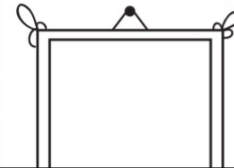

Character Analysis: Hermione is very smart and cares about her education. I know this because she tells Harry in her letter that her History of Magic essay is two rolls of parchment more than was asked for. She is also generous, because she sends Harry a really awesome gift. (Answers will vary.)

(page 2)

Comprehension and Analysis:

- The text says that Harry is unusual because he is a wizard, he hates summer break, and he has to do his homework in secret late at night.
- Harry never enjoys his summer holidays because he has to stay with the Dursleys. The Dursleys hate him and spend their time trying to make him as miserable as possible. They also try to conceal the fact that he is a wizard. They lock away all of his school books and his broomstick and forbid him to speak to the neighbors. On page 2, the text reads, "The Dursley family of number four, Privet Drive, was the reason that Harry never enjoyed his summer holidays."
- Hogwarts is an entirely wizarding village. He is worried about the permission form for it because he has to get a parental or guardian signature, and he knows that the Dursleys won't sign it.

Beyond Possible answers: Hermione gave Harry a broomstick servicing kit. Hagrid gave him a biting book. Ron gave him a Sneakoscope. (Answers will vary.)
