

# FIND YOUR RING SIZE

#### First - Take these steps for an accurate measurement




1. Before printing this guide, make sure your printer paper size is set to US Letter and page scaling is set to either 100% or "none".

2. Measure the line on the left to ensure it's exactly 2 inches. No ruler? No problem, place your credit card on the bottom line and check that it fits exactly inside the lines.

3. If the measurement is accurate, you're good to go! If not, double check your printer settings to make sure you're printing full size.

## **Option 1 - Measure by matching an existing ring**

- 1. Choose a ring from your existing collection that fits your desired finger well.
- Place the ring over the circles below. Match the inside edges of the ring to the closest fitting circle. You should only see the white space + black outline inside - no color.
- 3. If the ring falls inbetween two sizes, we recommend going with the larger size.



### **Option 2 - Paper Sizer**

- 1. Carefully cut out the paper sizer below. Make a small slit on the line indicated.
- 2. Wrap the sizer around your finger with the numbers facing out and slide the rounded tip through the slit you made.
- 3. For the best accuracy, pull the sizer tight over the widest part of your finger. \*This may be your knuckle.
- 4. Read the number that lines up to the slit, that's your size!

**PRO TIP** - Measure your finger later in the day when it's at its largest (has had time for natural swelling to occur.) Avoid measuring when you're cold as that will effect your finger size too.

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
