

#### Comprehension and Analysis:

- Opal has compassion for Winn-Dixie and doesn't want him to get into trouble or get taken to the pound, so she instinctively protects him.
- 2. Opal calls her dad "the preacher" because he spends so much time preaching, praying, and working at the church and not as much time just simply being her daddy. So she calls him the preacher because he seems more like just a preacher than her dad. I think this shows that there is some distance in their relationship, and that maybe Opal is missing some closeness that she longs for.
- Opal asks the preacher to tell her ten things about her mama. I think she asks this question because she has been wondering about her mama and missing her more than she did when she was younger.

Beyond: Possible answers: They're both lonely. They both don't have much family. Opal has the preacher but she doesn't have a mama and neither does Winn-Dixie. Neither of them have friends.



## INSTRUCTIONS FOR google forms COMPREHENSION & VOCABULARY CHECKS

- 1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). In order to share the resources out with your students, your students will either need their own Google accounts with accompanying e-mail addresses OR you will need to have Google Classroom. Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the resources to transfer into.
- 2. Then, click on each of the yellow link buttons below. Notice there are multiple buttons, one for each chapter or chunk of reading. When you click each button, a window will pop up that says, "Would you like to make a copy of ——?" Click "Make a copy." Do this once for each button.
