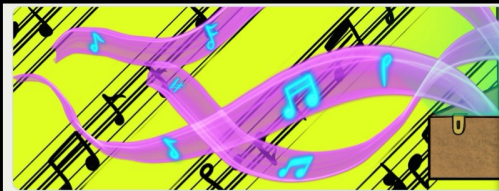

Comprehension and Analysis:

- So far, this book makes me feel sad and intrigued at the same time. I am sad because this young, ten year old kid seems to have gone through a lot of hardship in his life. I am intrigued because he seems clever and amusing, and I am interested to know what happens to him next.
- First, I know that Bud has lived in a lot of different places since he was six years old. He has been in a boys' home and has also been in and out of several foster homes. The text on page 3 says, "This was the third foster home I was going to and I'm used to packing up and leaving." Second, I know that Bud is brave and willing to defend himself. On page 13, the text says, "I wasn't about to let anybody call me Buddy and stick a pencil up my nose."
- The Amos family says that they will send Bud back to the home because Todd Amos lies to his mother. Todd says that he was only trying to wake Bud up to make sure he didn't wet the bed when Bud began hitting him. Mrs. Amos tells Bud that he can't be trusted, so she can't keep him.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR *Google Forms* COMPREHENSION & VOCABULARY CHECKS

1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the resources to transfer into.

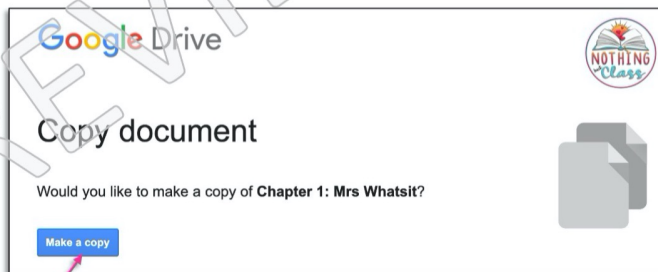
