- Quickwrite-A great idea is to have the students free-write here BEFORE reading the chapters. This gets their minds warmed up and thinking in the direction that the chapters will take them. This also helps them to connect the concepts in the story to themselves.
- Vocabulary-The students practice with four new words that are chosen for you from every set of chapters. Synonyms, antonyms, and context clues are among the skills included.
- True/False, Multiple Choice, or Sequencing-One set of these types of questions is included for each section.
- Standards Focus-One question or activity is included. These focus on Reading Literature standards like character analysis or figurative language.
- Comprehension and Analysis-Three written response questions are provided per section. You will find that these questions are at all levels of Bloom's Taxonomy, so are optimal for differentiation if needed. Use them all or choose just some for your students to complete.
- Beyond-The Beyond activities are a mix of fun activities, including art, graphic organizers, and text-to-self connections. They require the students to use their imaginations, research skills, and some upper-level thinking. You might even choose to use these as an option for early finishers.
