Comprehension and Analysis:

1. On the one hand, Percy is homesick and wants to be with his mom in their apartment, so he is glad to be kicked out of Yancy. On the other hand, Percy knows he will miss Yancy. He will miss the view out of his dorm window and his good friend, Grover.
2. Percy hears Grover telling Mr. Brunner that he is worried about him. He hears Grover say that he doesn't want to fail again, and he hears them talk about Kindly Ones and the summer solstice. I think they must be talking about the fact that Percy is a half-blood. (Answers to the second question will vary.)
3. Grover acts very disturbed and flustered when he and Percy see the three old ladies. The text on page 26 says, "I looked over at Grover to say something about this and saw that the blood had drained from his face. His nose was twitching." He insists to Percy that they return to the bus, and then he mutters odd things to himself like, "This is not happening."

Beyond: First, Percy gets into a lot of trouble at school. Second Percy overhears a strange conversation between Mr. Brunner and Grover. Third Grover and Percy see strange ladies at the fruit-stand. Fourth, Grover acts very worried that one of the ladies snipped a yarn.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR *Google Forms* COMPREHENSION & VOCABULARY CHECKS

1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). In order to share the resources out with your students, your students will either need their own Google accounts with accompanying e-mail addresses OR you will need to have Google Classroom. Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the resources to transfer into.

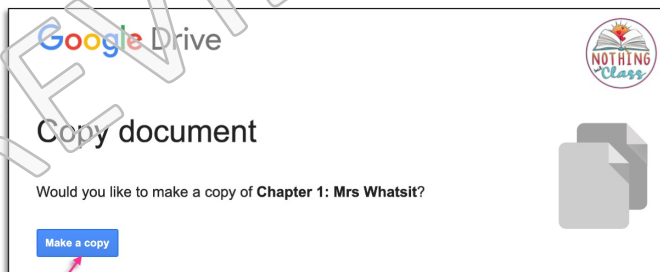
