

Comprehension and Analysis:

- I. My favorite character so far is Lucy. She is a kind, gentle, and curious girl. I like her because even though Mr. Tumnus originally had harmful intentions towards her, she was very understanding and quick to forgive. (Answers will vary.)
- 2. After Lucy gets to Narnia, she meets a faun named Mr. Tumnus. Mr. Tumnus invites her to his home. There, he serves her food and tells her many stories. After hours of conversation, he confesses that he means to turn her over to the evil White Witch, but then he helps her to escape by bringing her back to the lamppost.
- 3. Mr. Tumnus weeps inconsolably because he feels very guilty. He confesses to Lucy that he had meant to turn her over to the White Witch. He then says he can't do it, but that she would certainly find out anyway and turn him into a stone statue.

Beyond: Mr. Tumnus tells Lucy that he is a traitor and very bad, and that he actually intended to turn her over to the White Witch. He tells her that he can't follow through with this and that he will help her escape, though he will face certain punishment himself. This makes me feel really scared of the White Witch, and it makes me realize that Mr. Tumnus isn't actually a bad guy.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR google forms COMPREHENSION & VOCABULARY CHECKS

- 1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). In order to share the resources out with your students, your students will either need their own Google accounts with accompanying e—mail addresses OR you will need to have Google Classroom. Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the resources to transfer into.
- 2. Then, click on each of the yellow link buttons below. Notice there are multiple buttons, one for each chapter or chunk of reading. When you click each button, a window will pop up that says, "Would you like to make a copy of ——?" Click "Make a copy." Do this once for each button.





 At this point, you should have a copy of each chapter or chapter chunk saved into your Google™ Drive.
