Before you begin: Confirm scale of printed paper

Before you print, make sure that Page Scaling is set to "None" in your print dialog options. Measure the bar below after printing—it must be exactly 1 inch.

Method 1: Print & cut ring sizer


1. Carefully cut out the ring sizer strip below. Be sure to make a small slit in the end for the ruler to slide through (see arrow).

- 2. Wrap the sizer around your finger with the numbers facing out and slide the pointed end through the slit.
- 3. For an accurate measurement, pull the sizer tight over the widest part of your finger (typically, the

knuckle). The fit should be snug, but comfortable.


4. Read the number that lines up next to the slit. This is your ring size!

TIP: Apply a piece of tape along the entire strip to add durability.



Method 2: Measure an existing ring

- 1. Choose a ring that fits the desired finger.
- 2. Place the ring over the circles below. Match the inside edge of the ring with the closest circle. This is the inside diameter of the ring.
- 3. If the ring falls between two sizes, select the larger size.



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
