#### 44 Class Rules Cards



#### Rule Explanation Posters



#### Bulletin Board Headers & Posters


Bulletin board letters, headers, and posters are included to help you create an area that works best for your classroom space and your students. There are black & white versions available, as well as color.





### "We Follow the Rules" Storybook



#### **Writing Templates**



Use the class rules sort to allow your students to discuss the difference between "yes" choices and "no" choices. This activity can be completed independently or with partners.






#### Different Ways to Display Your Rules




Set up your class rules space on a bulletin board or white board to make it easy for you to change and for students to read as needed.
