

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SIGHT WORDLISTS

Post this list near your desk to stay organized and on track. It has all 10 units listed. Great also to send home to parents so they may keep track at home!





HOMEPRACTICELISTS

Photocopy and send home one sheet per student each week for home practice. Also great to give to students in class to copy in their word books.

SIGHT WORD CARDS

Print on cardstock, laminate and cut for durability. Post on your board for practice during the week and then add to your word wall at the end of the week for read the room activities.



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RAINBOW WORDCARDS

Copy a set for each student to cut, color and read 3 times for practice. Keep all the words from each week in a small ziplock. At the end of 10 units have them read all the words in their bags for assessment then send home as review.





READ&TRACEMINIBOOKS

First print, cut along the lines and assemble the pages in order. Kids can use this too! They must then read each page and trace the sight words on the dotted lines. They can color after. It is great to send home for practice!

READ, DRAW & COLOR BOOKS

These books are great for reading practice. To prepare, cut in half to make 2 booklets. Students must read the sentences, color the sight words and draw a picture to match the sentences. It is great to send home for practice after!



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WORD WORK

Use this as a literacy or word work station. Great also for fast finishers! Students must trace the word first, then stamp it, then write it in fancy letters of their choice.





FIND&COLORBY SIGHT WORD

Use a magnifying glass to locate sight words in the picture. Then use the key at the bottom right corner as a guide. Students must read the words and color them correctly according to the key. Great also for coloring practice!

FIND&HIGHLIGHT

Have students use a highlighter pen to read each sentence and look for the words in their word list. When they find a word, they can go over it with a highlighter. Then draw a picture of one of the sentences. Lots of fun!



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PRINTING PRACTICE

These sheets are great for practicing printing skills, building fine motor abilities and proper letter formation. Students practice each word four or more times, copy a sentence and draw a picture to match the sentence.





FIX-IT & FILL-INS

Students use the word list at the bottom of the page as a guide to help them figure out which words go in each spot. Read the sentences and print the missing word on the line. Fix the mistakes in the sentences at the bottom and re-write them correctly.

LETTERBOXES

Fill the letterboxes with the correct fitting words from the word list. Make sure students understand tall, short and tail letters and how they fit into boxes. There is also a sentence to read and fill in with the correct words. Great for building an understanding of letter formation.





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PLAYDOUGH MATS

Print on cardstock, laminate & cut! Put into a bin with some Play-Doh and a whiteboard marker. Students can practice forming the words with Play-Doh and can use the marker to print the word on the line below.





SIGHT WORDBRACELETS

Print off one bracelet for each student. They must first trace and color each sight word. Then attach the bracelet on their wrist and practice reading their words to a partner or teacher.

ABCORDER MINIBOOK

Students use the word list given to practice putting the words into ABC order. Create a half mini book for each student with a page for each unit.



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WORDSEARCH

Students will love to locate their weekly sight words in this fun word search. They must find each word 2–6 times and must keep a tally at the bottom of the page each time they find a word. This is great practice at reading sight words!





SENTENCESCRAMBLES

Have your students first cut the sentence pieces along the dotted lines at the bottom of the page. They must then cut each word and try to unscramble the words to make a sentence that makes sense. Then they must glue the pieces in the correct order in the space provided, rewrite the correct sentence and draw a picture to match!

SPELLING BOOKS

This student booklet is similar to the sticker book but it can be used to assess the students. There is a front cover to keep track of which lists have been assessed. Each page within the booklet includes lines for the students to spell their sight words!





STICKER BOOKS

This student booklet can be used as a way for both you and your students to keep track of what words and lists they've mastered! The students can track which lists they've mastered on the front cover and then mark which words they've mastered within each individual list.


