

6. Journey through Burgundy – CI\$250

What's the differences between Cote de Nuit and Côte de Beaune? Not too sure? One way to find out, taste through 5 AOC's and see how different Chardonnay and Pinot change and evolve due to its terroir.

Wines included in Journey through Burgundy:

Alain Geoffroy, Chablis Premier Cru, France 2016

A racy wine, with a stoney minerality and a citrus forward nose; classic Chablis. Bright and fresh leaving your mouth watering for more, green apples, lemon peel and grapefruit dominating the palate.

Bouchard Pere & Fils, Meursault Genevrieres, Premier Cru 2015

A rich and creamy wine, featuring peach, citrus, honey and spice aromas following through to a mineral driven palate. Balanced and expressive, with a length leaving hints of orange rind.

Jean-Luc Joillot, Pommard 2017

Black cherries, red fruits and fresh mushroom pronounced on the nose. Soft, silky tannins and an earthy minerality, this is a medium bodied, yet elegant pinot with a fresh acidity.

Henri Boillot, Volnay 1er Cru Les Chevrets 2014

A fleshy, fresh fruit driven premier cru, with ripe red and black fruit and oak on the nose. Following through to a juicy refined palate, with integrated tannins and a fresh crunchy minerality.

Joseph Drouhin, Nuit-Saint-Georges, Proces 1er Cru, 2014

The aromas are as intense, but elegant. Red fruits such as cherries sit alongside gamey notes with hints of cedar. On the palate, the wine displays are fresh with structure and a velvety texture. Fruit and spice both linger on the palate.
