






Posters

Use the word cards for pocket chart activities, sorting activities, or to post on a word wall during phonics activities. The cards can also be posted around the room and used for the read & write the room activity. These also work well hole-punched and hung on a ring for use during your small group activities.

#### **Home Practice Lists**

A list of words can be printed and used to guide instruction in class or at home. Send the list home at the start of the week to help families with home learning.

#### **Assessment Sticker Book**

A sticker book is provided to check retention of words after a set of words have been taught. Kids can read the words in the sticker book and put a sticker next to the words they read correctly.





Read, Draw, & Color Books Print a mini book for each child to practice reading the sentence, tracing the words, drawing a picture to match, and then coloring the picture after. Great to send home for extra practice!






#### Read, Trace, Draw Mini Books

Two types of mini-books are included. Each require kids to cut and put together. Kids read and trace the ending digraph words, then draw pictures or color the provided pictures.

Read & Write the Room Students use the mini-book to read and write words from around the room, from each digraph. Use the word/picture cards provided to post around the room for students to find, read, and write.





Fill-In's

Kids use the word list at the bottom of the page as a guide to help them figure out which words go in each spot. They need to read the sentences and print the missing words on the lines.

#### **Digraph Sentences**

#### Word Work

#### List Sheets

A sheet for each digraph is provided. Choose the sheets you would like children to practice and create a booklet. They list the words for a digraph independently or copy after coming up with a class list of words.

#### Word Searches

In this fun favorite, kids will search for words that end with a certain digraph and circle it after. To keep track, they can cross of the words in the word bank.





Color by Digraph

Kids will enjoy coloring these fun, mystery pictures that are revealed as they color. They will read the words and color them to correspond to the color key provided.





#### Spin & Cover

Print and laminate for kids to use to practice identifying beginning blends. Kids will spin the spinner and find a word that end with that digrapg. Great for literacy centers, word work, or small groups. The black & white option is perfect for coloring!

## Fill In The Digraph

Kids can practice identifying the missing blend with these mixed digraph activities. Kids will look at the picture and fill in the last two or three letters to complete the word.

Playdough Mats

Print and laminate for durability, or put inside a plastic pocket protector. Kids use playdough to form different letters to form words with the provided word part. After, they write down the words they created, using a dry-erase marker.






### Tie Crafts

Trace and color in the word patterns at the top, fill in the letter boxes (to form ending digraph words), and color pictures. Instructions with pictures on how to make a necktie are included.

#### Hat Crafts


Trace and color in the word pattern on the hat, then color pictures to match the digraph and glue them around the strip. Instructions with pictures on how to make a hat are included.




# Centers Fill In The Digraph

Ending Digraph

Kids practice identifying the missing digraph with this mixed digraph activity. Kids will look at the picture and fill in the ending letters to complete the word. Cut the cards and place in a small container for an on-the-go center!





#### **Spell the Picture Cards**

Print and laminate for kids to use to practice spelling. They can use a dry-erase marker to add the ending digraph for the picture. They can also use letter magnets or tiles to spell the words. Great for literacy centers, word work, or small groups.

Two Types of Puzzles Kids can practice reading words and finding the corresponding picture and putting them together. They can also practice segmenting words and digraph sounds together with the picture puzzles.
