





INSTRUCTIONS FOR google forms COMPREHENSION & VOCABULARY CHECKS

- 1. To get started, you will need to have access to the Internet and a Google account (which is free). In order to share the resources out with your students, your students will either need their own Google accounts with accompanying e-mail addresses OR you will need to have Google Classroom. Before moving on, be sure you are signed into the Google account that you want the resources to transfer into.
- 2. Then, click on each of the yellow link buttons below. Notice there are multiple buttons, one for each chapter or chunk of reading. When you click each button, a window will pop up that says, "Would you like to make a copy of --?" Click "Make a copy." Do this once for each button.





 At this point, you should have a copy of each chapter or chapter chunk saved into your Google™ Drive.
