handsets

Using a handset:

- In idle mode, press RIGHT SOFTKEY and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Select ALL to ring to all registered handsets.

4.9.3 Transfer an External Call

Using a handset: During

an external call:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 To select INTERCOM.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY to select the desired handset you want to intercom with.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and the external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- 4. Press \(^\) on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- Press on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- 6. The external call is transferred to the called handset.

4.9.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with the base and cordless handset or two cordless handsets. The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

Using a handset: During

the external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.9.3.
- Press and hold

 → on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

NOTE:

Any party (corded base or cordless handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call

5 PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebooks in the cordless handset and the telephone base with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

Using a handset: In

idle:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY to select ALL.
- 2. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to access the phonebook list.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to select **ADD**.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the number.
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the name.
- 6. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to store the phonebook entry.

5.2 Search for a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

- Enter the phonebook list by press the key □▼
- 2. Enter the first character of your desired name of the phonebook entries by multitab.

5.3 View a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset: In

idle:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- 2. Press▲▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 ▼ to select VIEW.

5.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset: In

idle:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- Press▲▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and the current contents of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- Edit the number and press LEFT SOFTKEY .
- 6. Edit the name and press **LEFT SOFTKEY** ...
- 7. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** confirm the setting.

Note: Use the RIGHT SOFTKEY (to delete a character or an digit.

5.5 Delete a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset: In

idle:

- Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- 2. Press $extbf{ iny}$ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY

5.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

Using a handset:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 ▼ to select STATUS.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY , the display shows "XX/50" (XX refer to the number of phonebook entries).
- 4. Press RIGHT SOFTKEY or fo EXIT.

5.8 Set the Speed Dial Numbers

After setting the speed dial numbers, you can dial to the pre-set numbers by pressing and holding the respective digit keys from idle mode.

5.8.1 Add or Edit the Speed Dial Number

Using a handset:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 To select PHONEBOOK.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲▼ to select from KEY 1 to KEY 9.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and select **ADD**.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and enter the NUMBER.
- 6. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the NAME.
- 7. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to save

Or if there is already a number stored in the selected key:

- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and modify the NUMBER with the RIGHT SOFTKEY
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and modify the NAME with the RIGHT SOFTKEY.

- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** save.

5.9.2 View the VIP list

Using a handset:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲ ▼ to select VIEW.

5.9.4 Status of the VIP

Using a handset:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and to select PHONEBOOK.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 to select VIP.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲▼ to select STATUS.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY to confirm The display shows "XX/50" (XX refer to the number of VIP entries)
- 5. Press RIGHT SOFTKEY or fo EXIT.

6 CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your network service provider. Your phone can store up to 20 received calls on the cordless handset with date/time information in the call list. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonehook, the caller's name stored

matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed with the number. The phone will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "UNAVAIL" will be displayed.

If the call is an international call or with unknown number, "OUT OF AREA" will be displayed.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 NEW CALLS" will be displayed.

6.1 View the Call List

All unanswered calls are saved in calls log with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with \bigstar icon.

13.1 Switching Answering Machine On/Off

- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM LANG.
- Press MENU/OK and ▲▼ to select the desired voice prompt language for the answering machine and SOS message.

13.5.7 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base. When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

14. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you have difficulty with your phone, please try the suggestions listed below.

Problem	Solutions	
My telephone does not work at all.	 Make sure the battery is installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use. Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet not controlled by a wall switch. Make sure the telephone line cord is plugged firmly into the telephone base and the telephone wall jack. Unplug the electrical power to the telephone base. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in. Allow up to one minute for the handset and telephone base to synchronize. Remove and re-insert the battery. If that still does not work, it might be necessary to purchase a new battery. Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a working telephone. If the other telephone does not work, the problem is probably in the wiring or the telephone service. Call your telephone service provider. 	
Low battery shows on screen.	 Place the handset in the telephone base for recharging. Remove and re-install the battery and use it until fully depleted, then recharge the handset in the telephone base. If the above measures do not solve the problem, replace the battery. 	
The battery do not charge in the handset or the handset battery do not accept charge.	 Make sure the handset is placed in the telephone base correctly. Remove and reinstall the battery, then charge for up to 16 hours. Purchase a new battery. 	

There is interference during a telephone conversation. My calls fade out when I am using the handset.

- The handset may be out of range. Move it closer to the telephone base.
- If you subscribe to high-speed Internet service (digital subscriber line DSL) through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone base and the telephone wall jack. The filter prevents noise and caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. Please contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filters.
- Appliances or other cordless telephones plugged into the same circuit as the telephone base can cause interference
- Try moving the appliance or telephone base to another outlet.
- Other electronic products may cause interference to your cordless telephone. Install your telephone as far away as possible from the following electronic devices: wireless routers, radios, radio towers, pager towers, cellular telephones, digital telephones, intercoms, room monitors, televisions, VCRs, personal computers, kitchen appliances, and other cordless telephones.
- If your telephone is plugged in with a modem or a surge protector, plug the telephone (or modem/surge protector) into a different location. If this doesn't solve the problem, re-locate your telephone or modem farther apart from each other, or use a different surge protector.
- The location of your telephone base can impact the performance of your cordless phone. For better reception, install the telephone base in a centralized location within your home or office, away from walls or other obstructions. In many environments, elevating the telephone base improves overall performance.
- Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a corded telephone. If calls are still not clear, the problem is probably in the wiring or telephone service.
- Contact your telephone service provider (charges might apply).
- If the other telephones in your home are having the same problem, the problem is in the wiring or telephone service.

Common cure for electronic equipment.

If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):

- Disconnect the power to the telephone base.
- Disconnect the batteries on the handset.
- Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone hase
- Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.
- Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base.
 Allow up to one minute for this to take place.

This telephone is not equipped with a grounding function! Therefore some of the functions may be limited when used in PBX systems.
