MAN ON FIRE

With covetable new collections of lighting, rugs, hardware and more, indefatigable L.A.-based designer Martyn Lawrence Bullard is, well, "haute" than ever.

Some California designers need no introduction, and *the* Martyn Lawrence Bullard (martynlawrencebullard.com) is one of them. From his West Hollywood atelier, Bullard not only spearheads myriad residential projects for A-listers—he's currently working on a home for Kylie Jenner—but also designs for venerable firms like Schumacher, Ann Sacks, Haviland, Christofle and Daum. And that's hardly all. This year, Bullard launches two new enterprises, a collection for The Rug Company that pays homage to Palm Springs architecture (including icons like famously pink Marrakesh Country Club) and art deco-style bathroom fittings for French firm Cristal et Bronze. He also recently debuted a collaboration with Corbett Lighting that includes an incredible 40 pieces—a number even the tireless designer admits is a lot. "They really let me go for it, though they were a bit shocked when they saw how many I'd done," he admits of his wood, brass, bronze and blown-glass collection. He's even branched out into jewelry design with a new line of signed rings. "Selling antique jewelry pieces put me through college, so this new work is really about things coming full circle. Jewelry, fashion, interiors—it all flows into one," he says.

Bullard has no plans to slow down, either. In the pipeline is his design of Four Seasons Hotel Los Angeles' new private residences, set to open in 2020, with still more projects in the works. "We do so many different things. We do absolutely everything!" he quips. So true.
