Instructions for: **Dextrine**

FOR MAKING PAPER FORMS

Mix powdered Dextrine with equal parts of dry manikin form paste. Add water and stir until you get the right creamy paste. Tear your form paper in to strips and saturate them with the paste. Press them strip by strip in your mold. Allow several days to dry your completed form.

FOR MAKING A GOOD GENERAL USE GLUE

Take a small amount of Dextrine and add hot water, enough to dissolve all of the Dextrine. Be sure to use hot water because Dextrine is hard to keep from lumping if cold water is used. After solution has cooled you can, if you wish, add cold water to reach the desired consistency. Do not make it too thin. Try it for many gluing jobs. Dextrine is the basis for many glues and pastes. This is the same kind of glue used on postage stamps, labels, etc.

FOR USE WITH PLASTER OF PARIS

When casting or using plaster of Paris, mix about two ounces to each pound of plaster. This gives the plaster added strength.
