Hi Amy, thanks, I was just sending that to you as an FYI. The Mayo Clinic tests for those glucocorticoids at .10mcg/dl, which equals 1ng/ml. WADA tests at 30 ng/ml.(found that on their website somewhere) So the Mayo Clinic is much more sensitive. I pass this on in case someone in the future is faced with a similar situation where they have used a medication permitted out of competition and want to make sure it's out of their system. This might prevent an accident where someone was not looking to cheat but it was impossible to get a definitive answer as in this case. Thanks for all your help. I realize your hands are tied in what you can say and I appreciate you're giving me as much guidance as you could. Have a great day! -Alberto
