

GG, an abandoned pit bull mix, struggles to survive on the unforgiving streets of Detroit. Frightened, starving, sick, and ignored, GG knows her luck is running out. By chance, on May 20, 2009, one woman notices GG and sees in her eyes an animal longing to be loved.

The woman takes GG to a local shelter for physical and emotional recovery. For the first time, GG has hope for a better future. Soon after she arrives at the shelter. however, things take a horrible turn for the worse. Suddenly, GG finds herself sick and on the brink of death. And, the shelter staff says that it will be impossible to find her a home because of her "street" behavior. GG fears that she may never be healthy, get out of the shelter alive, or have a loving family.

Cheryl Phillips is a passionate animal advocate, and active volunteer, her love for animals began when she spent time on her great-grandparents' dairy

farm in Rochester, Michigan as a young girl. It was there she learned by example to respect and have compassion for all living creatures.

Today, she volunteers evenings and weekends for TNR (trap, neuter, return) and animal rescue. She also assists colony caretakers. Phillips rescues include cats, dogs, turtles, opossum, and birds and even helped her sister to save an abandoned Amelanistic Corn Snake. He found a home at the Great Lakes Zoological Society in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Phillips has previously held the positions of Vice President, Masco Corporation Foundation and Director Global Purchasing for Masco Corporation, a Fortune 250 Corporation with annual sales of more than \$8 billion. She received a Bachelor of Science Degree in business from Madonna University and her MBA from Eastern Michigan University.

Cheryl started her career in operations and directed global contracts covering various commodities, products, and services with annual purchases exceeding \$4 billion.

On a part-time basis, Cheryl conducts management seminars and lectures. She has held events for Madonna University, The Detroit Legal Association, the NAPM-Metro Detroit and NAPM-Memphis. Tennessee. She has lectured at Walsh College, Wayne State University, University of Michigan-Dearborn and Michigan State University for Masco's Leadership Program, and held the position of adjunct professor at the University of Michigan-Dearborn teaching **Supply Chain Logistics** Management, Strategic Sourcing, and Operations Management.

In 2003 she joined Beaumont Health (Oakwood Healthcare, Inc.) Foundation Board of Trustees and chaired the Stewardship


