The mini Kabuki Makeup Brush line was developed to apply product in hard to reach areas and or delicate areas of the face, such as around the eyes. The brushes mimic finger application, so you can stop touching your face in your routine. The minis are not intended for full face coverage.

The mini Tapered Kabuki Makeup Brush is best used for applying eye shadow pigments and glitter. Use the brush to pick up the loose pigment and tap into the corner of the eye to highlight. The taper is also great for concealing in hard to reach corners of the face.

How to Use for Concealer

- Always wash your hands before makeup application.
- Use the brush to pick up whichever product you will be using. If you are utilizing a loose powder, be sure to tap the brush against the edge of the container before application to remove any excess product.
- Simply tap on the concealer using a stippling motion, which will evenly blend and cover any problem spots. You can follow up with powder to set the concealer, using the same tapping technique.

How to Use for Contouring

- Tap on highlighter to cheek bones, and blend using small circular motions. Also works well for contouring the nose, and for concealing dark under eye circles.

Pro Tips:

- Use in corners of eyes for highlighting
- Use to correct makeup imperfections, such as touching up under eyes after mascara application

How to Clean

There are many different methods to clean makeup brushes, such as soaps, shampoos, or cleansers. One favorite method and secret used in the beauty industry is to clean brushes with olive oil in addition to any soap that kills bacteria (hand soap). It may seem counterintuitive to apply oil to a product that is coming into contact with your skin, however oil removes oil.

For daily cleaning, consider using a daily brush cleaner, or makeup remover wipes.

1. We recommend deep cleaning your makeup brushes weekly using the following best method:
2. Holding the brush by the handle with the bristles facing down, run water over bristles.
3. Gently squeeze out any excess water and makeup residue.
4. Apply a dime size amount of mild soap and olive oil into the palm of your hand.
5. Gently massage the bristles into your palm in a circular motion while running under water until the water runs clear, being careful NOT to submerge the brush.
6. Squeeze out any access water using a clean towel.
7. Allow the makeup brush to air dry in an open space overnight, ideally hanging with bristles facing down to prevent water from settling into the ferrule.

IMPORTANT: Do not submerge the makeup brush/bristles in water; avoid getting moisture in the ferrule (metal part) as it can settle and cause loose bristles and or handle.

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
