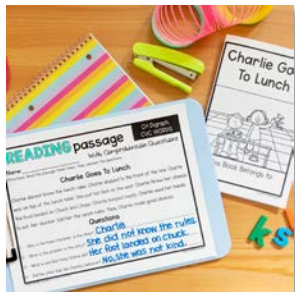

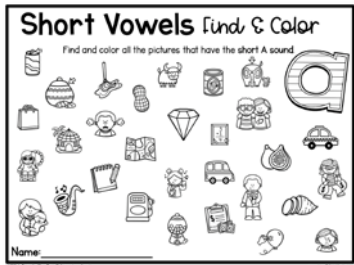
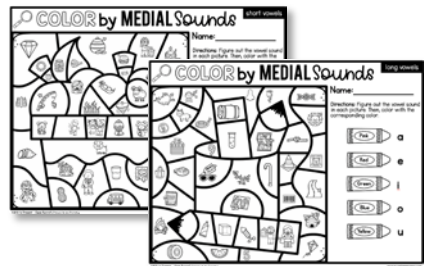

Color By Medial Sound

Kids will enjoy coloring these fun, mystery pictures that are revealed as they color. They will look at the picture and color each space to correspond to the medial vowel sound. Long and short vowel options are included.



Short Vowel Find & Color

Use these worksheets to practice identifying and isolating the medial short vowel sound of CVC words. Students will love looking through a page of fun pictures to find the ones that have a specific sound!

Sentence Work

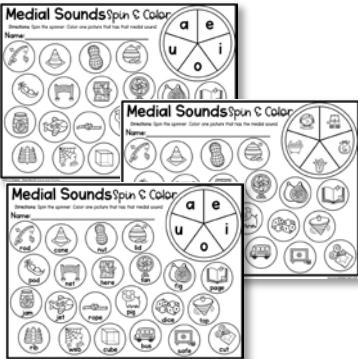
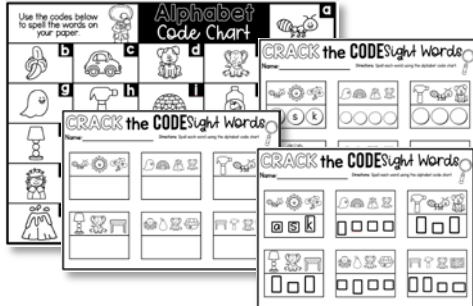
These worksheets provide two ways for kids to practice sentence structure: sentence building and sentence practice. For September, the focus is on the capitalization of the first word and proper nouns.

Kids will love using their Alphabet Code Chart to crack the code for the mystery sight words. The recording sheet is provided at three levels to support all students!

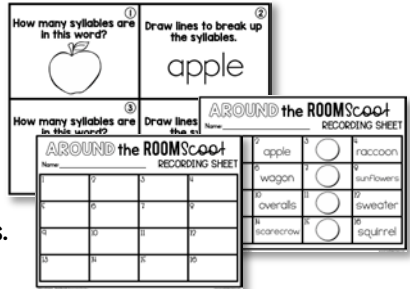


Medial Sounds Spin & Color

Kids will spin the spinner and find a word that contains the same medial sound as that word. Great for literacy centers, word work, or small groups. Multiple versions make differentiation a breeze!

Around The Room Scoot

Get students out of their chairs and moving around the room as they search for picture cards and practice breaking words into syllables. Differentiated recording sheets are provided!

Print, cut, and laminate these cards, then let your students practice sorting by the medial vowel. Then, have them record their answers on the form.

Find The Pair CVCe Words

Kids will sort the pictures into cards by CVCe ending. This could be also played as memory or go fish! After all pairs are made, students can record their answers. Differentiated cards included.

Students will piece together four piece puzzles: three sounds and a picture. Once all puzzles are completed, they can fill in the recording form with the words.

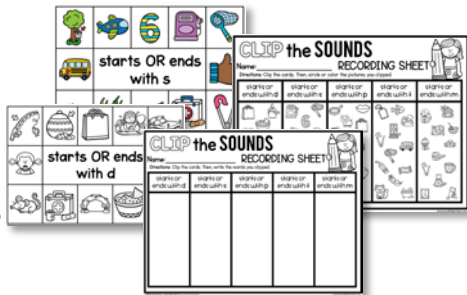

Kids will love this hands-on building center where they can trace, write, and build words that start with CH. Building materials could include tiles, magnets, play doh, or any other classroom materials!

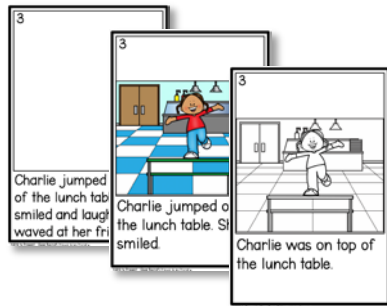
Word Family Task Cards

Decodable Reader

Kids can practice decoding CVC words and reading sight words in the decodable reader (3 levels included). There are 3 versions provided for each: one with black and white illustrations, one with color, and one with just text so students can add their own illustrations.

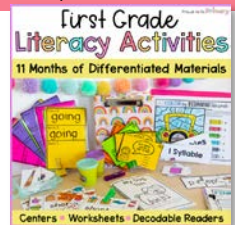
