


Ending Sound Find & Color

These worksheets provide two ways for kids to practice sentence structure: sentence building and sentence practice. For August, the focus is on capitalization and punctuation.



Print, cut, and laminate these cards, then let your students practice sorting by number of syllables. Then, have them record their answers on the form.







Find The Pair Word Families


Kids will sort the pictures into cards by word family. This could be also played as memory or go fish! After all pairs are made, students can record their answers. Differentiated cards included.





Students will piece together three piece puzzles: onset, rime, and matching picture. Once all puzzles are completed, they can fill in the recording form with the words.


















































Choose which reader you would like to print: the reader *without* pictures, the reader *with* pictures in black and white, or the reader *with* pictures in color.





