Know Before You Go:

Important information including recommended attire and tour details:

- Tour is held at the BackedByBees Retail location on 6214 Appleby Line, Burlington.
- Please plan to **arrive 15 minutes prior** to the tour start time and check-in at the retail counter. You will be required to sign a waiver form.
- You will be around live honey bees. Stinging is always a possibility. You will have the option to get
 as close or stay as far as you would like from the colony. Our staff have epipens available if
 needed.
- Wear closed toed shoes and well fitted clothing. You will be walking on a wood-chip path and will be outdoors for the entire tour.
- It is encouraged for individuals with long hair to wear it tied up and back
- Protective equipment will be available for anyone who wishes to wear it.
- Also, best to avoid bananas on the day of the experience...any idea why? Make sure you ask the beekeeper!
