

19. Bradley gets really confused when he first speaks to Carla, because she treats him fairly and kindly, and she actually listens to him. He is very used to people shutting him down quickly and not giving him a chance. Also, Bradley gets really upset and embarrassed when he gets a black eye from Melinda, and he lies about Jeff giving it to him instead. (Answers will vary.)
20. Carla is a young, new school counselor who always looks for the best in people. She helps Bradley by listening to him and encouraging him. She helps Colleen by listening to her struggles over her birthday party but then tells Colleen she needs permission to really talk to her. She helps Jeff adjust to his new school since he just moved there.

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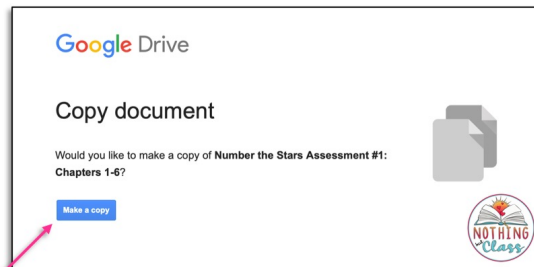
