Baskets for collecting

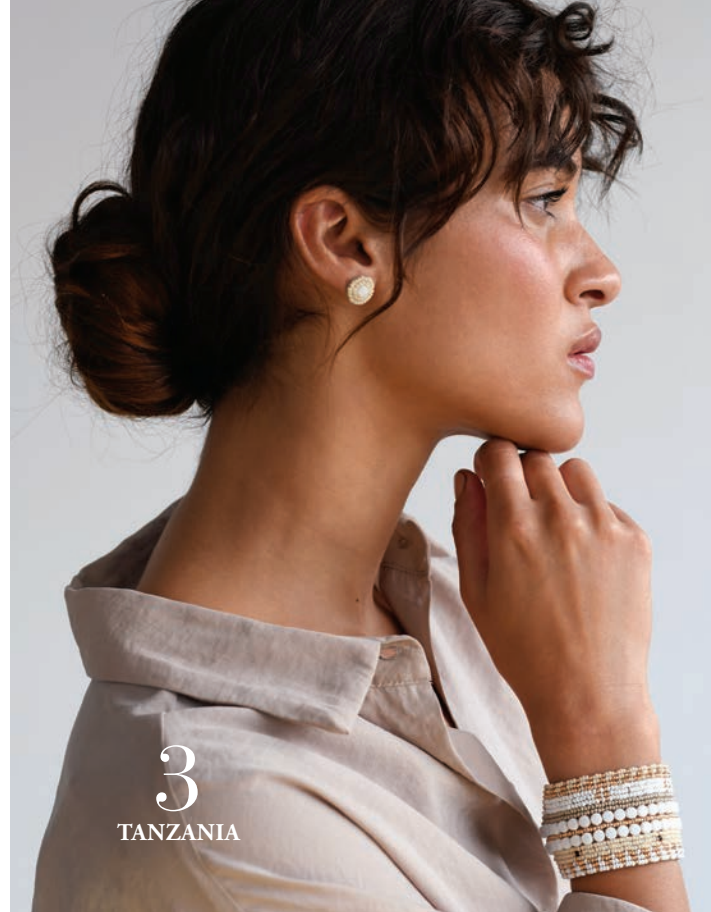

Sidai Designs works with Maasai women in Tanzania to produce and market unique, hand-made, high-end beaded jewelry using traditional techniques. By bringing these products to international markets, they help preserve beading traditions and economically sustain the artisans and their families.



Candles for giving

The gift of a candle can also bring light and hope to its makers. Prosperity Catalyst creates beautifully designed, ceramic candle vessels, that are handmade in Turkey and sent to Iraq to have the wax poured by women in need of jobs. They also work with artisans in Haiti to craft hand-carved river stone and metal votive holders with beeswax candle inserts, handmade by a local women's cooperative.
