# Quick Start Adjustment Guide

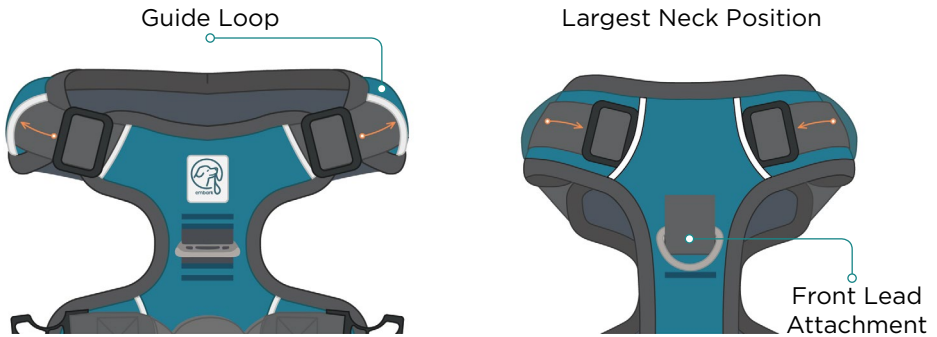
Before your first walk, it's important to make sure the harness is adjusted correctly. The correct fit should be snug, but not too tight that it causes chafing. You should be able to fit two fingers under the harness after it's adjusted correctly.

## 1. Extend Straps - Make Harness Bigger

To get the best fit, we recommend extending straps to its maximum length first then tightening to correct fit.

### Neck Straps

- Pull the neck slider away from the logo bringing it closer to the front lead attachment point.
- + Do this by holding the strap in one hand and moving the slider with the other.
- Ensure you slide through the guide loop if needed.
- Repeat for second strap.



### Chest Straps

- Unbuckle the chest strap.
- Move the slider towards the buckle leaving 1 inch of gap between buckle and slider for easy adjustment later.
- + To ensure maximum extension, there should be no excess strap coming from slider. Please see below.
- Repeat on second strap.



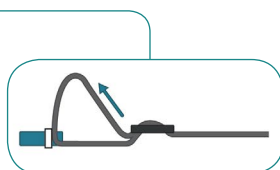

## 2. Tighten Straps - Make Harness Smaller

Test on your dog to gauge adjustment. Logo should be on your dogs back. Tighten accordingly.

### Neck Straps

- Pull sliders towards logo.
- Pull through the guide loop if required.
- Repeat on second strap



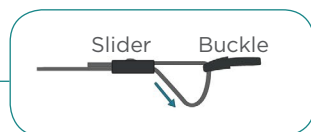
Side View

### Chest Straps

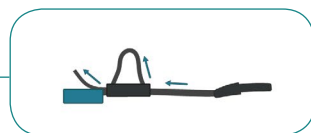
- Hold the slider with one hand & pull down on the strap as per below.
- Adjust until reduced to size and repeat on second strap.

### Chest Strap Minimum Position

- If you need to go smaller, push the strap through the slider as below to reach minimum size.

Try it on your dog to see how it fits & make **additional adjustments** if necessary.



## How to use Front Leash Attachment for No Pull Training

Our front leash attachment is designed for people who want to do no-pull training with their dog. If your dog does not pull, we would recommend using the back leash attachment.



### The Right Incentives

Before we start, make sure that you have something to reward your dog. The best way to train your dog is through his stomach, so bring along plenty of tasty treats, and only use these after your dog has done the correct behavior. Verbal cues like “good” and “yes” will also help him remember.



### Start in a Familiar Environment

Often, when your dog pulls, it's because he gets too excited. There are simply too many wonderful things that he wants to explore, so when you are just starting training, start in a location that he is already very familiar with and wait until he's gotten over his initial excitement of doing something new.





## Using the Front Attachment Point

Attach the leash to the front D ring. When you start walking with your dog, hold one section of the leash with the hand closer to your dog, and the end of the leash (where the loop is) with your other hand.

Say “let’s go” or a similar verbal command, and if he is walking next to you with a loose leash, reward him with a treat. However, as your dog starts walking ahead of you and you feel tension on the hand closer to your dog, give him a warning verbal cue like “careful.” Once he reaches the end of the leash and is pulling, tell him “no” and turn around to walk in the other direction.

Because the leash is attached to the front of the harness, and you have turned around, this should also cause your dog to turn around. You

will now be in front of your dog. Walk slowly so he can catch up to you, and again, when he is walking by your side without tension in the leash, give him a treat and a positive verbal cue. Continue to give him treats as he is walking by your side.

If your dog continues to pull, make sure that you don’t follow him and allow him to pull you. If you do so, you are basically telling him that by pulling, he can get what he wants. Stay grounded, turn around, and start walking the other way.

Repeat the process if he starts walking ahead of you or starts pulling again. Be sure to use the same verbal cues in a similar pitch and tone, so that over time, he will learn what these cues mean.

## Practice, Practice, Practice

With any new skill, it will take your dog a bit of time to learn, but with persistence and consistency, your hard work will pay off. If your dog has hearing problems, be sure to adjust with hand signals or other cues so you can communicate effectively with your dog. Dogs do learn at different speeds, so be sure to be consistent and stick to the training.
