



Glass That Sees Far, bronze ed. of 30, 20 x 15 x 10 inches, \$7,000

As the European settlers traveled farther westward, encounters with many different Native American tribes was inevitable. Trading between the white-men and some tribal cultures was friendly and profitable for both groups. However, there often were skirmishes between these cultures, as both did not want to concede any encroachment onto what they each considered their lands; either Whites, Mexicans or Indians.

Whether through trading or capturing trophies from war, a major find was the spy glass. This sculpture shows a Southern Comanche as a sentinel on a high point watching his back trail with his trophy, the "glass that sees far".



High Noon, bronze ed. of 30, 32 x 15 x 16 inches, \$10,000

In the American Wild West law and order was needed to make settlements safe and secure for the farmers, ranchers, storekeepers, miners etc. There were local Sheriffs, but whenever extremely dangerous murderers, bank robbers, or horse thieves began terrorizing the towns, a United States Marshall or his Deputy were sent to establish peace, and secure safety again. Here Nebeker portrays a US Deputy Marshall "loaded for bear" with an historic 1880's Stagecoach Shotgun, and two pistols as he waits for a known outlaw who is heard to be coming into town on the noon train.



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
