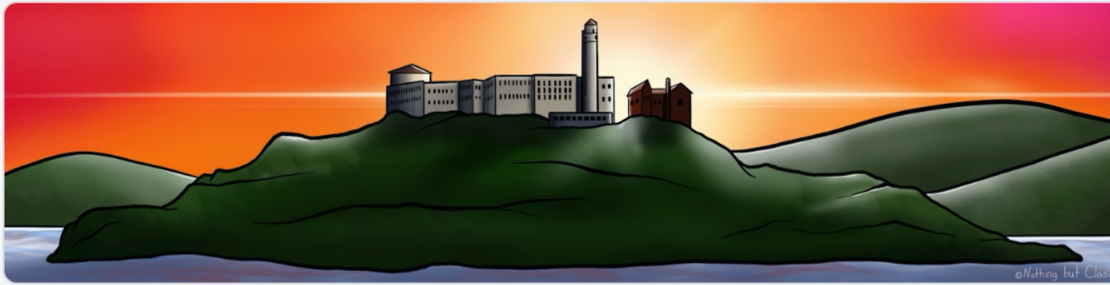

17. They have to move to Alcatraz because they want Natalie to go to Esther P. Marinoff School, which is near Alcatraz Island. Moose's father got a job on Alcatraz so it makes sense for the whole family to move to stay together. Moose is miserable. He wants to stay in Santa Monica, and he doesn't like the changes. He feels isolated from his old life and from his old friends, and he is also a little frightened at being on an island with a bunch of dangerous criminals.
18. Example answer for *a*. *Moose's mom begins teaching piano lessons to make extra money.* This means that Moose will be responsible for watching Natalie most days after school. This also means Moose won't be able to play baseball with his new friends at school.
19. Moose struggles for several reasons. He struggles because he has just moved to a new place, and he feels lost, isolated, and unhappy. He also struggles because so much of the responsibility for Natalie falls on him, and he feels so burdened with it. He feels that it is unfair, but at the same time, he is conflicted, because he cares deeply for Natalie; it's just that he also wants to be a regular kid.
20. Carrie Kelly is a woman who is helping Natalie get better prepared for Esther P. Marinoff School. Some advice she gives to Moose's mother is that not only does Natalie need to change, but everybody in their family needs to change. She says that Natalie should not count, rock, or play with her buttons.

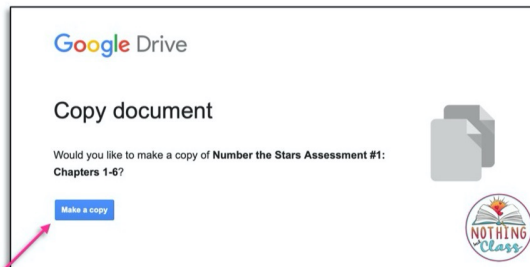
- The following instructions are for accessing the convenient, self-grading assessments that can only be used on Google.

- If you do not wish to use this version of the assessments, you have two other choices. You can use the Google Slides version, which contains text boxes for students to type into and is not self-grading, OR you may use the black and white printable version.
- All assessments are mirrors of one another as far as content is concerned, they are just given to you in different formats so you may choose which is best for you. (When you purchased this product, you would have downloaded multiple PDFs. Please see the other PDFs for the other formats.)

1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). In order to share the tests out with your students, your students will either need their own Google accounts with accompanying e-mail addresses OR you will need to have Google Classroom. Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the assessments to transfer into.
